FROM THE PASTOR: "A Better Way to Help"

Pauline Knaflich talks of seeing a man in a mall parking lot coming toward her and her daughter. He was waving and calling. He wanted money to buy food.

Pauline handed him some money and asked if they could pray together. He agreed, sat down on the curb, and put the money beside him. Pauline crouched on one knee, placed her hand on his shoulder, and prayed.

As she and her daughter rode home, her daughter said, "Mom, that man was hungry for food, but he was hungrier for attention. I never realized how lonely the homeless must be".

For a fleeting moment, three lives had come into contact, and as a result all three had been renewed.

I give thanks that our church is able to help so many people with food. We help feed those who are hungry by providing food through the Genesis Project in Apache Junction and the Food Bank. From January 1st to June 15th we gave food to 3,766 people through the Food Bank. That's an impressive number of people that we have been able to help through your generosity.

As the number of people drawn to help those in need has grown, we have run into difficulty. Many people are giving gifts specifically to the "Food Bank". Since we honor designated giving, we can only use those funds for food through the Food Bank. We can't use those funds for food at Genesis or any other need someone might have. We can't

use that money to pay rent or utilities so a family might have water or air conditioning. We can't use the money to help an individual get out of an abusive relationship. Our hands are tied to buy only food.

We find it is more helpful when designated gifts are given to the "Local Mission Fund." Then we have the freedom to buy food for the food bank, or pay a utility bill, or keep a family from being evicted. If you want to allow the Local Mission work area to use the funds as they see the needs, then I would encourage you to designate gifts to "Local Missions." If you give using this designation then our church will be able to more effectively deal with the broader needs of those who struggle to find the resources to live.

Thanks for helping those in need.

As you know, June was moved to Legacy Senior Living, 5625 East McKellips in May. Unfortunately, she recently fell and suffered a small fracture in her hip and had to undergo surgery to install three screws.

Thanks again to everyone for your prayers and to those who have dropped-in to visit June. I appreciate the gift of your time when it is impossible to predict whether she will be awake or in her "sleep mode." One thing I have learned over the last two years is that she is way more aware of people and what is going on around her than it appears on the surface. As it is with many people who have Alzheimer's she cannot communicate through speech very well, if at all.

If you would like to visit her, please call me at (602)615-6634 before trying to visit for the first time. When you see her, please do not be hesitant to take hold of her hand when you are talking to her. Even if her eyes are shut, talk as if you know she is hearing you because she is.

Being her caregiver since she was diagnosed with Alzheimer's in 2008 and caring for her at home until she was moved into the care facility in March, 2013, has been graduate level education with a "degree" from the school of hard knocks. I am putting a program together to help other caregivers, especially in the early years, understand dementia better and know how to cope with the changes, care for the person and survive the task. I plan to offer it next Fall. In the meantime, if you are faced with caring for someone with Alzheimer's, feel free to contact me.





MUSIC NOTES

As I am writing this, I am reminded of how beautiful Gold Canyon is in the spring time. Yeah, when you read this we will already have had several 110+days, but so far, as of the first week of

June, we are still in "spring" – mid 90's. For us locals or "year-rounders", "warm" is up to 108, then "hot" to 112, then "very hot" to 120, then "GET OUT OF THE STATE!!!" to 122 – that's the all time record, set June 26, 1990. I came back from my concert tour of Finland the day before, and it was 112 at 9:30 pm! I experienced nearly 100-degree difference within just a few days!

What does this have to do with anything? God has given us weather extremes so we can appreciate the "good" weather that much more. We all have to deal with adversity, and with God's help and grace, we get through it and rejoice when it is over. Now we can look forward to "Fall" weather!

Having said all that, I'm "getting out of the state" a bit early, just in case! Actually, I'm going to watch my daughter, Regina Benton Bower, graduate from Chief Residency in Neurosurgery (a 7-year residency) at Mayo Clinic in Rochester, MN on June 23. Yeah, I am a very proud papa! Of course, I'll also get to spend some "spoiling" time with my two granddaughters, Brooke and Daphne and some "manly" time with sonin-law Mark! And, of course, the weather will be great – in the mid-70's!

Summer time also means that all of you who would like to sing in the Choir only during the summer, now have the opportunity! The Chancel Choir will continue singing through July, then take August off. If you would like to join us, we would love to have you! No audition, just come and sing with us. All we ask is that you can match pitch and read music at least a little, and have a servant's heart as we lead worship with our combined, God-given talent in music. There are very few activities as fulfilling — and fun! — as singing in the Chancel Choir! Come join us. Rehearsals are Thursday evenings from 6:30 — 7:30 in the Music Room.

Of course, there will be special music for the month of August, so if you would like to sing a solo or with an ensemble, call Cindy Hoff, our Assistant Director of Special Music, or call the church office. In August, we still need Anthems and Offertories, plus leading congregational singing.

I hope all of us can see some fireworks on July 4. I always look forward to this! I pray that we all stay safe during that weekend. I will be joining around 1,500 organists from around the western states at a convention in San Diego just prior to the 4th. Included is a very special 100th Anniversary Concert on the Spreckles Organ in Balboa Park! This is a very large 4manual Austin Pipe Organ, and is the largest outdoor pipe organ in the world. It was installed in 1915 and has been played every Sunday afternoon since then, and now they have a Summer Concert Series – free! – every Monday evening. Isabelle Demers, who has played for us twice in concert, will play on July 27, and her teacher, Paul Jacobs, the only organist ever to get an Emmy Award on organ, will play on Aug. 17. Again all the Monday night concerts are free! If you are near San Diego, check it out. More info at Sprecklesorgan.org, click on Get the StopTab for Summer 2015.

We are finalizing the ranks (sets) of pipes we want to add to our Rodgers Organ. I hope to have a design of the case and an approximate cost within the next few months. We have also decided on how we will utilize the Choir Area and have now figured out a way to keep the handbells in back of the Choir and still have the pipes with the electronics behind them, as it should be. The end result will be a much broader sound without the acoustical problems we currently have with the speakers placed where they are now. Overall, it will be softer, yet broader, much more like sense-surround rather than a tight, focused sound. We are getting closer, but still have a way to go. I can't tell you how excited I am about this project - especially now that we have figured out a way to keep the Choir, Handbells and Organ all together in the right configuration! I honestly don't know why I didn't see this a year ago, but I'm very glad we have discovered it now! I will keep you informed. OUR PRAYING CONGREGATION

Prayer Partners are vital to our Prayer Ministry at GCUMC! We pray several times during worship, including the pastoral prayer time when new requests are shared. You may wonder how the prayer list works.

Submitting a Request. At each door in the Sanctuary Building and in the Koinonia Room you will find a lectern with yellow prayer cards. When you have a prayer need, you are invited to submit it by completing the information and placing it in the envelope attached to the lectern. Please provide all the information that you are able to give us. Sunday's requests are read at prayer time during worship and are printed for the two weeks following.


How the List is Organized. The prayer list is edited early in the week with called-in requests added until printing time. A GCUMC ministry and one of the churches on the Central East District are listed each week under Ministries. The requests turned in on Sunday appear under Concerns Added This Week. Condolences are listed for one week. Those receiving cancer treatment or with continuing needs because of cancer appear in the Cancer category. Those in hospice remain in that section unless they ask to be removed. When a person's surgery is past they are moved to Post Surgery. Other Needs, detailed when known, list additional persons for whom prayer has been requested.

Discovering Omissions. If you expect to find a name on the prayer list but don't see it, please submit a prayer card for that person. The pastoral care team follows up with hospital visits and phone calls to the best of their ability when enough information is given. When the day, time, and hospital are given we are much more able to provide pre-surgical prayer and post-surgical visits. Without the necessary information it's very difficult to be helpful.

Using the Prayer List. We all need prayer and prayer support, especially during health, personal, and family crises. Use the prayer list as a marker in your devotion book or Bible. Post it on your refrigerator to encourage your prayer life. Pray for one section of names each day. Make prayer part of your walk with God by using the prayer list regularly.

Being a Prayer Partner. The GCUMC Prayer Partners receive the updated prayer list by email by Tuesday each week. This list includes the "Continuing Concerns" section that is not printed for the bulletin. You are invited to become a

Prayer Partner by letting the office know of your interest and supplying your email address. "More things are wrought by prayer than this world dreams of."

WHERE GLOBAL MISSIONS DOLLARS GO

- Universidad Biblica Lantinoamericana: One of the global missions that GCUMC specifically supports is Universidad Biblica Latinoamericana, located in San Jose, Costa Rica. UBL's theological education program is carried out in 19 centers in fourteen countries. It is widely recognized as a leading centre for theological education in Latin America and the Caribbean, preparing pastors and lay leaders for the growing Christian communities engaged in witness and service throughout the region. Associate, Bachelor and Master's degrees in Biblical and Theological specializations as well as a non-degree program, Biblical Pastoral Institute, are offered. Students normally begin their programs in satellite locations and complete their degrees on the San Jose campus. The University, jointly sponsored by the Methodist and Presbyterian denominations, has become increasingly ecumenical as it seeks to respond to the needs of the growing number of churches sending students to study in this diversified theological setting.
- ➡ Missionary Genilma Boehler: GCUMC also contributes to the support of Genilma Boehler, one of the UBL faculty. She holds several advanced degrees in Theology, including a doctorate from Superior School of Theology, Sao Leopoldo, Brazil. Dr. Boehler is from Brazil and is a member of the Methodist Church.
- Mission Work Teams, Past and Future: In the past five years four Gold Canyon teams of volunteers have worked on the campus of UBL to construct housing and brighten campus spaces by painting and landscaping. Our teams have gained appreciation for the University's ministry and contributed in measurable ways during their time on campus. A mission volunteer brings home precious stories of faculty and student lives, forever enriching the understanding of global missions.

The dates of the 2016 global missions trip are January 9-16. We will be flying to San Jose, Costa Rica and working with Rice and Beans Ministry. Participants will pitch in to help with a construction project in the morning and deliver food bags to needy homes in the afternoons. We will team with Costa Ricans for the work, for meals and for fellowship, making the week a rich and rewarding experience. Each volunteer pays for his/her own airfare (about \$800), room, board, and materials (about \$500). Now is the time to pray about your possible participation and plan for it. 

THE EYES HAVE IT!



Greetings! I trust you are enjoying the great weather we have been having and preparing for the HOT summer ahead. My "focus", as you may remember from May's article, is on Eye Health. I never cease to be amazed as I drive about, how many folk

Health. I never cease to be amazed as I drive about, how many folks of all ages do not wear sunglasses. It's the first thing I put on as I head out the door. I trust after reading

this, you will have a new respect for your sunglasses and gladly wear them. "Eh hem"... Not on the top of your head but on your face protecting those "peepers".

"In a 2012 survey, less than 10,000 Americans polled recognized the health benefits of wearing sunglasses. 27% of them NEVER wear sunglasses." (*1) That will become obvious as you start to look around you when you are out and about. Wearing "sun glasses" or "sun cheaters" ("cheaters" were the American slang for glasses) as they were known in the early 20th century, have come a long way from being "frumpy" to downright glamourous. They can be simple, yet stylish, accessories that will protect those two precious eyes from a host of conditions caused by both UV-A and UV-B Ultraviolet Rays. Buying a \$5.00 pair won't cut it. Sunglasses don't have to cost a lot of money and they can actually make your vision clearer when you are in the sun. So, do your due diligence and find a pair that is going to be the most effective, stylish, and within your budget, so you will be more willing to wear them.

"The Health conditions you can protect yourself AGAINST by wearing sunglasses are as follows: **1# Skin Cancer** - Up to 10% of all skin cancers are found on the eyelid. **2# Cataracts** – the World Health Organization reports that worldwide approximately 900,000 are blind because of cataracts (the cloudiness of the lens of the eye triggered by UV exposure). **3# Macular Degeneration** Over time, the UV light may play a role in damaging the macula lutea (an area of the eye with millions of light sensing cells, which allow us to see fine details clearly), potentially leading to blurriness and vision loss. **4# Ptyergium** - The abnormal growth of tissue also called "surfers eye" may progress slowly from either cornea across the white part of the eye, possibly leading to inflammation or other disturbance in the eye. **#5 Photokeratitis** - essentially a sunburn to the eyes (temporary) caused by being outside, on the water or in a pool. It is very painful causing blurred vision, light sensitivity, and the sensation of having sand in your eyes."(* 2)

May this be the "Wake Up" call you need to go out and purchase a good pair of sunglasses and begin wearing them whenever you are outside, remembering the sun comes out all four seasons! Here's what to look for when shopping for your "Sun Cheaters" that will help keep the sun from robbing you of your ability to see for years to come, which is a worthwhile purchase—no matter what your age. Shop for large lenses that offer good protection from UV-A and UV-B rays. It is these UV radiation rays that can damage your eyes. Also, look for broad temple arms as they are needed to protect against stray light from the sides of your sunglasses. If you wear prescription glasses, a great company, called Cocoons, offers over your glasses protection. These are usually found when you purchase your eye glasses from an optometrist. One place located nearby is Image Eye Care on Idaho Road just south of Broadway on the East side of the road. Pricing seems to be uniform where ever you go, so feel free to check out others, as well. They are less expensive than getting prescription sun glasses.

Look forward to seeing you out and about with your Sunglasses on, protecting the precious gift of sight God gave us.

one person who had their own mindset rejuvenated by focusing on what they can do for others. That is a beautiful thing.

However, I have found myself at varying points in my life, in a position in which I just didn't have the energy to give to others. I had a lot on my plate personally, I was stressed, I didn't have time for one more thing, I was down about things going on in my life, etc. No excuses, just reality.

That reality is, sometimes we can't be compassionate others. until to we are compassionate to ourselves. We need to be aware of where we've come from, where we are today and where we are going from here. That can be easier said than done and every now and then we have to be willing to explore how we got into a difficult position in order to find our way out.

In her book *The Orphan Train*, Christina Baker Kline says "You can't find peace, until you find all the pieces." In context with her story, she was saying that at times what may seem like a random, disconnected series of events (sometimes unhappy) are actually necessary steps in a journey toward self-acceptance and perspective. When we have our own lives in perspective, it's amazing what we can do for others.

If you'd like to be more compassionate with yourself, here's a thought – ask for the company of a Stephen Minister. You might ask how that would help? Well let's consider what a Stephen Minister is...

Stephen Ministers are simply those Christians who have chosen to walk with others through difficult times. They listen to those who need to

sort through a challenging time. They share and help carry some of the burdens that others are finding difficult to carry alone. They help facilitate decision-making when decisions have been hard to make.

Stephen Ministers aren't Pastors, but they are lay ministers with significant training, who often times can help you sort through emotional and spiritual speed bumps in your life. They can't do "it" for you, but they can be there with you.

If you think it's time you were compassionate with yourself, consider asking to spend some time with a Stephen Minister. Maybe their listening ear can help you put some things into perspective, find peace for yourself, and allow you the freedom to direct your compassion toward others.


