
FALL FAMILY CHURCH CAMP



If you, or someone you love suffers from these symptoms consider attending the six-week Emotional Wellness course beginning on Thursday, November 4 from 10am—11:30am in the Emmaus Room. During this class, you will learn to use a non-pharmaceutical, therapeutic lifestyle change curriculum developed by Dr. Stephen llardi of the University of Kansas. A Biblical component is also included.

HISPANIC HERITAGE MONTH

Hispanic Heritage Month is celebrated from September 15th to October 15 each year. The celebration begins in the middle of the month because September 15th marks the anniversary of the independence of 5 countries: Costa Rica, Nicaragua, El Salvador, Honduras and Guatemala. It is followed by Mexico's Independence Day on September 16th and Chile's September 18th.

Did you know that Hispancis/Latinos make up 18.5% of the total population in the US, highlighting they are the largest ethnic group, two-thirds of which are US born. There are 284 United Methodist Hispanic/Latino congregations and faith communities in the US. The first Latino-Hispanic Bishop of the UMC was Bishop Elias Galvan who was elected in 1984 and served the Western Jurisdiction and retired in 2004.

MISSION NEWS FROM CENTRAL AMERICA



Hope in Honduras: Don Lucas Vasquez thought he would surely die as he lay in bed, struggling to breathe and too weak to take a drink of water. Along with these symptoms, visibly swollen lymph nodes suggested to Lucas and his family that he had cancer, as his body continued to waste away. Lucas' wife made her way to the FMI clinic and begged the staff to visit her husband and

administer IV fluids, imagining that this would strengthen him.

In the midst of the Covid-19 pandemic the medical staff made the trek to Lucas' humble mountain home and diagnosed tuberculosis. When the sputum sample sent to the government lab confirmed the diagnosis the state health department was willing to provide the needed medications and test the family to ensure that no one else was infected. However, the pandemic had closed the mountain roads to all traffic. The health department would not provide the medications directly to the family for fear it might not be taken correctly, thus harming the patient's chances for recovery. The only way to help Lucas was for an FMI nurse or physician to travel daily to his home to give him the life-saving meds. The clinic's staff committed to take that risk during the pandemic in the name of love for their fellow man. Every day they drove and then walked the steep mountain path to the home, frequently being stopped by police. Today Lucas is making a strong recovery, gaining weight and physical strength. He looks forward to being able to work again to provide for his family, and praises God for having saved him from an agonizing death.



Hope in Costa Rica: Without its usual succession of mission teams, the ministry of Rice and Beans was stymied, but creative minds saw opportunity. Considering the acreage that the ministry owns and that a significant percentage of it was idle, the staff went to work planting vegetables. In this "land of eternal spring" the gardens flourished, first yielding seedlings to share with people who were interested in planting their own gardens. Soon a variety of lettuces, green beans, peppers and tomatoes were ready to harvest and share with families in need of food for their families. Fresh produce is particularly valued but often unavailable in neighborhood markets. Abundant yields prompted the staff to freeze vegetables for later

distribution. Out of limitations God provided new ideas and opportunity for ministry in His name.

While much of the historical tensions that were present when Martin Luther nailed his 95 theses to the door of the church at Wittenberg on Oct. 31, 1517 have abated over time, we dare not forget that the central tenets that Luther proclaimed on that day remain vital. Particularly the doctrine of justification through faith alone, in Christ alone, born of grace alone as taught in the Scriptures alone, ultimately to the praise of God alone. So, this month we will be celebrating the Church that our Lord Jesus founded and of which He is the cornerstone. Our music and our messages will help us focus on the meaning and message of the Church. We invite you to join us as we worship in song, sacrament and sermons.

... AND ON A PASTORAL NOTE

One of the great hymns that emerged from the Reformation is Luther's anthem, A Mighty Fortress is our God. Although there is still some debate about the origin of the hymn, scholars have concluded that Luther himself wrote the hymn. Regardless, while the lyrics and melody reflect Luther's difficulties in a tumultuous time in church history, what truly matters is the hymn's enduring lyrics. I urge you to read them again, for the words remind us that desperate days may obscure the light of God's love and faithfulness. But God is truly our refuge and our strength. Regardless of opposing spiritual forces, dangers and freezing fear, we learn again that our God reigns, Christ Jesus is our place of confidence and the Holy Spirit still grants the Church prevailing power. Take heart, dear Christian, God is still on the throne and He will finish His plan for time and eternity.

DESTRUCTION... OR HOPE?



We stayed in a beautiful old mobile home park this summer in Arkansas. On site was this old The owner told us incinerator. that when the park opened back in the 1960's they were well outside city limits and burned all their trash. It has stood vacant and black for decades, just a piece of history without obvious an purpose. As the weeks

progressed, I noticed this beautiful green sprig popping up in the doorway, growing into a gorgeous, lone, stalk of corn. An industrious squirrel no doubt decided to help re-locate some seed from someone's garden or field nearby.

This picture of new growth, new life, reminded me of 1988. I was fighting fires on a 750,000-acre complex of wildfires in Montana. This was the year of the well-publicized Yellowstone National Park fires, and the battle toward containment and control had been ongoing in the West for weeks on end. Areas my crew walked through to get to the current fire line, often took us through areas that had been blackened and burned weeks before. The visual of new growth that we tramped through, green and lush and as much as 6-10" high in places, has always remained with me.



In the past 1.5 + years we have heard many seen and unprecedented events and occurrences around us. Things such as war, evil, sickness, storms and more can taint our view on that around us, making us see more darkness than light. picture of this toppled cross from the City of New Orleans following

Hurricane Ida, seen from one perspective, can be dark and sad. This church went through the storm, but do you believe they quit ministering and serving, or just gave up? I seriously doubt it. Perspective is a very important noun, how we regard situations in our lives can be life altering. Although while walking through the storm we often have a difficult time seeing the good that could possibly come from it - when time has passed we are more likely able to see the green emerging from what appeared to be total destruction, the new life after the loss of old, the lessons learned, the gifts received, a place of hope and growth from darkness. As Jesus taught us, keeping our eyes on Him rather than the storm itself is paramount. It balances our perspectives, calms our storms, gives us hope.

In the midst of the storm, though, this may seem like a bunch of "power of positive thinking" drivel. 



Calvin also wrote the soundtrack for the film "2016", one of the top 5 highest grossing documentaries of all time. In addition, he's currently living and performing overseas with various orchestras in Ukraine, Russia, and elsewhere, having recently finished his latest album, Paramount.
