FROM THE PASTOR: "LENTEN CONSEQUENCES"

We have entered the season of Lent on the Christian Calendar. Lent is the 40 day period before Easter in which we are encouraged to reflect on our lives and the health of our soul. We are urged to prepare ourselves for Easter. It is typically a season of repentance. Some people even highlight Lent by choosing to give up something.

Deron Smith of Springfield, Missouri wrote of one Lenten season when he described to his three daughters the meaning of Lent. He told them he was giving up desserts until Easter. He then invited them to give up something important for Lent. The two oldest daughters declared that they too would give up sweets like their mom and dad but the youngest daughter who was six years old pondered the question a little longer. session, you will need to meet with Katharine privately to cover the expectations of this ministry, as we continue to seek excellence in all of our ministries. To those who have been through the training, thank you!

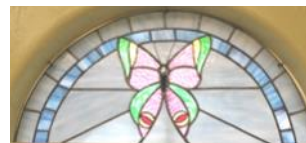

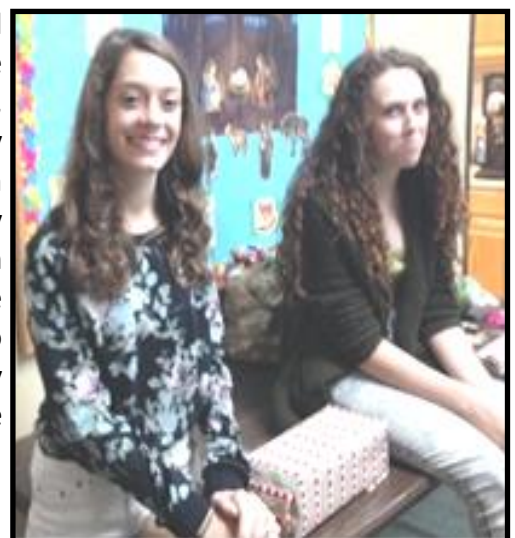


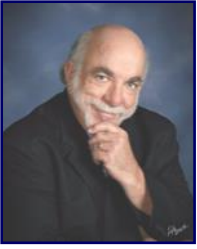

SCRIP BUS & VAN FUND

Did you know Bashas', Albertson's and Fry's help non-profit organizations — like GCUMC — by giving us a rebate on all purchases made when you use their cards **that are obtained from and/or connected to GCUMC**? The money earned helps pay for the church bus and van (gas, licenses, maintenance, insurance, etc.), and we've already raised \$144,000 from these grocery store programs! WATCH OUT FOR HEALTHY FOOD... SOME ARE NOT SO HEALTHY!

As I consider what I should share with you for the month of March, I read an article about the "10 NOT so Healthy types of foods," with the first one being MILK. Many folks do not understand why there is great concern over this one "not so healthy food." We were raised to believe that "Milk does a body good," but researchers of the British Medical Journal found women who drank three (3) cups or more of milk a day had a greater than 90% chance of dying over a 20-year period than women who only drank one(1) cup a day. Surprisingly, they also increased their risk of bone fractures, higher levels of inflammation and oxidative stress all leading to premature aging.

While we do need calcium, the amount of sugar found in the milk can offset the milk's "supposed" value. Cow's milk is often a toxic brew of antibiotics, pesticides and bio-engineered hormones like rBGH, a genetically engineered Bovine Growth Hormone that artificially increases milk production, which has been linked to many cancers, as well as bacteria from their living environment. 55% of the United States formulated antibiotics are fed to livestock. It's no wonder people become allergic to and intolerant of antibiotics especially if they are milk drinkers. Lest you wonder then "How will I get my calcium so I don't get osteoporosis? Humans can get all the calcium they need from a plant-based diet. Sources like almonds, broccoli, figs, leafy green veggies, and sesame seeds can fill in the gap. All are high in calcium, magnesium and potassium, and some will adequately supply Iron, phosphorus, folic acid and even Protein.

What you need to realize is that milk and milk-based products can actually cause your body to become acidic. The blood pH scale goes from 0-14, the body functions optimally at 7.35-7.45. If it's less than 7.3 you are acidic but if it's greater than 7.4 you are alkaline. It is when you are acidic that your calcium is leached from your bones creating Osteoporosis. It also sets you up for chronic

inflammation which acidity creates and leads to arthritis and debilitating diseases as diverse as atherosclerosis, heart valve dysfunction, congestive heart failure, Alzheimer's disease and even cancer. So it is not something to be taken lightly.

Reputable scientific journals like Journal of Nutrition and The American Journal of Epidemiology support all these findings. It was quoted in one of the research articles that "The only research supporting consumption of dairy products to prevent osteoporosis were brought by the National Dairy Council itself." Also sad to say "milk is fattening." According to the Harvard School of Public Health, 3 cups/day adds 300 calories a day and in just about 11 days or about a third of a month you have consumed about 1 pound of calories — or 1 pound of fat. Even worse is the fact that millions of Americans and 75% of the World are lactose intolerant and don't even know it—yet. Despite having a variety of unpleasant digestive issues and sometimes respiratory issues, such as increased mucus production, they may not associate it with the lactose in milk. You get the picture. This information applies to children and adults. It's no wonder we have so many children with digestive issues, cancers and other diseases that could be prevented by stopping dairy cow milk intake.

If you are someone who would be lost without their milk, consider the wonderful world of milk substitutes like almond, rice, coconut, hemp and cashew milk—any of which can be used like milk and you may develop a real taste for one of these. Be sure to read the labels. Some are high in calories due to added sugar. My current personal favorite is Almond Breeze Almond Milk "Vanilla flavored" without sugar and it is only a whopping 30 calories for an 8 ounce glass. I was pleasantly surprised by the taste. Also, I recently found that Walmart and other stores now have their own brand but read the labels and compare. A plus to having a milk substitute is that you are protecting your body from serious harm of exposure to unnecessary antibiotics, hormones and pesticides, so you will be less likely to develop inflammatory diseases such as arthritis, cancer, degenerative diseases and more. Your immune system will thank you by protecting

you. Remember, too our bodies are God's temple we should be willing to handle it with care by making good food choices for ourselves and our families.

What do you know about PETs?

The PET project is one of the missions supported by GCUMC Global Missions. Personal Energy Transportation serves those who cannot walk due to diabetes, leprosy, polio, land mines, crocodiles, or birth defects by making self-transport possible. Over 21,000,000 people in the world crawl rather than walk because of physical limitations.

The PET is hand-cranked, which has proven successful in most field locations. Its wheelbarrow wheels and solid rubber tires provide good service. The PET has a front-wheel brake with a simple parking brake. The PET is limited to the muscle power of the driver, whose strength improves with use. A person using the device moves about the speed of a fast walk and can go where ordinary wheelchairs won't, although it is not an all terrain vehicle.

The PET is designed for the third world. It is simple, sturdy, and low cost (about \$250 each). Maintenance is minimal. Certified PET workshops where the devices are built operate around the US, with Columbia, MO being the first shop location and headquarters. Other workshop locations are Minneapolis, East Jewett, NY, Murfreesboro, TN, Tamp, FL, Spokane WA, Holland MI, Penney Farms, FL, and Luling, TX. After the PETs are built they are shipped to world areas of need where distribution is coordinated by missionaries and charitable aid workers. Over 49,000 PETs have been built and sent to over 85 different countries! You can see a PET in the vestibule of the Education Building.

“TODAY”

During a prayer time in worship on a recent Sunday, Rev. Joel Hurley interjected some humor in relation to what he hears quite often as he visits those who are ill, and it really stuck with me. He shared that he often hears something like “It’s tough getting old!” And he sometimes answers with something along the lines of “Yes, but the good news is...it doesn’t last for long...”!

He got quite a chuckle from the congregation, but I think there is truly a deeper message to be taken from that. The reality is, we are here on earth for but a moment. We are born, mature, live, work, raise families, play, love, cry, give, grow old, and have eternal life with our Creator to look forward to. Every now and then along our path of life we notice that time is flying; we might wonder if we will get to do all that we want, if we will eventually have all the “things” that we want, if we will have all the time with our loved ones that we need.

Our earthly presence here is so fleeting, do we make the best of it? When we move on will we be remembered for what we acquired and obtained – homes, cars, flashy clothes, exotic trips? Or will we be remembered for who we truly were (ARE!), what we gave of ourselves, who we made laugh, or how we shared with others?

Those seem like some good questions to ponder as we move into this new year of committing ourselves to Christ. Recently, we once again explored the topic of “Stewardship”, and were asked to examine ourselves for what we could give to our church, it’s ministries, and the community of Christ. This is not only a financial question, it is a critical question about what we can give of ourselves to others. It’s about finding the time, wearing a smile, offering a kind word, opening a car door, providing a hug, simply having a conversation, doing what needs doing. If you don’t do it now, when will you?

If you haven’t heard a relatively new country song titled Trailer Hitch, by artist Kristian Bush, I really encourage you to pull it up on your computer and listen to it.

The key lyric in the chorus is:

*“You can’t take it with you when you go
Never seen a hearse with a trailer hitch...”*

Next, he adds:

*“It ain’t about what you’re driving
Or about the dough you’re piling
The less I have to worry about
The more time I have for smiling”*

Now aren’t those last two lines a poignant reminder? If the song sounds a little silly to you, try listening to the whole thing. The song is in the country genre, but has an extra jazzy, acoustic sound. And, the point he makes is intensely thought-provoking. Put a little thought into how you can give - of yourself, of your “things”, and of your soul. What will leave you with less worry and time for smiling?

If you have always wanted to volunteer for a ministry, do it! If you have always thought about visiting that neighbor, do it! If you have always thought about starting your own ministry, do it! The “ifs” are infinite so get started - after all, we’re not really here that long.

Sometimes we can all have difficulty releasing our worry and finding our smile. 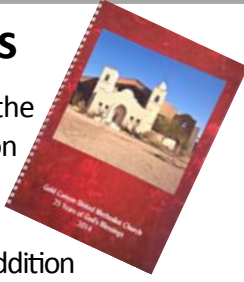

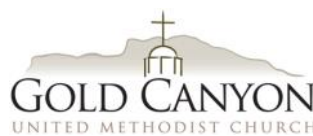
