# FROM THE PASTOR: "LIKES & DISLIKES ABOUT CHRISTMAS"

A 2013 poll done by Pew Research asked people what they liked or

disliked the most about the Christmas holiday season. Here's a list of what people most look forward to at Christmas time:

- 1. 68% said spending time with family and friends
- 2. 11% mentioned religious services or religious reflection
- 3. 11% look forward to the Christmas "spirit" of joy and good will
- 4. 5% said music, decorations, and shopping
- 5. 4% look forward to the end of the Christmas season

Here's what the poll said we most dislike about the Christmas season:

- 1. 33% the commercialism and materialism
- 2. 22% the money and expense
- 3. 10% the shopping and crowds
- 4. 5% the hectic pace and bad moods of people
- 5. 2% the pressure to go to church

Are you surprised by anything on this list? I would guess you might agree with most things on this list but I was surprised that only 11% of people look forward to "religious services or religious reflection." Especially when the season is all about Jesus' birth.

At our church we are preparing Advent and Christmas worship services that we hope you will look forward to attending. We are committed to make them the highlight of your Christmas this year. We also pray that you might take the opportunity to invite

family, friends or neighbors to worship with you. Did you know that people who don't attend church are more likely to attend a worship service for the first time on Christmas Eve?

This year we will mail out 15,000 invitation cards to our neighbors. We would expect to have about a 1% response. That means about 150 new people might attend. This is great. However your personal invitation to someone is far more effective. That invitation might be a turning point in their life. I will see you in worship with a friend or two.

Sidewalk is an outreach ministry for children, held October through April. The volunteers from GCUMC act as "Shepherds", loving &




#### **OUTDOOR MOVIE NIGHT!**



We are in the middle of the time of year that is great fun for most people, and great pain for many of those who have lost a loved one in the past year—or longer.

All of the ads on TV are typically about happy families or couples. I have listened to people in grief support groups tell how much they dread this season for the past 37 years.

If you are not fully enjoying the season, you aren't alone and you certainly aren't the first.

It is important to get focused on the real Christmas and not the secular world's "Xmas." The birth of Jesus tells us God came into the world to be with us up close and personal—and God has never left. God is with you always. If you can't celebrate anything else, that is enough to give you hope for the new year that is just around the corner.

Your pastors are available to you for prayer and counsel. The worship services are always uplifting. It's true that the hymns and familiar Christmas Carols stir emotions. They were intended to do that. It's okay. A song never makes you cry. It opens the door to allow sadness that is already there to come out and be expressed—and that's a good thing. No one has ever been hurt by crying. Like all pastors, I have had to do more than a few funerals for people who would not cry.

Christ or "cute"? Each year the US Postal Service issues a distinctly Christian stamp. By buying Christian Christmas stamps, we are voting for present and future issues of postage that reflects the true meaning of Christmas and helps keep Christ in the holiday with His name.

December, the most beautiful time of the year, the happiest time and perhaps the most "melodiest" time of the year! Everywhere we go there are songs people are singing or whistling or listening to that brings a smile, a memory, and, hopefully, a sense of happiness. For many, though, this can be

a time of sadness reflecting on the loss of a loved one, or a time of frustration while shopping, etc.. During this time, I hope you will continue to look in the mirror after waking up and perhaps wishing that person looking back at you a "Very Merry Christmas!" This will at least get you started on a happy note! I also hope you will be aware of people whom you can positively impact with a smile, a "Merry Christmas" greeting and/or a random act of kindness!

This month we offer our 14<sup>th</sup> Annual Choral Christmas Concerts on Saturday, Dec. 12, at 3:00pm and 6:00pm. Featured will be the Chancel Choir, Canyon Carillon (Handbells), Chanters (men's chorus), Women's Chorus, and Agape Brass Quintet. Also, soprano Cindy Hoff will sing the beloved Ave Maria of Bach/Gounod, and baritone Don Engbrecht will sing his special rendition of The Birthday of a King plus solos by Gary Ackerson and Wade Hoff.

This is the biggest event we have all year. These concerts are open to the public at no charge as free will offerings will be received. We hope you will bring your family, your friends and your neighbors for an afternoon or evening of some great music — carols old and new, and even a special recipe for Fruitcake! If you have the option, I suggest you come at 6:00 as there are usually a few more seats available at that concert. Both concerts do fill up quickly so be sure and come early. Doors will open on hour prior to each concert. Everyone is asked to please remember to bring at least one non-perishable food item per person for the GCUMC Food Bank — the need is great!

Also note the *Christmas Eve Services* described elsewhere. The Music Ministries will once again present our annual *Gift of Music*, a half-hour of special music at 5:30 and 7:30, prior to the 6:00 and 8:00 Christmas Eve Candlelight Services.

Intro to Handbells a new, beginning handbell choir, will begin in January on Tuesday, Jan. 12 in the Sanctuary from 5:15-6:15 pm. This new group will be directed by longtime ringer and director,

Julie Burzlaff, who rings with the Canyon Carillon. This is open to anyone who wants to learn about handbells and try their hand at it. If you can read music at least a little, this is a big help. If you have any questions, please call Doug at the church and I'll put you in touch with Julie. Come check this out! You will really enjoy learning to ring - I promise!

Pipes for the Organ: Mark Anderson, the man who voiced our organ, and has installed more pipes with Rodgers Organs than anyone else, has given us a new Pipe Casework drawing that is much more interesting and fits our space better than the old design. Next step is to take this to our committee then to the Administrative Council – hopefully with a realistic, approximate cost. The drawing includes four ranks (sets) of actual wind-blown pipes to be added to our 3-manual Rodgers digital organ. I am very excited about this project! We have found a way to keep the Handbells behind – and closer – to the Choir, with the organ above and behind the bells, mixing the real, wind-blown pipes with the electronic speakers. This will create a very broad sound while actually reducing the volume, since the sound will no longer be focused out of the very small opening that it is now. Finally, the Organ, Bells and Choir will be projected together as one instrument. The pipes themselves are limited to the lower pitches so there will be no "screechy", high pitched pipes blowing into the heads of the Choir! Thanks to all of you who have donated - and continue to donate - to this fund!

Take time to enjoy the holidays, spending time with family, friends – and God! "And as Tiny Tim observed, 'God bless us, everyone!"



#### **GLOBAL MISSIONS OPPORTUNITIES**

Fay Quanstrom, Associate Pastor







The GCUMC Global Missions Committee hosted Fred Curry of Rice and Beans Ministry in Costa Rica along with two national workers, Loly Quiros and Rosi Rivera, who accompanied him at their annual Global Missions Brunch. After a delicious meal prepared by Colette Bos, Fred, Loly and Rosi shared their vision and passion with us. Although Costa Rica is the richest country in Central America, many live on extremely meager

incomes, with one job frequently supporting an extended family or more. Rice and Beans is a not-for-profit that ministers to housing and food needs in the poorer neighborhoods of Alejeula province. After the staff has completed demographic surveys and consulted with local schools and agencies, neighborhoods are chosen for food distribution. Teams deliver 2 kilos each of rice, beans, masa, and dry milk to make two gallons to homes as an expression of Jesus' love for them. With the help of interpreters the team then offers to pray with recipients of the food. Only very rarely does anyone decline the offer for prayer! The people name their requests, the team joins hands with a circle of those who live in the home and they pray for the requests, asking God's blessing on the people. They then walk to the next home. Three home Bible study groups have developed from these recent contacts. As leadership becomes available more groups will be started—one more way to share Christ.

Another aspect of Rice and Beans Ministry is home improvement work. As food is delivered and from other contacts the staff learns of acute needs such as roofs, sturdy walls, floors, and accessibility ramps. This type of construction meets vital needs as well as builds personal relationships and opportunities to share the love of Christ.

Rice and Beans work teams also offer Vacation Bible School and help children attend school by furnishing uniforms, shoes, and school supplies to those who would not be able to attend without these basics. They send a big, special thank you for the 444 school uniforms they were able to buy because of the generous Easter offering GCUMC shared with them. That's 444 children who were able to attend school because of your help. Thank you to each of one who shared so generously!

GCUMC's 2016 Mission Work Team will leave January 16 to work again with Rice and Beans for a week. Contact Fay Quanstrom right away if you would like to learn more or to be part of this opportunity.

In one portion the story discussed the reestablishment of a lawful Texas Ranger force after the civil war and Reconstruction; during which time the Texas Rangers had lost their way. They went down the wrong path, losing their original lawful and honorable purpose and descending into lawlessness.

As a retired police officer, the below statement by author Jeff Guinn really resonated with me:

"All officers of the law are creatures of it, and a creature cannot become bigger than a creator and whenever an officer undertakes to set himself up as superior to the law or superior to the citizens, whose servant he is, his usefulness as an officer ceases."

I read that statement a couple of times, pondered it, and later came back to it. It resonated with me for a greater reason – how very much the phraseology parallels us as humans in relationship to God. Let's look at it a little more carefully and see if you see something similar to what I saw...

"All officers of the law are creatures of it"

(The officers are us and "it" is God)

"a creature cannot become bigger than a creator" (We are the creature, God the creator)

And the last half of that phrase hits the home run...

"and whenever an officer undertakes to set himself up as superior to the law or superior to the citizens, whose servant he is, his usefulness as an officer ceases."

(The officer is us, and the law or the citizens? Yes, you have it, God)

My oh my, how often we do this! We worry, try to take complete control, take the reigns and go solo to make things happen. We can get lost in the day to day, forget whose servant we are, and risk losing our usefulness.

This Christmas season, take time to reflect upon the beauty of Christ's birth. Remember that our heavenly father is the one in control, and with that comes a blessed promise for each and every one of us.

Be a friend, a companion, an ear, a helping hand to someone during this glorious season. If you or someone you know needs an impartial and non-judgmental ear, then you might consider asking for a Stephen Minister. Allow a walk with a fellow Christian to carry you into the New Year.






#### "TIS THE SEASON TO BE JOLLY!"

- 2. Remember to participate in your "usual" healthy exercise activities or if needing to start try walking for 15-30 minute every day or attending your exercise class. It's crucial for a healthy heart and brain and reduces stress. You want to be at your best and this can help you achieve and maintain a clear head and a joyful spirit.
- 3. Drink plenty of water Mix it up a bit by adding fresh fruit such as lemon or orange slices, adding the fruit may also help speed up your metabolism. Hydration is crucial year round in Arizona especially.
- 4. Boost your Immune system by eating garlic as it increases production of disease fighting white blood cells. Take supplemental Vitamin C up to 500mg -1000 mg twice day especially if you are not a fresh fruit juice drinker or restricted due to certain medications or diabetes.

"I think we had seventeen singers when I started directing the Choir in the school where we were meeting. We practiced in a small office in a nearby strip mall, where a piano was stored that someone had donated to the church. God had a purpose for this church, and He was always there when we needed Him!

God led me to Nancy Virden. I was singing in the Mountainbrook Village Voices at that time. We had a substitute pianist fill-in for the Choir, and she was so good! I immediately went over after rehearsal and asked if she would help me build a choir at the United Methodist Church. We both loved a challenge and she came to our first rehearsal in the office and stayed with me for the ten years that I directed. When fun we had building the church choir and music department together!

Because we had no money for choir anthems, for two years I brought music from my church in Elko, NV, where I had been a Director for many years, and they were happy to share with us.

I will never forget Miracle Sunday when a few people believed God was with us, and we raised the money to purchase the land for the church. Later we began our first United Methodist building.

The Choir grew quickly, and we added an extension to the stage and gave our first Christmas Concert, where we sang three times to a packed church. We were a proud music family that loved singing for God and our congregation. Soon Pastor Fred was preaching several services and the devoted choir sang for all three of them. I have many happy memories of those growing years!

# MINISTRY & MISSION

#### HIKING MINISTRY

Jim Riedel, Hiking Ministry Leader



This ministry not only lifts you physically, but lifts you spiritually, as well. Being out in God's world of in the Spirit nature can be very uplifting, and we can also help you talk through things in your life if you feel like sharing.

We have had people who participate in our group, who are not members of our church, declare how friendly and wonderful our group really is. So, come on, anyone can join in!

In the beginning of the hiking season, I choose light and easy trails, as everyone is out of shape. Although schedules are available, unless you have been on these trails, you won't know how difficult they are. We also advise everyone via the weekly church bulletin as to the difficulty level of each hike. We hike at various locations on the east side of the valley (like the Superstitions) and sometimes north and southeast of Gold Canyon (north along Hwy 87 & the Superior area). Some of us occasionally like taking on more special and endurance hikes together such as hiking to Canyon Lake from east of the Lost Dutchmen State Park area.

The hikes can be interpretative, teaching one about the desert plants and animals that live there. Generally the hikes are of 3-5 mile ventures, sometimes more and are as short as 3 hours, and as long as 5+ due to travel time, which is why we ask everyone not to plan appointments or other gatherings for the day. We hike at the rate of the slowest hiker to keep together while doing established trails some flat (easy) and some of medium hiking ability. We generally meet at the southern Gold Canyon Church parking lot at 8:00am and commute to the trailhead and, depending where you live, one can meet right at the trailhead.

Equipment to bring is 2-3 liters of water, a snack or lunch, good hiking shoes (boots), layers of clothing, a jacket & gloves (depending on the temperature), wide hat, sun screen, any other items you may need such as any medications or walking sticks, sunglasses, and a light knapsack to put it all in. We look forward to seeing you at future hikes!

You can return the finished top and we'll add the batting and backing.

Come join us on the last Tuesday of the month! We begin at 9:00am and work until around 2:00pm, with time-out for lunch (bring your own.) We usually use domestic sewing machines on which to quilt by stitching in the ditch, meandering, or "xing" across the squares.
