ETHNIC VOICES STUDY WRAP-UP



As a result of our *Listen to Ethnic Voices* conversations, we have decided to not let the momentum retreat. Until a new study is started, we will be publishing various excerpts

from leaders – both living and dead – who have stood up for racial equality.

Below is an excerpt from Martin Luther King Jr.'s Letter from Birmingham City Jail, written to white clergy in April 1963 who were critical of his protests. If you are able to find a copy of the complete letter, I think you will find it illuminating.

"You may well ask, "Why direct action? Why sit-ins, marches, etc.? Isn't negotiation a better path?" You are exactly right in your call for negotiation. Indeed, this is the purpose of direct action. Nonviolent direct action seeks to create such a crisis and establish such creative tension that a community that has constantly refused to negotiate is forced to confront the issue.

The Negro has many pent-up resentments and latent frustrations. He has to get them out. So let him march sometime; let him have his prayer pilgrimages to the city hall; understand why he must have sit-ins and freedom rides. If his repressed emotions do not come out in these nonviolent ways, they will come out in ominous expressions of violence. This is not a threat; it is a fact of history. So I have not said to my people, "Get rid of your discontent." But I have tried to say that this normal and healthy discontent can be channeled through the creative outlet of nonviolent direct action.

In spite of my shattered dreams of the past, I came to Birmingham with the hope that the white religious leadership in the community would see the justice of our cause and, with deep moral concern, serve as the channel through which our just grievances could get to the power structure. I had hoped that each of you would understand. But again I have been disappointed. I have heard numerous religious leaders of the South call upon their worshippers to comply with a desegregation decision because it is the law, but I have longed to hear white ministers say follow this decree because integration is morally right and the Negro is your brother. In the midst of blatant injustices inflicted upon the Negro,

I have watched white churches stand on the sideline and merely mouth pious irrelevancies and sanctimonious trivialities. In the midst of a mighty struggle to rid our nation of racial and economic injustice, I have heard so many ministers say, "Those are social issues with which the Gospel has no real concern," and I have watched so many churches commit themselves to a completely other-worldly religion which made a strange distinction between body and soul, the sacred and the secular."

DISCIPLE is a program of disciplined Bible study aimed at developing strong Christian leaders. The study gives the Old and New Testaments equal time, emphasizing the wholeness of the

Bible as a revelation of God. DISCIPLE draws upon the work of scholars, the personal Bible reading and study of the participant, and dynamic group discussion to aid understanding of the Bible. As far a time commitment, one usually spends 30-45 minutes daily in preparation for weekly group meetings; and the meetings

themselves run an average of 2 - 2 ½ hours.


HARVEST FESTIVAL DRIVE-THRU EVENT

Lorna Marifjeren is also one of our Pen Pals:

"I first heard of Mathew 25 from a friend at Red Mountain Methodist Church. She had a Mathew 25 pen pal with the Methodist women from that church. I was very impressed and when our women decided to join that program, I immediately signed to be a pen pal. The program has been described as an "Envelope of Hope" as many of these ladies never receive mail from anyone. Just to hear her name at Mail Call can be a day brightener.

My pen pal has been incarcerated for almost 3 years. During that time she has completed an Addiction course through the Rio Salado's Incarcerated Correspondence Education and has goals to obtain an AZ State Certificate to become a Peer/Recovery Support Specialist when she is released in 2021.

She is also teaching the Wellness Recovery Program to other inmates. Besides teaching this class and her own studies with Rio Salado, she felt it has helped her in her own recovery and to be able to give back to others.

She does have a loving and supportive family, but this winter has brought the additional stress of learning her mother has cancer. She is grateful her brother can work from home during this pandemic and is taking care of her mother

We correspond at least once per month. I send colorful cards on any special day or for no reason at all. I feel in some small way if I can be supportive of her, I have a purpose for my day and it helps me, too."

Pastor Katharine writes:

"My decision to accept an incarcerated pen pal last fall was a spiritual conviction to "visit those in prison," as Matthew 25 states, but in the form of letters. I have been delighted with the written dialogue I have had with my pen pal since the beginning. She is a mother and grandmother, so especially now with the pandemic, we both bemoan not being able to see our families. She is an artist and before the virus hit, was able to sell some of her work outside the prison - to earn some cash. My pen pal also works in the print shop at Perryville; and seems to have a giving heart to newbies entering the prison. Now that we can email, rather than rely on snail mail, we "converse" more often - she asks questions about my life on the "outside" and I ask questions concerning her life behind bars. This pen pal arrangement has been enriching for both of us, I think, and has certainly made me more compassionate for those incarcerated. "




