FROM THE PASTOR: "CHRISTMAS EVE WORSHIP, LUMINARIES, CAMEL & NATIVITY"



This year we plan on releasing our Christmas Eve video worship service on Dec. 24th. You will be able to worship using the video any time you wish. Even though our church budget is experiencing a shortfall due to COVID-19, we will still give away all our Christmas Eve offering. Since COVID-19 is still causing havoc on the lives and finances of people, our church has decided to make our COVID-19 Fund the recipient of the offering. The

Easter offering brought in \$43,000 for the fund. As of this date we have spent it all to help people who are struggling as a result of the virus.

We were able to help 29 families with an average of \$1,400 spent on each family. In addition, the Pastor's Fund helped another four families. We were able to stop some families from being evicted or were able to pay utility or medical bills that the family couldn't handle because of their loss of income. We even helped a wife whose husband died from the virus. She wrote:

"I am so thankful for the rent and utility help, Food Bank referral and the Fry's card for gas. Your help let me stay in my home while I try to get everything straightened out with social security and the banks. Sometimes I just have to scream. Then I pray. God bless your church."

This year you won't be able to drop your contribution in the offering plate on Christmas Eve, so please clearly mark it "COVID-19 Help Fund" in the check memo.

On Christmas Eve from 5:00pm-8:00pm we will also light 1,000 luminaries around the church grounds and have a small living nativity with animals. Come see the

candles and animals and the Holy family. Oh... and don't forget to see the camel! I will see you online on

AMERICAN INDIAN CHRISTMAS



Roy Cook, Opata-Oodham, Mazopiye Wishasha: Writer, Singer, Speaker — Many Native American people found that the story of the European Christmas and Christ's birth fulfilled aspects of tribal prophecies and found the message to

be consistent with the truth that was handed down by their ancestors. Over time other social customs, that were introduced to them by the European missionaries have become adapted to the native cultures and are an integral part of Tribal Christmas traditions today, just as they are in most non-Indian homes.

The First Native American Christmas Carol

According to Huron tradition, a Jesuit missionary priest, Fr Jean de Brebeuf, around 1640-41, wrote their first Christmas Carol. The Huron built a small chapel of celebration. There will be a separate fir trees and bark in honor of the manger at Bethlehem.

The animals at the manger were the Fox, the Buffalo and the Bear. The Huron also made a traditional tent of skins and their nativity figures were all dressed as Native Americans. This Huron Carol, originally written in the Huron language and later translated to French, has become a loved Canadian carol today.



GLOBAL MISSIONS

GLOBAL MISSIONS IN THE DAYS OF COVID-19

Through the GCUMC Budget as well as with designated gifts we support three Global Missions and four missionaries—Rice and Beans Ministries (Fred Curry, missionary to Costa Rica and Brazil), Fellowman International (Lisa Armstrong, founding missionary, directing mission in Honduras from Kansas), and Mobility Worldwide (Sandra and Delbert Groves, missionaries in Zambia). Their work continues!



The **Rice and Beans** staff on location in Costa Rica has used the limitations imposed by Covid-19 to develop creative ways of doing ministry. The team of local talent, recruited and directed by Missionary Fred Curry, includes specialists in construction, accounting, and social work, but their energy and abilities extend beyond their disciplines. When visiting mission work teams (like Gold Canyon!) have been unable to travel to Costa Rica, the local needs continue, so the Costa Rican team has planted large vegetable gardens. This has provided plants and produce to sell or to distribute freely to needy families and individuals. Thus, nudged by both restrictions and need, new outreach methods have developed.



Fellowman International continues to send medical teams into villages to serve those who are too ill to travel. Because of the virus, the Honduran government has granted funds and supplies to FMI for the work in remote, underserved areas, extending the staff's ability to share the love of Christ with people in great need.



Mobility Worldwide has moved to larger quarters in Columbia, Missouri, and continues to construct personal energy transportation devices (PETs), which are then shipped partially assembled in containers to countries where they have been requested. These sturdy carts are constructed using solid rubber tires and common materials, making them long-lasting and easy to repair. With a PET children and adults who are otherwise

unable to walk can regain their mobility and participate fully in the life of their community. They can attend church and school and even put their cart to use in earning a living.

Weekly Pastoral Prayer, a regular part of the Sunday Worship Service, raises the joys and concerns of the congregation and provides a pattern for individual, devotional prayer.

Prayer Requests can be made by using the website communication link or by calling the Church Office, Rev. Fay Quanstrom, Dr. David Worley or Pastor Katharine Keller. The Prayer List is updated weekly and printed in the worship bulletin, which you are encouraged to view, print, and use. People

are counting on our prayers! Requests first appear in the "This Week" section, then move to the "Other Concerns" section the second week, before rotating off the list. Resubmissions are welcome. Names continue to be listed under the "Hospice" section as long as the person remains in that care. Those listed on the "Cancer" list continue until removal is requested. The "Cancer" list is going to be updated to facilitate pastoral care outreach. To add the name of anyone who is not on the GCUMC roll to the cancer list, contact info must also be provided. If you currently have a

friend or family member on the cancer list, please send that person's contact information to Pastor Fay < fay.quanstrom@gmail.com >. The "Ongoing Needs" section will remain on page two of the list.

Prayer Wall is always available within the Prayer Garden and you are welcome to stop by any time. A container with paper and pencils awaits your use. Write your confidential prayer request; then fold the paper and insert it into any crevice in the half-wall behind the Jesus sculpture. Be reminded that God hears the cries of our hearts and responds them.

Prayer Walk is available anytime during daylight hours. You are welcome on campus even though the buildings are closed and we are meeting as we normally do. Simply mask and maintain social distance while enjoying the campus during these cooler days. Stop at the display box to the far right of the office door to pick up the Prayer Walk directions. Walk and pray around the campus using the prompts that are provided, concluding your walk at the Prayer Garden. You might enjoy extending your walk around the parking lot perimeter. Walk and pray! Don't we love the song titles we see and hear at this time of year - "Joy to the World," "Silent Night, Holy Night," "Mary's Boy Child," "Hark! The Herald Angels Sing," "It Came Upon the Midnight Clear"? But what do those really mean? To me the lyrics of those songs solidify another phrase we also see quite often - "Jesus is the Reason for the Season!" If ever there was a year to look forward to "the season", and to search a little more deeply for what "the reason" is, it's this This year I am challenging myself to live in the here and now, one! To do so let's look to scripture:

8 Now there were in the same country shepherds living out in the fields, keeping watch over their flock by night. 9 And behold, an angel of the Lord stood before them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were greatly afraid. 10 Then the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid, for behold, I bring you good tidings of great joy which will be to all people. 11 For there is born to you this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord. 12 And this will be the sign to you: You will find a Babe wrapped in swaddling cloths, lying in a manger." 13 And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host praising God and saying: 14 "Glory to God in the highest, And on earth peace, goodwill toward men!"

~ Luke 2:8-14 [NKJV]

The coming of the Christ Child brought Joy, Promise, Hope, Love, Saving Grace. Every year at Christmas time we celebrate these things, giving gifts to loved ones, representing those the wise men gave to our Savior:

⁹...and behold, the star which they had seen in the East went before them, till it came and stood over where the young Child was. 10 When they saw the star, they rejoiced with exceedingly great joy. 11 And when they had come into the house, they saw the young Child with Mary His mother, and fell down and worshiped Him. And when they had opened their treasures, they presented gifts to Him: gold, frankincense, and myrrh. ~ Matthew 2:9-11 [NKJV]

But, for many of us, this year's celebration may come with a bit of apprehension, in that we just don't quite know what to expect...our celebrations may look a little different...we may be anticipating some disappointment...we may not see people we normally see... we may be fearful of circumstances in our lives...we may be a little angry...or sad...we may be missing some normal Christmas traditions...

It may just be me who's had my head in the sand for the past several decades, but I have never seen the below acronym

until a few weeks ago - H.O.P.E. = Hold On Pain Ends. Hhhhmmmm, amazing don't you think? It makes perfect Oh joy of joys! It's December, Christmas month. The time to sense, what else would be a better acronym for the word celebrate the birth of our Savior. A month we look forward Hope? Maybe this year has been tougher than many...but what better year to focus on the true meaning of Christmas?! I also recently saw a quote by Theodore Roosevelt that intrigued me - "Comparison is the thief of joy." My simplistic analysis of it tells me it is saying that we will never find joy in today, or the here and now, if we are constantly comparing it to something that 'was' or something that 'might have been.' It's a reminder to hang on to the Hope and Joy provided to us by Jesus' birth.



Molly—Single mom of one, hours cut due to pandemic, who was having trouble paying summer electric bill and feeding a teenager:

"I just want you to know how thankful I am to everybody that makes it possible to help people when they are struggling like me. Thank you for paying my past due electric balance and for the Fry's cards for food and gas. I pray every night for the church in Gold Canyon, and the food bank and the work that you are doing. God bless everyone. I hope you all know how special you are to families like me."

Sheila—Mother of 1 teenage son who was furloughed for 3 months then returned to work at only 20 hours per week. She needed help with electric bill, rent and internet payment for online school:

"I can't believe that you don't even know me but were like family for me. I would like to thank you from the bottom of my heart for helping me and my son get through these hard times. If it weren't for your help my son and I would of been looking for a shelter. We are very grateful and so blessed that you reached out to help us. We cannot thank you enough. Thank you & God Bless."

Brandon—Single man who moved his mother in with him so he could look after her thenn lost his job at a restaurant due to pandemic. They needed a new water heater and help with rent after a series of unexpected medical bills for his mom:

"Thank you so much for helping me and my mom. I am feeling so relieved and my mom was so stressed. We can make it with my part-time job and mom's social security but I just couldn't get up the money for that water heater, rent and her prescriptions. And thank you for the booklet about resources. We'll be going to your food bank and the free produce place for sure. God bless your church."

Nunez family of 4—Evicted and had nowhere to go:

"Thank you so much for your help with the trailer and letting us put some of our things in your storage. I'm sorry we took so long. It was so emotional. Thank you for helping us with emergency housing for a few days so we could figure out what to do and for the Fry's cards for food and gas. No one will rent to you with an eviction and we only have part-time jobs. But we'll figure it out. We can't express our gratitude, how grateful we are for your kindness to us."

Gabriel family of 4—Truckdriver whose hours were cut due to pandemic and his wife had to quit her part-time job to stay home while children did online school:

"It's crazy how you can be doing great one minute then the next your whole life is turned upside down. We were okay for a few months using our savings but then everything got worse and we had no way to earn more income. Please thank your church for help with the rent, and electric bill and the Fry's cards for food. I hope they know what a blessing they are to our family."

Jennifer—Daughter of church members:

"To my parents' church, I am truly moved by your generosity to me. My mom always told me I need a church family, especially since I don't have any family living close to me. I want to thank the church for helping me. You have greatly touched my heart. Thank you so much for your generosity. God bless your church."

Scott—Veteran with PTSD who lost his job due to the pandemic. Needed help with rent, utilities and car registration so he could keep looking for work:

"I appreciate the help the church has extended to me as I try to get back on my feet. It took a lot of stress from me to have my living expenses caught up. And I went to the food bank today. It was an amazing amount of food. What a blessing. I took a part-time job as a truck driver and I am working with the Genesis resource center as you suggested to get some referrals from them for veterans. Please thank the folks at your church who donated to this fund to help people like me."

Reverend [___] —Pastor at a UMC in our District:

"We are so grateful for the help from your church at this time of great stress for my family and our small congregation. Please extend to your congregation our heartfelt appreciation for their generosity. They are truly examples of the love of Christ and the connection we have as brothers and sisters in Him. We will uplift them in our prayers."

Alicia-Mother of 2 who works in a school cafeteria:

"Me and my family are truly grateful to God for putting good amazing people like you in our path. Our electric bills were so high this summer, I couldn't keep up. Thank you for help with that, and for the food bank referral and for help with my car repair so I wouldn't miss work. I am so beyond grateful. God bless you all."

Francisco—Father of a family of 4 whose hours as a mechanic were greatly reduced due to pandemic:

"I have never received help from anyone my whole life. It was very hard to ask for help. My wife and I work very hard but you can't work when there is no work to get. Thank you to your church very much for help with the rent and electric bill and car registration. I'm really glad my friend told me about your church. If you ever need help with landscaping, I used to do that. My son and I would be glad to come work at the church to say thank you."
