FROM THE PASTOR: "PRAYER"

Pastor Tim Keller in his book titled Prayer says:

Prayer is one of the most common phenomena of human life. Even deliberately nonreligious people pray at times. Studies have shown that in secularized countries, prayer continues to be practiced not only by those who have no religious preference but even by many of those who do not believe in God. One 2004 study found that nearly 30 percent of atheists admitted they prayed "sometimes," and another found that 17 percent of nonbelievers in God pray regularly. The frequency of prayer increases with age, even among those who do not return to church or identify with any institutional faith. Italian scholar Giuseppe Giordan summarized: "In virtually all studies of the sociology of religious behavior it is clearly apparent that a very high percentage of people declare they pray every day—and many say even many times a day.

So where are you with your prayer life? I know some of us pray daily and some of us pray hardly at all. Some of you have told me stories of how your prayers have been answered. And yet there are those who have been praying for a certain outcome for years with no success.

A movie released in September titled "War Room" has drawn people to talk about the power of prayer. In the last week five people have told me I need to go see it. So I promise that before I start the prayer series I will see the movie. I know most Christians feel they could improve their prayer life. I

have rarely had someone tell me that they are satisfied with how they pray or how often they pray.

Jesus taught about prayer. He encouraged us to persevere in prayer. Prayer is an important component of our Christian identity. So in October we will have a two week sermon series on the "Place for Prayer." We will look at some helpful strategies to strengthen our prayer life. And then we will take a realistic look at how we may struggle with unanswered prayer.

I will see you Sunday.

FOOD BANK UPDATE

The Food Bank is trying a few changes to better serve our clients. We have reorganized the contents of our food bags to better address the situations that families with financial problems face on a daily basis. We have increased the contents of our bags and



larger family needs. August has been our busiest month of the year so far, and any donations you can assist us with are greatly appreciated.

Our attempt to initiate evening hours has not resulted in any significant increase in clients so far. We are attempting to contact more clients to advise them of the change in our hours. This will help us determine if the evening hours are beneficial. We might reduce the evening hours to once a month, so we can still serve, but not place an undue burden on our volunteers.





COLD & FLU SEASON IS UPON US!

The FLU and COLD season is coming on fast and there are a variety of natural ways to protect yourself. Aside from the ever important frequent "washing" of your hands, taking Vitamin C (doses ranging from 1000-2000mg), Vitamin D3, getting enough rest and exercise, another way that is becoming more popular and



medically proven to boost your Immune system is the taking of PROBIOTICS.

Probiotics are live "friendly" bacteria found in your mouth, nose, in your joints, under your arm pits and between your toes as well as your gut. The "friendly" bacteria live in a person's intestinal tract is what I am focusing on. The two most common are Lactobacillusor & Bifidobacterium. From this group there are different species such as Lactobacillus acidophilus and Bifidobacterium bifidus, and within each species there are different strains or varieties. The Probiotics help move the food through your gut and they treat other common conditions such as Irritable Bowel Syndrome, Inflammatory Bowel Disease, Infectious diarrhea caused by viruses, bad bacteria and parasites and Antibiotic diarrhea. They may also help with skin conditions like eczema, urinary and vaginal health and PREVENT COLDS & FLU and allergies.

You can incorporate these in your body by consuming fermented foods such as yogurt, kombucha, sauerkraut, miso, tempeh, kefir, soft cheeses and sourdough. There are food products that have incorporated or been fortified with added probiotics. It is also possible to purchase as dietary supplements which come in a wide range of strengths and combinations. Check out The Good Apple, Sprouts or try online Vitacost.com for great pricing. Brands to look for are Culturelle or Enzymatic Therapy Pearls (regular or IC) as an example. Always start small- more is not always better. Probiotic amounts are measured in CFU billions per capsule or pearls, so I suggest starting at one billion per day to see how you will respond to them. Generally speaking, they are safe to use. Mild side effects especially in the first couple of days are commonupset stomach, diarrhea, gas and bloating this will disappear after a few days. There is, like with drugs, a potential for allergic reaction. Stop immediately and talk with your doctor if that occurs.

Remember that if you do feel the signs of cold or flu coming on, please stay away from other folks who may have other health issues that can be severely compromised by getting a cold or flu viruses. This is one time sharing is not recommended. J

P.S. I LOVE YOU

P.S. I love you. I've often felt like maybe that is what God is saying to me when I mess up, do stupid things, act in an unkind way, or fail to act in the manner that I should. When I step out of bounds of my Christian path, in spite of Him and what He has taught, there is always love and grace for me...like that little postscript at the end of a letter...no matter what, I love you.

When I think about that kind of grace and love, I strive to treat others in that manner. I, of course, like to hope that I can be like Jesus, always treating others with such grace and kindness and equality. But, as with all of us, my days are marked with lessons in humility. I might catch myself in a judgmental moment, avoiding contact with a particular individual, or not taking any action at all in a situation — and often that can be because of biases or perceptions I have.

Country singer Randy Travis sang a song years ago titled Three Wooden Crosses. Whether or not you like country music, this song is simply a story, and a very powerful one. (Give it a whirl, pull it up on www.youtube.com and listen.) Here's a quick sampling of the lyrics:


A farmer and a teacher,
a hooker and a preacher,
Ridin' on a midnight bus bound for Mexico.
One's headed for vacation,
one for higher education,
An' two of them were searchin'
for lost souls.

That driver never ever saw the stop sign.
An' eighteen wheelers can't stop on a dime.
There are three wooden crosses on the right side of
the highway,
Why there's not four of them,
Heaven only knows.

Listening to the tune gives you the full power of its message. But just reading this excerpt should leave you thinking.

Do you form an opinion in your mind about which of those 4 individuals on that bus made it? Do some of your life experiences have you jumping

to conclusions about the worth of one, over another? Have you ever possibly looked at yourself as the unworthy one? The one



God might not say "I love you" to? Have you ever thought of reaching out to someone, but talked yourself out of it? Or, have you needed to be heard but not known where to go?

Think about God's postscript to everything you do in your life. Remember the example Jesus set for our lives.

Powerful words I read once were — "A decision not to act is a decision," and "How we treat others in their moments of crisis tells us much about ourselves." I think sometimes how we treat ourselves in our own moments of crisis is also very telling.

Take action today. Reach out to someone new, someone who might need a hand or encouragement, someone you might have looked past at some other time in your life.

Or, if you are in a place where you could use a confidential, listening ear to show you some grace as well, to say P.S. I love you, to you; consider asking to speak with a Stephen Minister.






