FROM THE PASTOR: "FELLOWSHIP HALL"

The picture at right shows the new Fellowship Hall as imagined by our architect Ray Eynon. The Building Committee has been working to design a building that would fulfill many purposes. It would be



a fellowship

hall, a worship space for the Praise Service and the Country -Western service, an athletic facility for volleyball and basketball, and a place for meals and fellowship.

This new building would be built just south of the current Education Building and the Memorial Garden. In redesigning our parking lots, the architect is able to make sure that we only lose seven parking spaces by increasing our north parking lot capacity.

The new Fellowship Hall would be able to seat 600 people for worship and about 300 people for a meal. When the Fellowship Hall has been built, it will enable classes to use the Koinonia Room on Sunday mornings. This would improve our facility space for children and youth.

Many people are generously contributing to pay off our current building debt, while we have also had other people donate to build our new Fellowship Hall which is estimated to cost about \$2.4 million. Currently we have received over \$500,000 towards the new building. It is great to see progress being made on paying off our loan, and also progress being made in creating new facilities to expand the effectiveness of our ministry. I will see you on Sunday.

SERVICE OF REMEMBRANCE




On Wed., 12/4 at 7:00pm, a service will be held in the Sanctuary to remember loved ones who have passed away during the past year. Please call the

NO PLACE TOO REMOTE FOR FELLOWMAN INTERNATIONAL



Very few of us could imagine living in areas so remote there is little to no access to healthcare. Yet, this is

the reality for many people who live in the FMI service area. Our traveling, preventative medicine and dentistry program strives to provide services to people living in villages in even the most hidden away corners of north central Honduras. Recently, FMI teamed up with the Honduran Ministry of Health to provide not only health and dental screenings, but to also ensure all people who needed to be vaccinated for a variety of preventable diseases were brought up-to-date on their vaccines. Dr. Samira Villela, Dr. Fredy Peña, nurse Yasmine Ramirez and agronomist Cruz Cardona traveled to several villages recently to care for patients, provide education, conduct preventative health screenings, apply fluoride and assess oral health as well as vaccinate both adults and children.

Our donations help make care accessible for those who can't travel to the main FMI clinic. We are so very happy to share the love of Jesus Christ through works, revealing God's care and concern especially for the "least of these" no matter where they live.

years. Do you remember your Mom or Dad frequently quoting you an adage a saying that summarized a principle of maxims including this one: "Many hands make light work." Or a Sunday

School chorus I learned early on was, "If we all work together how happy we'll be." The essence of both of these observations is the same: when everyone pitches in the work gets done and no one is overworked.

This principle is also taught in the Bible. Paul says to the Ephesians (4:11-13) that God gave Christian leaders the job to equip God's people to serve one another so that the Body of Christ is strengthened. In short, if we all are employed in 3. completing God's mission in the world, then everyone has significance and support.

But, we have, in large part, professionalized the ministry so that clergy are the primary workers in the church. For example, let's say you are ill and hospitalized and the pastor or someone "on staff" does not visit you, but instead another person from the congregation makes a call? How will you feel? What would you think? Many people, understandably, would perhaps say, "Well I guess I am not important enough for one of the ministers to come to see me." Now, don't misunderstand me, I am not proposing that our pastoral staff

will withdraw from pastoral care. Instead, when we shift our mindsets about how we receive ministry we open the door to Think back to your childhood and teen blessing, as many hands join together for the good work God has called us to.

After all, no one can truly empathize with you like someone who has walked in your steps. For example, I have sympathy behavior? My Mom had numerous such for those who have lost a spouse, but I do not truly understand that grief like another widow or widower. I care. I pray. I listen. But, I can't enter into the grief process like someone who has walked it.

> So, where is your place of service? How might you discover it? Let me pose a few questions:

- What turns your crank? What really matters to you? What is your passion?
- What makes your angry?
- What makes you sad?
- What makes you say, "That needs to change"?

How you answer such questions can point you in a direction to find your place to serve in the Body of Christ so that our Lord is glorified and all of us are lifted and loved. As we learn to give and receive ministry we will build a community of care that employs many hands to lighten the load and make a difference. In this way, we are "following Jesus and serving others." If you want to know more, talk with one of us about understanding your spiritual gifts better and let us help you join with others in the good works to which we are called.

THANKFUL... THANKFUL... THANKFUL

I read the below recently, when someone I love posted it on social media:

8 Signs You're Burned Out

You're not taking care of your basic needs, You're snoozing your alarm too much, Your To-Do list is overwhelming, Your life doesn't motivate you, You're not having a break, You're getting overly irritated by other people, You're living on auto pilot, Your thoughts are negative.

I thought "awwww, I hate they are feeling that way". Then I reread it, and I paused, and I thought "um, wait, whoops...that's kinda me right now!" Thank goodness not all of them (yet), but more pegged me that day than I wished to admit. Reading this forced me to think more about why this cycle of thinking can seem to come and go in our lives.

HIKING IN THE SPIRIT



This ministry not only lifts you physically, but spiritually, too! The official start of our fall hiking season was October 22nd, and November's schedule is included in this article.

We generally meet at the GCUMC south parking lot at 8:00am (unless otherwise noted). In midwinter when it's cold, we meet an hour later, and in the early fall and late spring when we're experiencing warmer weather, we'll meet an hour earlier to commute to the trailhead. Depending where you live, you can meet up at the trailhead.

We hike on established trails that vary in difficulty. Some are flat (easy) and some are of medium ability. Some are interpretative and teach about the desert plants and animals that live here, as well as how to generally survive in the desert.

Hikes are typically between 3—5 miles, and can be as short as 2 hours. Due to travel time, the entire trip averages 5+ hours, which is why we ask hikers to not plan appointments for the latter part of the day.


