GRIEF SHARE Grief is difficult for everyone impacted by a death. There are many who are dealing with grief

and struggling to make sense of the death of a loved one. Two new grief support groups will be starting in April:

- The evening group will begin Mon., 4/11 at 6pm
- The daytime group will begin Thurs., 4/14 at 1pm

Both will be held in the in the Emmaus Room in the Education Building. We are using the program, GriefShare: Your Journey from Mourning to Joy, which is 13 weeks long. There is a study guide for each participant which costs \$20. (If the cost of the workbook is a prohibitive please just speak to the facilitator.) Facilitators for this group will be Pastor Katharine Keller in the evening and Pamela Kopnick during the day.



FELLOW MAN INTERNATIONAL SHARES GOD'S LOVE IN HONDURAS


The three-fold mission of FMI continues to be providing medical care for the sick, combatting malnutrition and hunger through agriculture, and improving literacy and numeracy through educational support. The staff continues to search for ways to make the mission self-sustaining by encouraging the participation of Hondurans. They also work at developing programs with income generating potential. The goal is to pay part of the operating costs while reinvesting in and expanding the present services. These worthy goals depend on the lifeblood of donations. GCUMC is pleased to support the ministry of FMI through General Budget and designated giving.

FMI has now developed its own breeding stock of hogs, allowing them to produce meat for local nutrition programs as well as sell feeder pigs. The flock of dual-purpose hens now lays over 80 eggs a day. Eggs are an excellent means of addressing protein deficiency because clean, unwashed eggs do not require refrigeration. To accommodate the laying flock, local labor repurposed old roofing for the new hen house. In addition, chicks are raised to fryer weight, providing another protein source. Both Covid and recent hurricanes have increased malnutrition, making FMI's agricultural work vital.

The FMI physicians, Drs. Pineda and Villela, both Hondurans worked with the Ministry of Health to distribute and administer vaccines in the remote villages of the FMI service area. More than 600 people have received two doses of Covid-19 vaccine. The mission's service area has one of the lowest infection rates in Honduras, thanks to the early, extensive vaccination effort.

In March we alluded to the fact that the last week of Jesus' life was difficult. But in his 3-6-22 sermon Pastor Fred elaborated for us, difficult is an understatement. We were reminded that the week in Jerusalem prior to Jesus' death, and in particular Passover (The Last Supper), was filled with uncertainty for Jesus and the Disciples, the momentum surrounding them had shifted. Until then, everywhere they went crowds gathered, momentum continually built, Jesus was a rockstar. ultimate hope...". Now, there were rumors he was going to die.

disciples, but God was leveraging that moment for His most remarkable work. They just couldn't see it at the time. How did Jesus respond during such uncertainty? He knew what awaited Him, yet He approached and endured the cross with confidence and grace. He had faith in our, His, heavenly Father. God fulfilled His promise and Jesus was raised from the dead on the third day, purchasing salvation, forgiveness, and everlasting If this time in your life makes it difficult to hear the life for all of us.

Earthly definitions of faith include descriptions such as steadfast in affection or allegiance; firm in adherence to promise or duty; loyal; quality of being true to one's word or commitments. The Bible's definition of faith is found in Hebrews 11:1 - 1Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen.

When there is uncertainty in our lives, do we respond like Jesus? My March 8th devotional (New Morning Mercies, Paul David Tripp) said these things - Yes, your life is messy and hard, but that is not a failure of the plan; it is the plan. It's God working to complete what He's begun in you...It's not the way we tend to think about God's love. It doesn't seem wise and good to us. It causes

us to question God's faithfulness and love...those moments of difficulty are... an important part of His plan. We all need to teach and encourage one another with the theology of uncomfortable grace, because on this side of eternity, God's grace often comes to us in uncomfortable forms... not what you and I want, but it is precisely what we need. God is faithful...

When our world seems uncertain and crazy, and times are hard do we cling to God and faith, or get discouraged and drift away? It behooves us to remember Jesus' example from the cross, in the most uncertain of times he did not drift but remained steadfastly faithful and hopeful! In Who is this Man, Pastor John Ortberg wrote:

"Jesus outlasted, out maneuvered, and outthought every group, every power. But not just that. Mostly he just out loved everybody. The cross was changed from the symbol of a human empire's power, into a symbol of the suffering love of God...from expression of ultimate threat to

God is good, God is faithful, God is unchanging. He will It was a most chaotic and unpredictable time for the be with us amidst the good times, and amidst the stormy times, even when we are blind to His presence. If Easter is not a time to renew our faith, when is? Do we allow our hearts to be quiet and listen to the message of hope from the cross? In Psalm 66 we are reminded that just as fire purifies silver in the smelting process, trials refine our character. Being at peace with this can be much more difficult than reading it, however.

HABITAT FOR HUMANITY



The timing of our build this year has changed because of delays in the fall builds getting completed. We are still scheduled to participate in a renovation build, much like the one we did last

winter. It will be located near West 1st Avenue and Country Club in Mesa (453 W. 1st Ave.). We hope it will start in mid-April and should have two Saturdays assigned to us to work on it. We will be paired with another faith group and probably a corporate group. The family has not been chosen yet but will be selected soon.

We have had several church members volunteer to work one or both Saturdays, but can still accept more people if you are interested. Tasks are flexible and we can accommodate various levels of skill. You do not need to be an expert to come out and help. Last year the work was primarily painting and this may be the same.
