"JUST DOIN' HIS JOB..."

Sgt 1st Class Matthew R. Kahler K.I.A.: 26 January 2008, Waigul, Afghanistan



Matthew R. Kahler was born on July 24, 1978, and at the age of ten years old, he declared he was going to enlist in the U.S. Army after his graduation from Yellow Medicine East High School in Granite Falls, MN. At the end of May 1997 he enlisted on the Delayed Entry program on his 18th birthday into the 82nd Airborne in Ft. Bragg, NC, and left for Boot Camp the day after his graduation. The summer of 1997, he attended Boot Camp, Advanced Infantry Training, and Airborne Jump School — all at Ft. Benning, GA. After his training he reported to Ft. Bragg, and deployed to Ryad Air Force Based in Saudi Arabia, in November of 1997. In February 2000, he reported to Army Ranger Training School at Ft. Benning, GA along with 500 other men, and in April 2000 he was 1 of 200 men to complete Ranger Training. Upon completing Ranger Training he was promoted to the rank of Sargent and became the youngest Sargent in the US Army. The fall of 2000, he reenlisted and transferred to the 173rd Airborne in Vicenza, Italy. He served at Camp Ederle until his death in 2008.

In 2003 he deployed as a Staff Sgt. with the 173rd, where they were deployed to the invasion of Iraq, In 2005 they deployed to Afghanistan, and in 2007 he was promoted to Sgt. 1st Class and became the Platoon Sgt. for 2nd Platoon/503, better known as "Chosen Company." Chosen Company deployed to Northern Afghanistan in May 2007 to the Kornegal Valley, which was known as the Valley of Death. Starting early on in their deployment, Chosen Company began to experience significant losses of men.

Here's another update on the organ committee: this past month, the committee met and intended to All Gold Canyon UMC Performing Arts Series concerts discuss winding and different types of pipes in more detail, however, the conversation veered off into a parallel but no less important subject. We began discussing the overall vision of the church and the relationship that an organ might have to this vision. The committee decided that in order to develop a recommendation for the church, they would need the senior pastor's support as well as an idea of his vision. In order to begin to contemplate this question and to have some hard numbers with which to discuss with Pastor Fred, the committee asked me to compile a quantitative report including an appraisal of our current instrument involving related costs, current condition, and an estimate of longevity, research on the longevity of digital instruments in general, as well as baseline estimates for potential repairs and replacement.

A Few Words From An Undisclosed Location

Working undercover sounds more like the role of spy than missionary, but some parts of the world restrict "missionary" activity to the extent that great creativity is required of those who would share the good news of Jesus. "Entrepreneur," "health worker," "nurse," or "physician's assistant," are among the skills that are welcomed in many otherwise closed locations. A medical team, for instance, might establish a clinic that serves a variety of general practice clients. An entrepreneur might establish a small business that not only employs nationals but also provides the teaching of English or computer skills. Meanwhile the entrepreneur and the health workers are able to speak quietly to issues of faith as they treat patients and serve clients. This can be dangerous, but the mission work is often tolerated by the host community, outweighed by the benevolent impact of professional activity — healing, teaching, physical therapy, compassionate visits to elderly, orphans and other neglected groups.

BAM is an acronym for "Business As Mission," the evangelism approach now favored by many sending agencies. In addition to mission education and language school, candidates for BAM are trained in developing small business opportunity and friendship communication. From relationships built with local leaders, impact for Christ can result. Business employment can lead to relationships that invite faith conversations that lead to Bible study, that draw individuals to Jesus. This "tentmaker" approach resembles the methods of Paul and Silas in New Testament times. Supporting themselves with marketable skills, the first missionaries built connections that led to teaching and preaching opportunities. And so today, in undisclosed locations around the world, the powerful, saving message of Jesus goes out as sent-ones use their professional and spiritual gifts. Let's remember to pray for missionaries whose names we cannot print! God knows each one!






ON THE COUNTRY SIDE

Music is one of God's many gifts. Think of how much music adds to our lives. But, the higher purpose of music as the Psalmist teaches is us to worship God. We are, then, especially grateful for the musical leadership of David Ballard along with One in the Spirit and the Wranglers. But their leadership is not a substitute for our voices. So, as we gather at 4:00 pm each week, I encourage you to sing heartily and worshipfully in praise of our good God.

... AND ON A PASTORAL NOTE

The other day I read a short article from The Gospel Coalition entitled, "Habits Not Resolutions" (see https://www.thegospelcoalition.org/article/spiritual-habits-few-minutes). This piece identifies a range of spiritual habits we can practice in a relatively short amount of time. For example, we can repeat the Lord's Prayer in about 30 seconds. So, while we are washing our hands, as we should be doing regularly, rather than letting our minds wander we can pray the Lord's Prayer. I find that praying this pattern prayer aloud is a great approach to helping me think about the words. Just as we habitually attend to a variety of things like brushing our teeth are we equally habitual in our daily walk with God? What spiritual habits have you established? What spiritual habits do you need to develop? The point is simple but clear, as we tend to everyday chores and the flow of life we can integrate spiritual habits naturally so that taking out the trash for example stimulates us to pray, sing, or mediate on Scripture. Such habits are good for our souls!

What does love look like to you? It can take so many forms that sometimes we miss it. If I told you that this small bag of sugary sweet marshmallows pictured was one of the greatest demonstrations of love, would you believe me?

You probably wouldn't without an explanation and a If there is stress in our lives, creating a gap between us little context - A teacher taught at a school for students in need, and each one received free breakfast and free or reduced cost lunch every day. Christmas, a little girl in her class gave her this bag for a gift. You see, this little girl so loved and appreciated her teacher that she desperately wanted to give her a gift. She had 'nothing', so she gave her what often equaled the best part of her breakfast and her day, something precious to her. She meticulously picked the marshmallows out of her cereal and 'wrapped' them for her teacher.

How do we demonstrate Christ's love to others? As the question is posed by Pastor Graham above, Will others see Christ's love in your life today? It surely could be seen in that little girl's selfless expression of love to her teacher. She had 'nothing', but she gave 'everything.'

We receive God's selfless love toward us each and every day, even when we don't give Him anything in return. When we love someone else, we desire their happiness, and that is what God desires for us. Sometimes though we struggle reaching out to others, expressing love to others, or even loving ourselves, because we have become focused inward on our problems and current issues.

In their book The Desire, authors Dan Walsh and Gary Smalley say "Stress is the gap between what we expect from God's creations and what we're actually receiving. Since only God can meet our deepest needs, the more

gaps we'll have and the more our frustration will increase...That's how loving God with all our hearts reduces stress. The more we look to Him as the only One who can make a difference, the less we look to things that can't truly help us. The stress goes away because the gaps get closed. God fills our hearts with more love and joy and peace while we wait for our circumstances to get better. With our stress and anger no longer controlling us, we get freed up to care about others instead of always thinking about ourselves."

The best time to love people is always right now. But is it a little difficult for you to look outward right now, to express love to others, to take it easy on yourself regarding some life circumstances, to think selflessly, to trust God, to feel like you have anything to give?

and God, is it possibly because we have placed more emphasis on unmet expectations from some of God's creations than the emphasis we have placed on turning to God to meet our deepest needs? I know I certainly go through periods where all the above is true.

Gold Canyon UMC dedicated our Christmas Eve offering to Lutheran Social Services Afghan Resettlement Program. As of this writing, they have already welcomed 150 Afghans to the Phoenix and Tucson area. These families include at least one family member who assisted our military during the Afghan War. They each arrived with one suitcase and one backpack. I cannot imagine exactly what their needs are, but I do know that Lutheran Social Services has a long history of helping refugees from several countries.



The morning of 26 January 2008, 2nd Platoon was on a mission. They had divided the platoon, and Matt and his squad went up into the mountains, while the other three squads of the platoon each went in different directions. Matt's squad was the only squad that had to go through a check point, that was manned by the Afghanistan National Army. As Matt and his men arrived at the check point, the men manning the check point did not respond to Matt's efforts to contact them.

Matt radioed headquarters to inform his commanding officer what was happening. They arrived at Plan B, and when that didn't work to obtain a response from the men manning the check point, Matt ordered his men to stay put and not to move unless he gave the order. He told his men, "This is a dangerous situation and I will go take care of." He moved forward yelling, "We are Americans don't fire." After giving his notice to the Afghanistan Nationals, 3 shots rang out. Matt was hit by one of them and killed instantly.

His men moved forward immediately to administer medical help to Matt. He was already dead when they got to him. They secured the check point. The Afghanistan Nationals fled the check point.

Initially Matt's squad placed him on a stretcher and began to carry him down the mountain. They needed to get him to a lower altitude so the medivac helicopter could fly to them and remove Matt's body. The squad walked a short distance before they determined they were not going to make it to a lower height carrying Matt on a stretcher. At that time, they lowered the stretcher and one of the sergeants, in the squad, lifted Matt's body into the fireman's carry and carried Matt the rest of the way down the mountain. After Matt was medevacked off the mountain, his squad went right back to complete their mission,

Matt was survived by his men, his wife, his 4 year old daughter, friends, and family. Matt was 29 when he was killed-in-action.

Please keep all of our current and past service men and women in your prayers. Without ALL who have served or who are serving, since our Revolutionary War, we would not be the WONDERFUL country we are today.

These estimates included a variety of options including merely replacing aging components (for as long as such components are still produced) on the current digital instrument, purchasing a new digital imitation instrument, installing a used pipe organ, and commissioning a new pipe organ. While the report is too long to summarize here, I'm happy to discuss it with anyone who is interested. After hearing and discussing said report, the committee discussed how to present this information to the senior pastor, trustees, and administrative council as well as developing a plan for making multi-option recommendation that allows for different variables such as a potential windfall donation(s), an excellent used instrument suddenly becoming available, and strong opposition to any proposed project. In the coming months, the committee plans to resume the education process about different types of organs and organ components so that we are able to add a qualitative analysis to the quantitative one. We're also planning to visit various instruments in the Phoenix valley to gain experience about different types of organs and the potential options for GCUMC.

Next month, as we continue to be in peak season, GCUMC will be hosting two more concerts including **The Sonoran Brass**, as well as an organ recital featuring my friend and colleague **Dr. Jacob Hofeling**. The arts council will have an additional concert as well, so stay tuned. As always, if you have questions, concerns, comments, feel free to contact me by phone, text, or email.
