



## FROM THE PASTOR: "DEBT FREE!"



On February 14th, our church paid off our mortgage. We are debt-free! We paid off the Sanctuary, the Mission Center, and the north parking lot. We have accomplished much in the last 16 years. We have built facilities to serve Christians in Gold Canyon for 100 years or more. We have invested in the future of our church.

Thanks for your generosity. I am sure you are filled with joy to hear this news. You have made sure that this church will have a bright future. We have built facilities so that the gospel of Christ will be proclaimed in Gold Canyon and beyond. People will come here and worship God and discover who Jesus is.

We now turn to build the Fellowship Hall. The Fellowship Hall will be constructed south of the Education building and the Memorial Garden. Our Praise and Country worship services will move into it when completed. We will be able to seat up to 600 people for special events.

The Fellowship Hall will include a commercial kitchen and seat about 350 people for meals. The new building can also be configured into two volleyball courts or one basketball court for our youth and children. One of our church members is a high school basketball coach and told me he is willing to put on clinics for neighborhood kids.

Upon completion of the Fellowship Hall, we will use our Koinonia room for educational purposes. As of February 14th, all Building Fund pledges and gifts will build the Fellowship Hall.

It is a joy to celebrate a giant step forward in the life of this congregation. I will see you on Sunday.

We celebrated the conclusion of the 13-week GriefShare group on February 17th... complete with a beautiful cake created by our own Lorelei Clise!

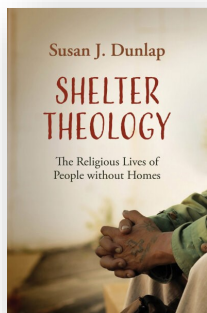


The group really bonded; and I believe, we all grew by sharing together.

## PEOPLE WITHOUT HOMES



Susan Dunlap, a white clergyperson, who teaches the art of pastoral care at Duke Divinity School, spent hours with shelter guests in Durham, NC, and also taped interviews with those willing to offer their life testimonies. She holds a half-hour prayer service for overnight guests at Urban Ministries of Durham, a shelter for people without homes. Here are a few of her reflections from her new book, "Shelter Theology: The Religious Lives of People without Homes."

"There are risks trying to represent people different from you, particularly if they're very vulnerable. You risk violating them. But it can also be an act of violence not to represent them. It's become accepted to call them "unhoused" or "people without homes." (not homeless) I prefer "people living without homes." It's a people-first language.

I had in mind creating a space that was not a place for my agenda, but theirs. They brought their religion with them, which is mostly Southern evangelical Black church. Rather than long spaces of silence, people gave testimony, they gave sermons, they encouraged each other, they praised God using common African American prayers like, 'I thank God for waking me up this morning!'

I am often surprised by their response of gratitude. When a man said, 'I want to pray for my girlfriend who was shot five times in the head,' I was mute. Then I started hearing people saying, 'Praise God' and 'Thank you, Jesus.' They were grateful she was still alive. Unlike, them, I don't have a well-developed religious repertoire for responding to violence, and they do. Their gratitude focuses you on what is present rather than with is lacking.

I think people who have lived without the privilege of Whiteness or wealth know more about complete dependence on God than privileged people do. They have something to teach us – their practices of gratitude, their understanding of great evil, their trust that God will provide. By dwelling in proximity to people on the margins, we absorb habits of responding to God and depending on God and recognizing that all of life is dependent on God.

Going to the margins, we do learn something about God that is not available anywhere else. I want to help people understand, that we have to dwell on the margins – not as rescuers or fixers or helpers, but as equals before God who come together to pray. I wanted to develop a respect for theological worlds that have emerged out of suffering and persist because they continue to mediate the love and mercy and power of God.

If you have volunteered with VBS in past years, you know the benefits of investing your time into this amazing summer program... it's a rewarding experience! ### YOUTH GROUP

Our Youth Group will be returning to Colorado Springs, CO this summer in June to attend a week long service project sponsored by Next Step Ministries. We were there in 2017, and there is still so much work to be



done! Currently, in Colorado, on any given night there are 16,203 individuals in the state of homelessness. There are 939 just in Colorado Springs alone, and of those 148 are between the ages of 13 and 25.

We will be participating in building projects for families, outreach events to the community, and service projects that meet the food and shelter needs of those in need. Along with Next Step Ministries, we will be partnering with local churches in the area and Family Life Services who focuses on rebuilding the lives of single moms and their children. The types of work we may be doing include: building repair (apartment remodels, flooring, roofing and landscaping at Family Life Services), working at a food pantry, or serving meals at a local shelter.

In order for members of our Youth to financially participate on this mission trip, would you consider being a shareholder? The cost per share is \$400, half a share is \$200, a quarter share is \$100... but any amount is greatly appreciated! As a shareholder, you will receive a letter from the Youth telling about their trip, plus you will be invited to attend the "Shareholder Thank You Dinner" where you will see a video and hear stories directly from the teens about their experiences. ## MUSIC NOTES

As we prepare for Lent, I hope that you are all ready to reflect on the last few years here at GCUMC, and also ready to move towards the future. God will help us achieve great things if we trust in Him and come together as a church. The music department is finally starting to feel normal again; we've got our biggest numbers of the year and have begun preparing for Easter. The music ministry we have is very committed and I hope we grow in participation for the rest of this year and beyond. While winter visitors will probably begin leaving this month, the music ministry has prepared a number of fine pieces of music for worship and is hoping to finish off "the season" on a high note, if you'll forgive the pun.

While many, including myself, were disappointed by Legacy Quartet's emergency cancellation due to illness last month, we have scheduled them for next year in February. They will be back; it's just a matter of time. This month, we have two upcoming performances to finish off this season of the Gold Canyon United Methodist Church Performing Arts Series as well as a final event presented by the Gold Canyon Arts Council.

On **Sunday, March 6 at 2:00pm**, we'll be hosting **The Sonoran Brass Quintet**. The Sonoran Brass is a group of professional brass musicians from throughout the greater Phoenix valley including Phoenix Symphony musicians, academics, and virtuosi. Sam Pilafian, former member of the Empire Brass and former professor of Tuba at ASU described the Sonoran Brass as "a group of five musical virtuosos who have transcended the difficulties of performing on brass instruments. They have become master storytellers in the medium of brass music. Their stories, whether on the concert stage or in a ceremonial setting, are told using the highest form of musical expression: EMOTIONAL COMMUNICATION!" Members of the quintet are some of the leading professionals in the southwest and together, they perform with energy, panache, and bravura in a large variety of musical styles from Bach to Broadway and beyond. Gold Canyon audiences may be familiar with their work if you attended our last Christmas concert, which many said was the best we've done! Come and hear these fabulous musicians for yourselves.

The following **Friday, March 11 at 7:00pm**, the Gold

Canyon Arts Council is hosting **The Fitzgerald Family**. This family of musicians and dancers from just outside of Canada's renowned Ottawa Valley are 3-time Canadian Grandmaster Fiddle Champions as well as Ontario Open Step Dance Champions! This unique group features high-energy fiddling and mind-blowing step dancing with a rare combination of musicianship, athleticism, audience interaction, and a genuine sibling connection that resonates with audiences of all ages. They present an eclectic program, blending traditional jigs and reels, bluegrass, Jazz, Celtic music, and show-stopping Ottawa Valley step dance genres. The energy and variety make this a truly unforgettable experience. Tickets are available at [goldcanyonarts.org/tickets](http://goldcanyonarts.org/tickets), the Apache Junction Chamber of Commerce, and Robin Rotella Realtors.

The closing concert of the 2021-2022 season of the GCUMC Performing Arts Series is, per tradition, an organ recital! This year, on **Sunday, March 20th at 2:00pm**, we'll be hosting my friend and colleague **Dr. Jacob Hofeling**. Dr. Hofeling is a fabulous organist and overall musician, earning accolades from across the globe. If you watched last season's organ concert, you'll have seen and heard some of his playing. Originally from Mesa, Arizona, Dr. Hofeling has a bachelor of music degree from Arizona State University, and a master of music degree and a doctorate of musical arts in organ from the University of Kansas. Jacob has also studied abroad in Bremen, Germany at the Hochschule für Künste under Professor Edoardo Bellotti. The Kansas City Metropolis wrote that Hofeling's playing, "had a wonderful variety of registers and colors and displayed a secure sense of control." He is currently represented by the Concert Artist Cooperative and his performances have been heard on the radio at KBAQ in Phoenix, Arizona and KPR in Kansas. Jacob and I studied together at the University of Kansas and I can tell you personally, he's one of the finest musicians I've ever worked with, so come enjoy his outstanding musicianship this March!

All Gold Canyon UMC Performing Arts Series concerts are open to the public with free admission. A free-will offering will be received to continue to support the artists and series at each concert. Attendees are also encouraged to bring a non-perishable food item or cash





donation for the GCUMC Food Bank if able. For the final concert of this season, all proceeds will go to support the GCUMC Organ Fund, which in turn supports a potential organ project. If you've been reading the Roadrunner or speaking with me or others in the know for the last few months, you know we're making progress on this front and hope to continue making progress this year. But as Fred said last month in his stewardship series, progress requires sacrifice. I hope that many of you will see the vision we have in mind and think it is a worthwhile endeavor.

Speaking of the organ project, the organ exploratory committee has met several times since my last Roadrunner article. At the end of the January, we went on an "organ crawl" (a tour of various organs) in Scottsdale, visiting the organs at La Casa de Cristo Lutheran Church and Pinnacle Presbyterian Church (a church designed by the same architect as ours!). This tour allowed the committee to see, and more importantly, hear and feel the differences between a digital imitation instrument and a real pipe organ. The committee was particularly touched by the artistry, craftsmanship, sound, and feel of the Richards, Fowkes, & Co. organ at Pinnacle Presbyterian. In the following committee meeting, the committee reflected on the "organ crawl" and envisioned an instrument of similar quality and effectiveness as Pinnacle's, here in Gold Canyon.

The committee also discussed how the early payoff the building debt may affect a potential project moving forward, especially given the church's renewed focus on building the Fellowship Hall. The committee does not wish an organ project to conflict with this focus, however, the question was asked: Can we not do both? We are a large and generous church with a committed and forward-thinking congregation. There should be no reason why we cannot achieve whatever we set our minds to if we come together. The committee plans to discuss this amongst other possibilities with Pastor Fred in the coming weeks and months. In addition to discussing the more political aspects of an organ project, the committee continued its discussion of technical details of an organ, finishing its study of winding (providing pressurized air to the pipes) and different types of pipes from flues to reeds (different types of pipes have different sounds). The committee also discussed the pros and cons of different types of key and stop action, and began the discussion on different national styles of organ building. French instruments are different from German are different from Italian, etc. Soon, the committee will complete its educational phase by comparing these national styles of organ building, thinking about an eclectic combination of styles, and organizing a final report of our current situation. It is my hope that we will be ready to discuss a potential project more specifically in the coming weeks, but we shall see.

As a final side note, I, like many of you are looking forward to Easter this year as, in many ways, it feels somewhat like a rebirth of the church. For me, it will be my first in-person Easter at GCUMC. It seems so strange to say that I've been here for almost three years without a regular Easter. We're still dealing with COVID, but it looks like it's becoming more endemic than pandemic and I hope that trend continues. I hope that in this coming year, we'll see more of our friends come back to church and renew their participation in all of our ministries. As I said before, when we come together, we achieve great things, and I think as we continue into 2022, it will be a great year.

### DELUXE TRANSPORTATION

The prospect of a new vehicle can bring a big smile to a person's face. What if it has three wheels and chain drive, but it's not a bicycle? It's not electric; it's not a hybrid. This vehicle is so eco-friendly that no biofuel or petroleum is required, yet it brings unimaginable joy to its new owner, who has only dreamed of such a luxury up until this moment.

I'm describing a mobility cart, a personal energy transportation (PET) device that makes mobility easy for someone who is crippled, has paralyzed legs, or is otherwise unable to walk. It's deluxe transportation in context. The sturdy mobility cart is powered by hand crank and comes in both adult and child sizes. When a person is able to self-transport, new possibilities open. Not only is he or she able to attend worship and other meetings as an independent person in the community, but business opportunities for self-support open. One can operate a small business, selling household items, staples, or novelties from a mobility cart. A whole new life opens for the previously limited individual.

Mobility Worldwide has developed the cart, produces both assembled and unassembled vehicles, and ships them to countries where missionaries or community service groups have requested them. The carts are created from durable parts and materials that are readily available should repairs be needed. They are a transforming gift to the recipient. Thank God for the vision and work of Mobility Worldwide.







## ON THE COUNTRY SIDE

I love stories. I think most of us do. Why else would we enjoy novels, movies, and TV? I also enjoy storytelling, which used to be common in conversation when I was a boy. So, I invite you to our Country and Western Service during the next few weeks where I intend to explore how these old stories we know so well shine light on important aspects of Lent. I hope you will join us.

The Pastor Alan Redpath in his book *A Passion for Preaching* recounts how one of his church members offered him advice about thinking before speaking, especially about controversial issues. The congregant offered this acrostic:

Redpath reports that this approach helped him to truly think before speaking. I suspect it would help us too. May I suggest that for Lent rather than focus on giving up something we enjoy, like chocolate, we use this acrostic as a way to monitor our speech and thereby obey our Lord’s example and instruction. Such habits are good for our souls!

## CARING CORNER

### KNOCK THE DUST OFF



This quote, *"Put your hand on a hot stove for a minute, and it seems like an hour. Sit with a pretty girl for an hour, and it seems like a minute. That's relativity,"* was in a book I recently read. I've heard it several times in the past, but it struck me a little differently this time.

Why? I suppose because of relativity. The impact of words upon our daily lives tends to increase or decrease relative to what is happening in and around our lives at the time, giving us context and perspective. Moving into what will be a 3<sup>rd</sup> year of impact on our lives by a pandemic, albeit reduced impact thank goodness, many people are weary of much. And if you watch the news, some aren't handling it so well. They have responded in anger, frustration, acting out, unkindness, and much more.

We've been discussing Galatians 5:22-23 in the past few months. Moving into the Spring and marching toward Easter seems like a good time to talk about two character traits found in the nature of Jesus Christ, spoken to us in that scripture – **patience** and **self-control**. Their definitions are similar in that they both speak of the ability to wait without becoming upset; not letting problems and difficult people get to us; restraint over our impulses, emotions, and desires; and the ability to not express those emotions in our behaviors, especially in difficult situations.

Have you seen someone losing patience and self-control in the past couple of years, or have you? Have you possibly wished a portion of your life away by praying that we could just jump ahead and past these times, to "normalcy"? I certainly have!

The quote on relativity makes even more sense when looked at through the lens of those 2 words in Galatians. Time passes slowly when we are going through tough times and seems to fly by when things are at their best. But it behooves us to remember that when we try to control too much within our surroundings, when we *rush* God's will for us, we get *burned*. What getting burned can look like for us is being in such a hurry to get to tomorrow, or two years from now, that we do not see, hear, feel, enjoy, truly

experience, or understand what is occurring in our lives now. And most importantly, we miss what we are to learn, God's will for us today. Jeremiah's Prayer found in Jeremiah 10:23 says...*"I know, Lord, that our lives are not our own. We are not able to plan our own course."*

We know this deep down, but our human tendency is to try to take the reins from God, especially during stressful times. It's okay though, God gets it. He expects us to attempt our best but knows we will sometimes fail at patience and self-control, amongst other things. Remember, even Jesus moving into the week before his death (Holy Week), had difficulty with that (see Matthew 21:12), and other times too for that matter. His humanness on earth and how He handled it can teach us much.

A friend of mine recently said *"everything right now feels like it has a coat of dust on it, not necessarily bad, just ugh, not great, time to spruce the place up, my head, my heart, everything. I may need to talk to someone who can help me get the layer of dust off."*

If you have a layer of dust, you can't shake off on your own, you might consider reaching out to **one of GCUMC's 4 Pastors to help**. They minister to members and friends of Gold Canyon UMC. MARCH – the Season of Lent – How do we celebrate Lent? What is Lent? The answer to these questions is many and varied. For many it has little meaning while

others take this time very seriously. The word "Lent" doesn't even appear in the New Testament of the Bible. I recently was reading an article on the Shelemah.com website and I'd like to share these thoughts.

Christians established this tradition in the late 500s AD to mark the beginning of the Lenten Season with the practice of using ashes as a symbol of confession and repentance of sin. Early Christians celebrated Lent as a reminder of the 40 days Jesus spent fasting in the wilderness after his Baptism.

## ST. ANDREWS CLINIC



St. Andrew's Children's Clinic is a volunteer-driven health clinic located at St. Andrew's Episcopal Church in Nogales, Arizona. Medical specialists provide much needed medical treatments to children who travel to the clinic from Mexico. Gold Canyon UMC volunteers have been making this one-day mission trip in March & October for many years using church vehicles and SUVs that are loaded with donations of supplies used at the clinic.

Due to new guidelines and restrictions since Covid, the clinic has not been in service in Nogales, AZ. Doctors and medical staff from Minnesota traveled to Hermosillo/Sonora in February to perform cleft palate surgeries on infants, and have plans for another trip in September 2022 so doctors can perform additional cleft palate surgeries.

We look forward to assisting with more donations of supplies in September. Our Church congregation has always given generously to the St. Andrew's Children's Clinic, with donations of supplies, handmade quilts, and monetary donations.

## HABITAT FOR HUMANITY

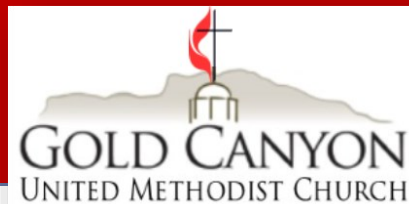
