FROM THE PASTOR: "HAPPY MONEY"

In their book, Happy Money: The Science of Happier Spending, researchers Elizabeth Dunn and Michael Norton provide five principles for what they call "Happy Money." Money can't really buy happiness, but it can bring a lot

more fun into your life if you spend it in the right way and on the right things. Based on their research, here are the five principles of happy money:

Buy experiences, not just things. We can find happiness in experiences and are often disappointed by things, such as dream houses and dream cars.

Make it a treat. Having a house full of chocolate bars is a good way to lose the joy of chocolate, but anticipating a special chocolate treat makes your money go a long way.

Buy time. We are "time poor" people so slow down and avoid expenditures that devour time. Recapture the pleasures lost by living in an all-consuming rush.

Pay now, consume later. Reverse the established order of our consumer society by having the money before you do or buy something, not after.

Invest in others. Whether we give to friends and family or make charitable donations, studies show, most people find more happiness in sharing than spending on themselves.

Isn't it interesting that the researchers found that people found happiness in giving. Many Christians have known this all along. It is why we have a goal of giving 10% of our income back to God. There is joy in being generous. I know some

people are skeptical but I can tell you first hand that it is true. There is joy in learning to give rather than just receiving. If you are skeptical just try it for 3 months and see how you feel.



The Bible teaches us to give a tithe or the first ten percent of what we earn to God and God's work. For some, the giving of the tenth is a goal you are growing toward each year. For others, it is the starting point, and you will give far in excess of this. If you are not yet tithing, consider taking a step toward the tithe this year. Determine your giving in proportion to your income. What percentage will you give? Then set a percentage that you can increase each year until you reach the tithing goal.

At Gold Canyon UMC we don't tell you how much you should give, but our hope is that you are working toward the biblical tithe of ten percent. If you aren't there yet, we hope that you will commit a percentage of your income for 2015 and then increase the amount as you are able in the future until you reach the tithe. I will see you on Sunday



A VISIT TO THE EMERGENCY ROOM: HOW TO GET THE CARE YOU NEED

A recent trip to the emergency room once again opened my eyes to what you need to do before that visit even occurs. It's the first of the year with many goals and resolutions to be made, and this is an important one to add to that list. Make sure you create a FOLDER for yourself and your loved one that needs to include:

- 1) Your name & address
- 2) Your Primary care physician's name, address and telephone number
- 3) Your health insurance information
- 4) A list of all medications, vitamins and supplements you take
- 5) Your Preferred Pharmacy address and telephone number.
- 6) Highlight your ALLERGIES to any medications, significant foods or other chemicals
- 7) Be sure to include copies of any recent lab work results or x-rays & other diagnostic testing you may have had in the past. This will become an ongoing file so you may choose to purchase a hard binder and keep the information in it with dividers.
- 8) Also very important is a copy of your Living Will, Durable Medical and a Mental Power of Attorney (POA) paper.
- 9) Jot down names of any person & their telephone number who need to know that you are going to the hospital-children, friends, your POA if not with you at the time of the occurrence.
- 10) Each year if you have any changes in your Health insurance be sure to call and find out what Hospitals /Emergency Rooms you may go to and write or print it out on a piece of paper and place in the file folder as well. Be sure you know what Specialties those hospitals offer. Do they have a Cardiac wing, do they treat strokes, surgeries, etc.? A Medical Center may not have a Mental Health/Psychiatric ward, and a suicidal patient

- may wait days to be transferred to the appropriate facility without appropriate care.
- 11) Bring some comfort items if you can, like a bottle of water, a book to read, small pillow, and your cell phone with charger, etc.

If serious occurrences, such as chest pain, shortness of breath, severe abdominal pain, a fall or excessive bleeding occurs, it is best handled by calling 9-1-1. This also applies if you are experiencing a sudden change in your health and have underlying chronic conditions, such as heart disease, diabetes, or cancer. They are trained to provide you care within a few minutes, so calling as soon as possible is crucial to a good outcome. You or the person driving could not provide the kind of care you may need. If after the EMT assessment, you are able to be transported by car, they will give you the OK, it's much safer for you and your spouse or friend to let them make that determination. If an ambulance transports you to the ER you should receive immediate care rather than sitting for a prolonged period of time in the waiting room.

You must be clear about the problem and how it is affecting you. Do not down play your symptoms: e.g. "I am having chest pain (use a number 1-10 with 10- being the worst pain) and I have a history of heart disease." Don't exaggerate, but do not down play ANY of your symptoms. Wait times in the ER for less serious incidents can leave you unattended for hours. One situation I read about was very disturbing. A woman was dropped-off or drove herself to the ER with chest pain. The ER staff does not check on you while you are in the waiting room. You should always have someone with you. So establish a relationship with someone who will be willing to be with you if need them.

If at all possible call your doctor before the ambulance arrives. He can then let the ER know you are on your way. This ensures you get prompt attention. Be sure and take an advocate (spouse or friend) with you to the ER to act as a constructive overseer, which is someone who will look out for your best interests. They can describe what has been happening in the home and explain your symptoms. They can also take & manage your folder/binder when questions arise.

Another suggestion that can be very important is that you or your advocate jot down the names of people who interact with you, and what they do. For example: "Nurse Nancy gave me 2 Tylenol @ 6pm." "Joe from the lab came and drew my blood for a CBC, blood glucose and cardiac enzymes." "Dr. Smith, ER physician, arrived and listened to my heart and lungs and ordered tests @ 6:30pm." Keep a running log, as you may need this later after you get home and get the bill.

One last suggestion is to be sure that EVERYONE, including the doctors, nursing staff, and anyone else who touches you, washes their hands and instruments, such as stethoscopes & BP cuffs before use.

My prayer is that none of you need this information, but have it ready to go. Emergencies and accidents unexpected and your preparedness can save your life.

The Food Bank had its busiest year ever in 2014 with a total of 10,173 people served. These people came from 3,210 client families, and were provided with 7,044 bags of food

through your generous donations. Also, with our partnership with the United Food Bank in Mesa, we were able to obtain an additional 47,094 pounds of food — some by purchase and some by donation. As you can imagine, we are not just a little closet Food Bank Mission anymore!

Some of the above information may surprise you, but our Mission continues to grow each year. Recently, we added a new Food Bank Building to the Church Wishlist. This new building is also shown on the Church's future Master Plan. At this time, the Food Bank Mission needs to move forward and is developing a rendering of the new building to help capture the scope of this project, as well as establish a timeline for its construction. A separate line item within the church-designated funds has been created for donations to Missions-

Food Bank Building, and we now have a beginning for this new future of our Mission! We continue to be blessed by our volunteers who serve our clients with a warm heart every day.

GLOBAL MISSIONS

UMC mission work is WORLD-WIDE, INTERNATIONAL, GLOBAL!

GCUMC shares in the ministry of work that reaches around the world through partnership with Advance projects, people, ministries, and emergency relief efforts. The mission work team to Rice and Beans Ministry in San Jose, Costa Rica, gave eight representatives of our congregation the opportunity to interact with local residents as they packed and distributed food bags in the barrio and did cement work, creating sidewalks and retraining walls. Rice and Beans Ministry also distributes Bibles and school uniforms. The uniforms are required for school, so providing them makes education possible for children who receive them. Can you imagine the difference the gift of a school uniform makes in the life of the child and the child's family?

GCUMC Global Missions giving provides funds for Personal Energy Transportation (PET), making mobility and even self-support possible for those who are unable to walk due to injury or disease. The PET device uses upper body strength to power what resembles a wooden adult-size tricycle. These are manufactured in workshops around the U.S. shipped to areas of need around the world.

GCUMC supports Fellowman International in Honduras. This ministry includes both health and agricultural services to people living in a remote mountain area of the country and given in Jesus' name. The agricultural work has improved local nutrition through the growing of crops and sources of protein such as rabbits.

GCUMC has partnered with Universidad Biblica Latinamerica in San Jose, Costa Rica, for several years, sending four different work teams and about twenty-five different individuals to work on construction projects on the campus. We also help support one of the faculty members.

GCUMC supports the denomination-wide Imagine No Malaria project, a united effort to stamp out malaria in this decade through education, medication, and practical measures, especially in Africa. Through the generosity of our people we have given significantly to this mission effort.

Working and giving as the Body of Christ, we reach around the world with the Gospel! Everyone can share in these efforts through prayer and through giving to Global Missions. God bless you for your generosity!

GOLD CANYON UMC RICE & BEANS MISSION—2015

For one week in January, 2015, eight members of the Gold Canyon United Methodist Church (Nancy & Pete Denman, Ruth & Don Dewinter, Caryl & Charlie Lang, Randi Olson, and Rev. Fay Quanstrom) traveled to Costa Rica to partner with the Rice and Beans Ministries mission in that country.

The Rice and Beans Ministries goal is to serve God, to work with local congregations and schools and to distribute food to families in Costa Rica. The photographs on this and the next page were taken during that trip and show just a glimpse of what team members experienced while they were there.





Rice and beans are a staple food of many South and Central American cultures, therefore they give a

perfect avenue to meet many needs for families all across the regions. The food bags consists of 2 kilos each of rice and beans, 1 kilo masa and a bag of powdered milk. Many times the teams add bibles and other things for the children. After giving families the food, team members would pray with them.











SCRIP BUS & VAN FUND



"TODAY"

This past summer we were blessed with the opportunity to spend a couple of weeks with our son and his family in Lexington, KY. Our oldest grandson was graduating high school and it was wonderful to be able to be there. I imagine most of you have been to a high school graduation ceremony, and you can remember listening to the speech or speeches given by the young folks who were the class leaders. Sometimes you may have been a little bored (especially if the student giving the speech wasn't your loved one!), but every now and then one of those youngsters provided a nugget of wisdom that you either hadn't heard in a while, or you had never heard before. In the speech I remember from my grandson's graduation, the young man made the simple statement "Today is a gift, that's why it's called the present." Although I had heard this before, something about the context in which it was given that day stuck with me. I have thought of that phrase often over the past few months.

Sometimes the burdens of a given day can weigh us down and we don't do a very good job of seeing "the present" in the day. We can easily find ourselves focusing on the troubles of days past, or the worries over what is to come, rather than seeing the joy around us and living in today. We have a difficult time accepting that our trials today can, and will, be used for our good and the good of others. AND, many times we forget that God is with us, His hand in ours. Our troubles can make us fearful, leave us feeling weak, and even thinking we are incapable of facing the day. I read a quote once from a book about the old west; it went something like this - "Courage doesn't mean never experiencing fear...being courageous means trying to do the right thing even when you are afraid." What is the right thing? Do we run? Do we hide? Or do we face the challenge? And if so, how?

The "how" is of course the part we can tend to struggle with. It is said very well in 2 Corinthians 4:16-18:

16 That is why we never give up. Though our bodies are dying, our spirits are being renewed every

day. 17 For our present troubles are small and won't last very long. Yet they produce for us a glory that vastly outweighs them and will last forever! 18 So we don't look at the troubles we can see now; rather, we fix our gaze on things that cannot be seen. For the things we see now will soon be gone, but the things we cannot see will last forever.

When we're having a tough day, what does that really mean? The study section of the New Living Translation version of the Bible provides some good food for thought. It says — Our troubles should not diminish our faith or disillusion us. We should realize that there is a purpose in our suffering. Problems and human limitations have several benefits: 1) They remind us of Christ's suffering for us; 2) they keep us from pride; 3) they cause us to look beyond this brief life; 4) they give us opportunities to prove our faith to others; and 5) they give God the opportunity to demonstrate his power. See your troubles as opportunities!

In one of his sermons in mid-January, Pastor Fred conveyed the message "God will meet you where you are." How about we let Him?! This February, pick a day and resolve to live and love in the present – for today is the only today you have. After that, pick another day, and then another...

If you are having a difficult time figuring out how to do that for yourself, remember that God often works through other humans to support us as we move through life. When the choir grew to 25 or more, it became

imperative for the choir to move to the stage of the cafeteria. The congregation was growing Sunday by Sunday, and they needed more seats!

Choir practices were always held in Dave's office, a room the church rented in the first Kings Ranch Road mall. Dave himself did everything — typed and printed the Bulletins, did all the church visiting, followed-up on visitor contacts, etc. He was a lovable fellow, who related well to people of all ages, and enjoyed telling stories and adding creative "twists" to the services. His wife was equally talented in other ways, such as designing and sewing all our first banners and wall hangings. She never failed to be at his side to greet the congregation as he shook hands and gave hugs to children and senior members at the end of each church service.


