FROM THE PASTOR: "CHRISTMAS EXPECTATION"

Pastor Tim Keller in his book Hidden Christmas mentions that one of the most thoughtful world leaders of the late 20th century was Vaclav Havel, the first president of the Czech Republic. He had a unique vantage point from which to peer deeply into both socialism and capitalism, and he was not optimistic that either would, by itself, solve the greatest human problems. He knew that science unguided by moral principles had given

us the Holocaust. He concluded that neither technology nor the government nor the market alone could save us from our problems. "Pursuit of the good life will not help humanity save itself, nor is democracy alone enough," Havel said. "A turning to and seeing ... God is needed." The human race constantly forgets, he added, that "we are not God."

During the Christmas season we are reminded of our need for Jesus. Jesus is the light that comes in the midst of darkness. We are also reminded that Jesus counts on us to spread his light to others.

We plan to do that during this Christmas. Not only will we buy Christmas gifts for those in need through our Angel Tree Ministry but we also plan to give away all our Christmas Eve offering to help Peralta Trails Elementary School improve their playground. Since their financial resources are limited their playground facilities are limited. We hope to raise \$30,000 to improve their outdoor facilities. We hope you will join us in this effort. If you would like to make a donation and you are leaving town before Christmas Eve just mark it "Peralta Playground" and it will go into the proper fund. I will see you Sunday.



A Note from Bob

Going to a wilderness place in Alaska was never on my agenda of "Things to Do." I don't like cold (waking up to low 50's recently is pushing my limit of toleration). However, when Nancy sent me photos of

her adventure into the area in 2017 (before our marriage) I was awestruck with the pristine beauty.

Wood-Tikchick State Park covers 1.9 million acres. It is the largest State Park in the United States. The Togiak Wildlife Refuge to the west adds another 4.7 million acres. The only access is single engine planes with pontoons to land on rivers and lakes, each carrying 2 guides, 4 passengers and the pilot.

I couldn't resist. In spite of Nancy's words of caution telling me it was hard core fishing (catch and release) and physically challenging, I signed up to go with her to The Royal Coachman Lodge in September, 2018. It turned out to be an 8-day adventure of a lifetime! The beauty of rivers, lakes, glaciers and the rugged terrain are beyond my ability to describe them.

It was a challenge to say the least to get my not-as-young-as-I-used-to-be-body into the float plane at least twice every day, learn to fly fish, wade in rivers and catch fighting fish the likes of which I had never seen. My arms were sore after catching rainbow trout, the largest of which was 27" long (So I would stay humble, my very-experienced wife caught one 29" long). I came home really tired all over, but totally eager to go do it again. We plan to do that next September.

It reminds me of the state of awe and wonder I felt on the afternoon of August 13, 1957 after meeting with Dr. E. Stanley Jones in a small cabin at a church campground in the high Sierra Mountains of California.

It was the first time I heard about a God who made sense and a Jesus who is reachable. It was the first time I prayed as a conversation with God and felt a Spiritual Presence in my life that has never gone away.

I think we need special occasions that both jar us out of the ruts we tend to get in and fill us with awe and wonder. It gives us a whole new perspective about our lives and the lives of those around us. It opens new horizons and possibilities for us. It can be anything from "I never knew an adventure in Alaska" or "______" — (You fill in the blank) could touch my life so much—to a spiritual encounter with the living Christ that leaves us saying "Jesus, you are Lord and I will follow you for the rest of my life."

Nancy and I are going back to Alaska next year to experience all the wonder again. I go back to Jesus every



May we all have a most blessed Christmas and all good things in the new year. .



PASTORAL & CONGREGATIONAL CARE

GOD'S CHRISTMAS TREE - Dr. David Worley

The festive time of year is upon us. Busy schedules, decorating, gift buying, enjoying family and friends, good food (and plenty of it!) wonderful music and special worship gatherings are but some of the joys of the Christmas Season. Deb and I have a custom; we decorate our Christmas tree the day after Thanksgiving. It's an all day project to get the decorations from storage, sort them and then rearrange the furniture, put up the tree, decorate it and then put up the outside decorations. Thank goodness for the Thanksgiving leftovers when dinner time comes!

Each year as we put up our tree, which I consider the centerpiece of our holiday decorations, I cannot help but think about God's Christmas tree – the cross. Roman crosses were often, according to archaeological studies, made of olive wood or at times even an olive tree was used, unlike our common preference for pine trees or in our case an artificial one. Although different scholars describe various ways that the gruesome act of crucifixion took place (if you are interested in this subject you may enjoy reading the following article https://www.biblicalarchaeology.org/daily/biblical-topics/crucifixion/roman-crucifixion-methods-reveal-the-history-of-crucifixion/), we know from Scripture that Jesus was crucified and that His death was God's answer to human sin. As 2 Corinthians 5:21 explains, For God made Christ, who never sinned, to be the offering for our sin, so that we could be made right with God through Christ (NLT).

God's Christmas tree had no colorful ornaments, only the crimson stain of our Savior's blood. God's Christmas tree had no bright lights but only the enclosing dark of the storm that gathered as our Lord's death drew near. God's Christmas tree had no tinkling bells but only the cries of agony from our Savior's lips, his ragged breathing as he suffocated in his own fluids, and his seven last words. God's Christmas tree had no brightly wrapped packages but it did shower us with amazing gifts: grace, forgiveness, redemption and eternal life. Because of the cross we are blessed with every spiritual blessing in Christ (see Eph. 1: 1-11). Please do read these verses and note how many blessings are ours.

As you celebrate this year; and I believe Christians should celebrate the message, meaning and merriment of Christmas notwithstanding the critics, please be sure to remember God's Christmas tree and the wondrous gifts He has placed under that tree. As you buy gifts and weigh your budget to see how much you can spend on that special gift for that special person remember that God gave all He had when He gave us His beloved, begotten Son who is our Savior. Amidst our "holly, jolly Christmas" let us pause to turn our eyes upon Jesus and remember His incarnation, His crucifixion and His resurrection, which are the hallmarks of our faith, and bring Him our gift of heart-felt worship.

POSTAGE WITH A PURPOSE



Christ or "cute"? Each year the US Postal Service issues a distinctly Christian stamp. These stamps could be considered miniature Christmas but cards. many other choices { (snowmen, poinsettias, gingerbread houses, Santa & Rudolph) are also

RUN HOME FOR A SWEATER



In Dr. David Worley's November Newsletter article titled Incognito, he reflected upon his and Deb's intro to our church, and the fact that

they remained incognito for 5 years. I really related to his message, as I grew up moving continually. By my very nature I was (and am) an introvert, and those traits were exacerbated by continual relocating. For quite a period of my life if you looked up incognito in the dictionary you might have seen my picture!

As I matured, I slowly became more self-aware and began to recognize what I had done. I had taken my nature, doled out to me by our Heavenly Father, and had cloaked it even further with a protective shell. It was hard for me to make friends due to my shyness, and all the moving became increasingly painful. So, what did I do? I withdrew further, because the less I reached out and the fewer deep connections I made, the less pain I would undergo when I moved and lost the relationships.

One of our country's most famous introverts, Eleanor Roosevelt, said, "You must do the thing you think you cannot do". As I allowed myself to step out from under the cloak, listened to some wonderful friends and mentors, and grew in my walk with Christ, I realized I needed to change a couple of things. I was losing out when isolating myself, AND, potentially missing out on God's calling for me. The sayings "nothing ventured, nothing gained", "risk vs. reward", or "a stranger is just a friend you haven't met yet", come to mind.

As we Christians move into this holy season of Christ's birth, attendance in our church skyrockets. It is a time when those who may not attend regularly, feel the need for increased love, sense of community, and possibly the desire to get back-on-track. Others may not be in the best places in their lives, but in this season of hope, they are reaching out. There is no greater time for us to be at our best... "Welcome one another, therefore, just as Christ has welcomed you, for the glory of God". (Romans 15:7)

Dr. Worley's message is a wonderful one to remember at this time. Despite your character traits,

introvert or extrovert, make the decision to reach out and be welcoming. Instead of only smiling and nodding during the greeting time, actually say "welcome", or "glad you're here", or "I'm John, wonderful to see you" or "God Bless You." Or if you are normally gregarious anyway, step out to an additional aisle or three! Whatever you do, don't huddle in that same old comfortable group during coffee and conversation.

I have found by forcing myself out there further, outside my comfort zone, that people seldom bite! Above and beyond that, I have made friends and connections I never would have made otherwise; I have developed relationships that enhance and strengthen my life; and doors have opened for me to use the time and talents God has given me.

In the Christmas novel A Christmas Secret, by Katherine Spencer, a Pastor accented a story about a loving, caring, and selfless individual by saying "He'd give you the shirt off his back and run home to get you a sweater!" This Pastor further challenged his congregation by asking each one to answer the below two questions:

"What is the true meaning of Christmas to me?"

"What can I do to make this season more meaningful, for myself and my family?"

I challenge myself this Christmas season to answer the questions the fictional Pastor asked, in a meaningful way, and to be the one running home to get a sweater! I hope you will join me.

HIKING MINISTRY



This ministry not only lifts you physically, but also spiritually! Our official start of this hiking season is January 8th. Some of the hikes are the Treasure Loop via the Mine, Jacobs Crosscut, Phon D. Sutton Mid

-mountain Pass (short) to Salt River & back, Parker Pass via Transmission Pass, Historical Pinal City (Ghost Town) & Apache Tears by Superior.

We typically meet in the GCUMC south parking lot every Tuesday at 8:00am to commute to the trailhead. In regards to inclement weather (colder or warmer), I will tell you via email if we need to meet an hour later, or an hour earlier. Depending where you live, you can also meet right at the trailhead or other prearranged point.

Hikes are interpretive sometimes, teaching one about the desert plants and animals that live here, as well as how to generally survive in the desert. Hikes vary in difficulty and are typically 3—5 miles. Sometimes they are more and can also be as short as 2 hours. Due to travel time, the entire trip may be 5+ hours, this is why I ask hikers not to plan appointments for the day. We hike on established trails—some flat (easy) and some hilly for a medium hiking ability.

I ask that expenses be shared with your driver if you're commuting. I recommend you bring 2□3 liters of water, a snack or lunch, good hiking shoes/boots, layers of clothing, a jacket & gloves (depending on the temperature), a wide hat, sunscreen, and other items you may need, like medications, walking sticks, sunglasses, etc., and a light knapsack to put it all in.
