FROM THE PASTOR: "THEN AND NOW"



Church members have wondered how our attendance is holding up in 2022 compared to pre-COVID.


The top bar in the graph to the right shows that in 2019 before COVID,

our average in-person worship was 1,071, and our average online worship was 432, which brings our total average worship for 2019 to 1,503.



Also, in the bottom bar of the graph from Sept. 2021 – Aug. 2022, our average in-person worship was 607, and our average online worship was 938, which brings our total average worship for those 12 months to 1,545.

We had a 44% drop in inperson worship and a 217% increase in online worship. Overall we have seen a 3% gain in worship when online and inperson are added together. Some might be skeptical of the commitment of online worshippers, but we have also seen a 3% increase in giving from 2019 to today.

THANKSGIVING... AGAIN!



Do you feel like time flies faster each year? Do you catch yourself saying can't believe it's the holiday season again."? Thanksgiving approaches,

we often speak of being in a spirit of thanksgiving.

What does that mean, really? Thanksgiving isn't a religious holiday per se. But as Christians, it tends to be a period in which we focus strongly on God's grace for us, being thankful for what He has given us. We sing His praises a little louder than normal, say long prayers of Thanksgiving for many things in our lives, and tend to utter a verbal thank you for things we don't normally voice out loud, a recap of the good things for the year.

"Many people will miss God's plan for their lives by about 18 inches—the distance between their head and hard to treat others like we'd like to be treated. their heart." That spoke to me, making me wonder why it can be so hard to consistently put God's plan into action. We know what we should do, but we tend to get caught up in the day to day of our lives, and literally forget to act.

What does God's word tell us about action, what we are to do? Let's start with Jesus' answer to the question of which commandment is the most important, Mark 12:29 -31 "Jesus replied, "The most important commandment is this: 'Listen, O Israel! The Lord our God is the one and only Lord. And you must love the Lord your God with all your heart, all your soul, all your mind, and all your strength.' The second is equally important: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' No other commandment is greater than these." Simply put, we are told to love God, and love others.

relationships. It stated that in a recent study it was learned that relationships are better when we express thanksgiving to, and for, the other person. Well, no kidding!! Seems like a no brainer to me. Yet do we consistently express that thanksgiving? Or do we get lax, plug along taking people, and our lives, for granted? Do we think the little things day to day aren't worthy of

our expression of thanks?

If you think the little things aren't important, just mess up once on where you put the decimal point in your monthly budget - \$100.00 vs. \$1000.00 - and then say the little things don't matter! Not only do the two most important commandments provide us direction, but the Golden Rule in Matthew 7:12 tells us "Do to others whatever you would like them to do to you."

Even with Christ so clearly laying out the road map for us, it sure seems hard to follow sometimes. Often in a day, we struggle to find good things, so we don't say thank you. We miss the little things and don't say thanks. We don't understand why a particular person is in our lives, as it may seem their sole purpose is to annoy us, so we don't say thank you. (I've heard them called "prickly people") That 18 inches between our heads and our hearts might as well be a mile. A friend In an October devotional, Pastor Rick Warren wrote of mine once called those prickly people EGR's, Extra Grace Required people. Every now and then it can be

> But, when we recognize and appreciate God's grace given to us, we can better give it to others. When we remember that we are EGR's in God's world, we can be more thankful for those around us. When we spend a day looking for the little things in our lives, we can close that distance between our head and our hearts, and act on God's plan more consistently.

Part 6: Process to Acquire a Pipe Organ

And, last month we took a pause from providing technical information, and we responded to a comment about competing priorities Also on November 13, at 2:00 p.m., Gold Canyon UMC ministries that are directed toward our congregation will be hosting the 16th Annual Celebration of Veterans and outreach ministries. > The short answer is that we need to identify funding, decide commission a pipe organ, select a builder, and continue to raise funds while waiting for the instrument to be built and then installed in our sanctuary. Our use of the sanctuary will

not be restricted by the organ project, unless a decision is made to make significant improvements to the sanctuary at the same time. The process of installing and "voicing" the pipe organ will take several months and will occur in full view of the congregation. This will be an exciting time to worship in the sanctuary as the instrument takes form and ranks of pipes are placed into service, literally experiencing the instrument come to life, week by week.

Step 1: Education and Research:

Step 2: A Formal but Non-Binding Decision and Request for Proposals:

Before artisans undertake the substantial work and expense of preparing a proposal, builders need to know that there is a baseline agreement by the congregation to obtain a pipe organ. This is not a legal commitment; it Once an instrument is commissioned, our church will is simply a public affirmation that our church embraces the project and made an aspirational decision to work toward and, when able to do so, acquire a pipe organ.

Said another way, we have reached the point where it can't just be the Organ Committee speaking with builders; they need to know that the congregation and decision-makers support the project, share our vision, and want proposals. Step 3: Selecting an Organ Builder and Commissioning an Instrument:

Once the church receives proposals, and when the church is prepared to commission an instrument, representatives of the church will probably need to conduct some due diligence and site visits, inspecting instruments from the preferred builder that are most comparable to what we may commission. These due diligence activities may include a site visit to the workshop.

secure its place in line to have an instrument built in their workshop, then disassembled for transport, and later installed in our sanctuary. Depending on the state of the economy and other factors, we might be lucky and get an early date, but it is likely that we will need to wait between two and seven years before our instrument will be ready for installation. Please keep in mind that this timeline informs the Organ Committee's belief that we should act as soon as practicable, since the likely timeframe is tight when compared to the predicted lifespan of our current digital organ, but this also brings clarity that there is a lengthy gap for fundraising after an organ is commissioned and before it is completed.

Sanctuary:

sanctuary during a worship service that starts the balance of the necessary funds. installation of the instrument.

In the weeks that follow, the case (which is the wooden, visible structure) will be reassembled in its new home, and we will watch individual ranks of pipes being installed, voiced, and placed in service, and we will begin to hear those first ranks of pipes as the installation progresses, and we will experience the sound of the organ mature as more ranks of pipes are added, until the instrument is fully assembled. Even then, additional "voicing" of the instrument will take still more time, as the instrument is refined to best fill our sanctuary.

Step 5: Dedication:

When a new pipe organ is placed into service, we will dedicate the instrument into service, much like our dedication of our sanctuary, but the dedication will likely take the form of a dedicatory organ recital. And it is a tradition, which is embraced by Dr. Classe, for an instrument of this caliber to be dedicated through the artistry of a world-class guest organist. This will be an exciting time for our congregation and within our community.

Funding:

must return us to the subject of funding. Fundraising is a timeless step that typically spans all of the steps of a project of this magnitude.

We hope and pray that an angel donor will adopt this Tim Hammers, and Dawn Carroll project and provide the necessary funding from beginning to end. We have learned of multiple organs that were funded in exactly this manner, just as our current digital organ was a generous gift, as was the instrument that we visited at the University of California. And if there is an angel in our midst who is moved to make this organ project a reality, we eagerly hope to hear from you.

A more typical approach when funding an instrument is for one or more angels to provide partial funding and help ignite and energize the project, combined with membership providing momentum and showing support through contributions to the Organ Fund. We currently have approximately \$150,000 in our Organ Fund, and the good news is that our fund is growing faster this year than in past years.

> We don't know how much funding our leadership will require before commissioning an instrument, but we trust that we won't need to raise the entire balance before we commission an instrument, just as we know that we need to raise more funds before reaching that goal. To this end, every contribution brings us closer.

Next Step:

We think we should challenge ourselves to take the next step this winter, while our seasonal membership is present, and we should make a public but non-binding affirmation of our goal to commission a magnificent pipe organ; so that we can request proposals, ask builders to evaluate our sanctuary, and refine our plan for our sanctuary and organ. We believe this simple but obvious step is vital to move this project forward.

Thank you for your thoughtful consideration of these issues. GOD BLESS MEL WEST... LOOK AT THESE NUMBERS!

In 1994 retiree Mel West founded the hand-crank mobility cart project that has become Mobility Worldwide. To date, the mobility cart mission family has produced and shipped over 90,000 carts to 106 countries. Over 29,000 carts have been produced in Columbia, Missouri, MW's headquarters, but 31 affiliate workshops also construct carts. In the first 7.5 months of 2022 cart production is at 890. The sturdy carts are simply constructed of sturdy materials and come in child and adult sizes. 70 distribution partners receive shipments and facilitate delivery of the carts to individuals.

The World Health Organization estimates 70 million disabled individuals around the world have serious mobility challenges. In locations where roads and paths are rough and steep, and where walking is the primary means of transportation, the hand crank carts are a life-changing gift for someone who can't walk unaided. Imagine an adult, dependent on charity because of immobility, who receives a cart, and with \$25 creates a "mini-mart" by

adding display trays below and a cooler at the cart back. The person can now move with ease and become a merchant. Independence and earning an income become possible virtually overnight.

Here are the last big numbers: In May-June Mobility Worldwide founder, Mel West and his wife, Barbara, celebrated their 98th birthdays and their 77th wedding anniversary, experiencing what God declares in Psalm 91:16. "With long life I will satisfy them, and show them my salvation."


