In watching the Arizona Health Services statistics regarding COVID-19 in Maricopa County, I have noticed that virus hospitalization rates are going down. This is great news, but we do feel it is premature to open at this time.

When we reopen we want to do so wisely. There are many factors we need to take into consideration. We know that our congregation is full of high-risk people so we want to put into place a strategy to protect people from COVID-19. Here are some of the ideas we are thinking about:

MUSIC NOTES

Dr. Ian Classe, Director of Music Ministries



As summer arrives, I know many of you have returned home to the cool north, but some of you have stayed here due to unforeseen circumstances so...Welcome to the Arizona summer! Thank God for Willis Carrier and air conditioning! I'm happy to report that we're still seeing good attendance for our online worship and the music ministries are still meeting over Zoom weekly, even those members out of state. Last month, I opened up my newsletter article for questions about church music. I'll admit I didn't get as many as I expected but I've answered those I received in the last month below.

The first question I received is in regard to organ music. **"On a composition written for organ, are the manuals, stops, and registrations specified along the score?"**

The practice of registration varies widely by country, composer, and musical era. In the Baroque period, (17th-early-18th centuries) it is rare to have written registrations, though there are some. French music of the period is often registered by the title of a piece. If a piece is titled 'Plein Jeu', an educated organist will know to use a registration known as the 'Plein jeu.' In the Romantic Era (19th century) and later, a composer will often specify a more exact registration, specifically what stops, manuals, and accessories are to be used. Again however, the degree to which different composers do this varies widely. Some composers will go as far to say "Pull the 4' chimney flute of the positive division on beat 1 in measure 37 but only on the second repeat" while others will simply say 'Foundations' at the beginning of a movement which only indicates a certain family of stops. Some composers leave the decision entirely up to the organist which involves a lot of interpretation based on education.

Another question I received was, **"Is there any way to tune a pipe organ like a piano or any other musical instrument, except by making precise length pipes corresponding to each musical pitch?"**

Yes, a pipe organ can be tuned like any other instrument. After the pipes are constructed and originally voiced, their pitch can be modified slightly to maintain pitch in changing conditions. There are several different types of pipes and therefore different types of tuning. Some pipes such as a Bourdon are wood pipes with stoppers or sliders which can be heightened or lowered therefore changing the pitch. Other pipes have cutout scrolls at the back of the pipes which can be rolled up or down changing the length of the pipes, others yet have metal collars or caps

on the outside which can be raised or lowered. Reed pipes can have their reeds' position changed with a small tuning rod on the exterior of the pipe. The oldest type of tuning is called cone tuning and while it is somewhat uncommon now except in small pipes or older organs, some organs still require it. You basically change the pitch by deforming the top of each pipe by using a heavy hollow cone. This type of tuning is very stable but it causes gradual damage to the pipe over a long period of time.

The final question is in regards to singing. **"I read an article on the internet last week that said that singing is particularly hazardous when it comes to spreading COVID -19. How will this affect the choir, bands, and congregation moving forward?"**

Our church staff has been discussing the eventual return to in-person services for some time now and what that might mean for various ministries including music. It is true that singing is more hazardous for spreading the virus (or really any pathogen) because of the intensive inhaling and exhaling that is required, more so than regular speaking. Singing has a tendency to create a larger 'cloud' (of respiratory droplets and aerosols) than speaking and increases the 'safe distance' considerably. While face-masks will greatly help prevent the spread of the respiratory droplets that carry the virus, they muffle and distort sound and make it more difficult to breathe properly while singing. Because of this, it is difficult to predict when the choir, bands, and indeed even congregational singing will resume, even if we were to resume in-person worship. Obviously, upon creation and distribution of a vaccine or other effective treatment, we would likely be able to resume corporate singing but prior to that, moving forward could mean that singing is still limited to soloists, small groups, and/or recorded music. We're still discussing the possibilities moving forward and working to come up with a plan but rest assured we will all be back together and singing sometime in the future so stay tuned.

Just a reminder, I'll be continuing to answer questions in the newsletter for the coming months unless I run out of them so if you have any, feel free to email or call. Other questions and comments are also welcome. Stay safe and healthy!

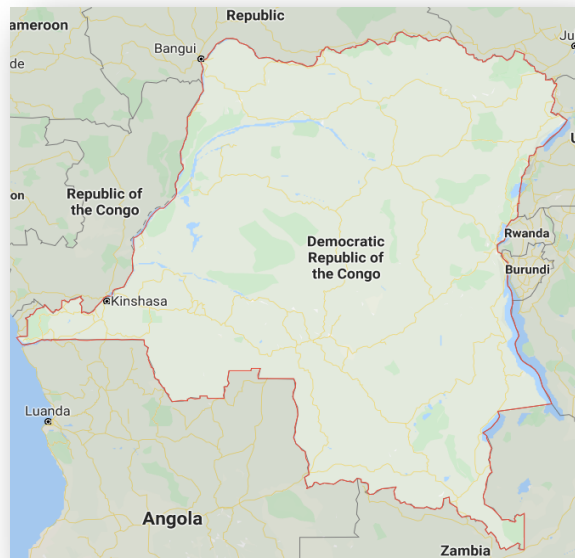

UNCEASING LOVE AND TRUTH

During these past few months I've had extra time on my hands to read, watch and listen all around me. Whether it's on social media, the newspaper, in a book, a TV show, or opinions expressed by those around us, I have found that there's a lot of garbage out there. You may have found the same. But, in the midst of the garbage there are also nuggets.

I recently read the below. Amidst a period of change and/or loss for so many, I found it to be refreshing:

Me: Why?

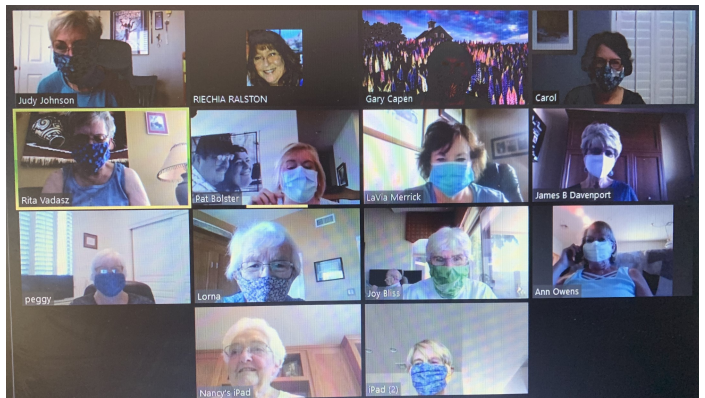

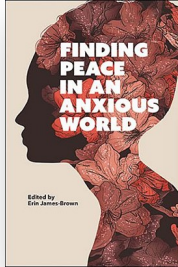

WATER FOR THE RESERVATION

Imagine. For just a moment, walk with me, through more than 27,000* square miles in Arizona, New Mexico and Utah. 27,000 square miles of many homes without running water or other infrastructure that many of us simply live with daily as part of our "normal". A place where the temperatures vary from 15F to 83F. Imagine heating through only the use of propane or firewood in so many homes. A place where seasonal torrential rains render many unpaved roads impassible and flash floods are common. Imagine meeting your economic needs with a median household income of \$20,005.00.

Imagine a people with a spirit of survival and triumph. A people who value not only their elders, but as a matriarchal society have a strong sense of family allegiance and obligation. A people who place value on tradition and realize the stress brought about by reservation to urban migration. A people who's courage is exhibited in the Navajo Code Talkers from World War II. Navajo artists whose works are in many of our homes – from their woven rugs and blankets to jewelry of silver and turquoise. As the largest tribe their population as of the 2016 count equaled 356,890 tribe members – and roughly 170,000 Navajos still speak Navajo. Such heritage!

A rich history. A painful history such as in 1864, when thousands of Navajos were forced to surrender to American soldiers, enduring "The Long Walk" to Ft. Sumner New Mexico where they lived and died in horrible conditions from beginning to end. A history that includes the creation of the Four Corners Ministry, "Where the Holy Spirit Touches Navajo Hearts."** A history of trials and great achievement.

While this background is interesting, perhaps this very day is of more immediate interest. Why should the people of the Desert Southwest Conference concern themselves with the Navajo Nation? Among the many reasons: we are a people of faith who care for the vulnerable; many of our churches send work teams to sites on the reservation for hands-on mission trips; and we engage in ministry on the reservation, from Bible studies near Page to the United Methodist Church presence in concert with the Four Corners Ministry.

But there is one painful event that is drawing our attention to mission. COVID-19. The virus is

devastating the Navajo. The greatest deterrent, simply washing our hands frequently, for many is impossible. It is hard to wash hands without running water. Hospitals are few and not easily traveled to. We cannot do much about the hospital access. We can help with water. As of April 29, 2020, 1,977 positive cases have been identified for COVID-19, with 62 deaths. These numbers rise daily. With population dispersal throughout the region and the lack of accessibility to health care and water, as with many parts of the country these statistics represent only what is known for certain and may not reflect accurately how the virus has impacted the people. Additionally, as Rev. Tweedy Sombrero, former chair of the Conference Committee on Native American Ministries shared, "Part of the reason COVID is spreading so fast, culturally families live in clusters and a handshake is very important. To greet one another with a handshake is very important and then all of a sudden one cannot do this or see each other is devastating to tribal members."

This year's Annual Conference Mission Project is to receive donations that will be put toward providing water where it is needed on the reservation. While we understand that many of us have experienced furloughs or job lay-offs, we also understand the mission heart of the Desert Southwest Conference. 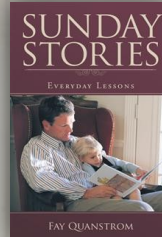

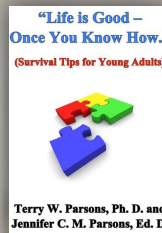

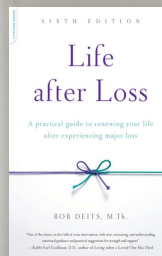
