## FROM THE PASTOR: "GARDENING WITH GOD"

During the past month Salt River Project has been replacing the underground power lines that

connect our church to the power grid. It seems that the original installation which was done 20 years ago was faulty. In preparation for one of the planned power outages, I made sure to turn off all computers, air conditioners, and copiers in the Sanctuary building so a power surge wouldn't burn out our equipment. This means almost all the power surge protectors were turned off.

This caused some inconvenience when my wife Beth tried to use a church computer the next morning and the monitor wouldn't turn on. She came and asked me if I knew what the problem was. I went to the computer and found the power bar was off. It was disconnected from the source of power. With a flick of a switch, the monitor had power and could do its work. It's obvious that computers and other equipment need to be plugged into power to run.

Jesus says the same thing about us. "I am the true vine, and my Father is the vinegrower." If we wish to live a fulfilled life we have to remain connected with God. We need to abide with God. A leaf or grape can't grow on its own but must remain connected to a source of power. If a leaf becomes disconnected from the branch it will die. Jesus knew that we too wither when we don't stay connected to God. So how do we abide with God? How do we remain connected?

During a four-week series on "Gardening with God" we will take a look at how we remain connected. We will look at ways to strengthen our connection with God so that we might bear spiritual fruit. I will see you Sunday.


A good time is already being had at the Country Western service at 5 PM on Sundays—it will only get better as November arrives.

## FOR THE GRACE OF GOD GO I

During one of Pastor Fred's sermons in late September, he talked about grace. Although I don't recall for sure whom he quoted, he repeated the below thoughts on the topic:

> Justice is getting what you deserve; Mercy is not getting what you deserve; Grace is getting better than you deserve.

Those three sentences are pretty powerful. Especially that part about getting better than what we deserve.

I had the opportunity recently to visit southern California, and spend a couple of evenings walking on the beach by myself. The sunsets were beautiful and I was able to spend some time in quiet reflection. Looking off into the distance at something as vast as the ocean, my mind always goes directly to God and of all of His creations.

On this particular trip I found myself thinking about something not so good, happening to someone I knew. I said to myself, "But for the grace of God go I." I realized that I have used that phrase quite a bit in my life, often when I am thinking about something stupid I almost did but thankfully didn't, something bad that didn't happen to me but easily could have, etc.

And then an even stronger realization hit me — to view it that way, I have actually been insinuating that God picks and chooses those to whom he affords grace. That can't be further from the truth. I was there, here, at whatever point I am in my life at any given time, because of the grace of God...For the Grace of God!

Funny the way our minds work. God gives us much, much more grace than we deserve, yet for some reason we are often not graceful enough to accept it.



Recently a "fortune" cookie made me laugh; it was really more of a saying than a fortune – "A

clear conscience is usually the sign of a bad memory."

Now that about sums it up. We all have things in our memories from the past that we have a hard time forgetting. God provides us grace, but we often won't get out of our own way. Wherever we go, whatever we do, whatever circumstances we experience, for the grace of God go we.

It's hard to believe it's November. But as this Thanksgiving approaches, I am vowing to take the word "but" out of that common phrase, and to be more mindful of thankfulness for every aspect of my life.

Fall is upon us, and with it comes the beginning of the Holidays... and often, HOLIDAYS=STRESS. Because stress often leads to disease, it's a good topic for this time of year. Unfortunately, when you add the everyday stress that people have to holiday stress,



bigger medical problems than just colds or flu can set into motion. Diseases affected by

stress include heart disease, Alzheimer's, diabetes, depression, headaches, gastrointestinal problems and even asthma. According to Dr. Jay Winner, founder and director of the Stress Reduction Program for the Sansum Clinic in Santa Barbara, CA, "Stress not only makes us feel awful emotionally, but can exacerbate just about any health condition you can think of." When we are stressed, the body releases stress hormones, such as adrenaline and cortisol. Elevated cortisol levels impair the immune function and make it harder to fight off infections, including cold and flu viruses.

It's important to consider how you can break the stress cycle in your life, which can vary for individuals, but there are some commonalities. Our thoughts and feelings definitely affect the amount of stress we experience. According to Joyce Meyer in her book <u>Living Beyond your Feelings</u>, "God has given us free will and this truth is that our thoughts and feelings cannot rule us if we don't let them, but most people do not know that." Our thoughts prepare us for action—good or bad—and we do have the authority to choose our thoughts rather than go with whatever comes to mind. So by learning to recognize the thoughts and feelings about the upcoming holidays, we can shift them and break the stress cycle before it starts. A few tips to having a better Holiday season are:

- 1) Accept the way things are—Mindfulness means being aware and keeping yourself in the current moment without judging. Thoughts will ebb and flow and you do not have to believe them. Usually thoughts are just opinions.
- 2) Look Up/Find a reset point—The cluttered, overwhelmed or exhausted mind needs a bit of fresh air. According to Larissa Hall Carlson, the dean of the Kripalu School of Yoga and Health in Stockbridge Massachusetts "Just a few minutes of sky gazing can provide the mind with the space it needs to refresh and reset. Find a comfortable place to sit or lie down and look up." Meditating on a short phrase of scripture can be soothing, as well. (Be Still, Gods Peace, etc.)
- 3) Massage your ears—Dean L. Carlson says it stimulates the same stress-reducing energy points used in acupuncture. Just close your eyes and take a few deep breaths. Now firmly rub, tug and massage your ears for one to three minutes and relax your jaw and shoulders.
- 4) **Practice Gratitude**—Counting the things you feel grateful for, writing them down in a journal or on your calendar is very helpful. Check out <a href="https://www.Happier.com">www.Happier.com</a>.
- 5) **Set limits on technology**—Would you believe people check their email 15 times or more per day? Those who reduced it to 3-5 times daily reduced their stress levels and over all tension. Unfortunately, folks equate busyness as a sign of productivity and rest as a sign of laziness. However, taking time to rest actually can ease the sense of being overwhelmed making you more effective and give the brain time to make connections that provide insights into ways to spark creativity and find solutions.
- 6) **Take a walk**—Research shows that taking a refreshing walk outdoors supports bone health, improves cognition and enhances mental well-being.

Reducing stress using these 6 steps also helps slow the rate at which our cells grow old, "a 2004 study published in the Proceedings of National Academy of Sciences of the United States of America showed that telomeres (a part of the chromosome that protects genetic data) in the cells of chronically stressed women had the equivalent of an additional decade of aging" ~ C. Fiedler June, 2015.

Hopefully, a few or all of these steps can help you create a less stressful holiday season by changing your thoughts and actions and improving your overall health as well.

#### FOOD BANK

Have you ever wondered what goes into an emergency Food Bank bag? The Food Bank has recently changed methods that we use determine what food and other items are given to our clients. We give food

based on family size, inventory availability and special requests. Currently we pre-pack food bags for three levels of clients .:

- Our "Basic" bag is for 1-2 individuals, then we have a "Family" bag which is for 3-5 family members.
- Our newest bag is called the "Large Family" bag and is for 6 and up family members.

**FAMILY BAG** 3 To 5 Family Members (Middle Shelf)

- First Bag Pre-Pack
  1 Box Cereal or Oatmeal, (4 small packs)
  1 Jar Peanut Butter, and 1 Jelly or Jam (ALL)

- Cans Fruit or Applesauce
   Sleeves of Saltines or other crackers
   Bottle Juice or 4 Individual Boxes
- 2 Can Beans (baked, pinto, black)

- 2 Canned Tomato product 4 packs Ramen 1 Bag Dry beans and 1 bag rice 2 Roll Toilet Paper, paper towels if available
- 1 Bar Soap, (shampoo, lotion, toothpaste, brush if requested)

#### Second Bag Pre-Pack

- 4 Canned Vegetables, provide variety 2 Small and 1large soup (mix varieties)
- 1 Pound Spaghetti or other Pasta Product
- large Jar or Can Spaghetti Sauce or 2 small 2 Side Dishes of Rice, Pasta, Potato, Noodle, Stew or Chili 1 Small cans and 1 large can Tuna or other meat/fish 1 Helper to match above (ex. tuna/tuna helper) 2 Mac & Cheese

#### **Client Arrival**

- Frozen Meat (Approx. 2 to 2 1/2 pounds)
- 2 Loaf of bread or packages Rolls or Bagels 2 Misc. products and 1 baking product 1 Package Sweet Treats, doughnuts or cake (size appropriate) 24 Diapers (n/b 2), 18 diapers (3-6) other items as available
- Provide only 1 bag dog food and/or 1 cat Food if Pet is indicated

If you were to analyze a "Family" bag, you would first find out it is actually two full paper bags additional plus items such as dog food, hygiene items, frozen meat, bread and a sweet, such as container of cupcakes.

The contents are designed to address

a balanced set of meals that would last from 3-4 days. The retail value of this emergency distribution is approximately \$105.63. Clients are allowed to come to our Food Bank twice a month. This I'm sure helps you understand the importance and value of your donations. The "Basic" bag is obviously less and the "Large Family" bag is more. With this level of giving we are shopping for our inventory twice a week. The number of "Families" receiving an emergency food supply through September of this year was 2,280. That number represents feeding 7,230 individuals. Thank you all for helping to support this mission!

"To the Gold Canyon United Methodist Church,

Let me start off by saying thank you. Thank you for getting me back on my feet and for the confidence I needed to have a successful life.

When I first met Colette, my son and I were sleeping in my car so I could save enough money to get into a home. I was stressed and to the point of giving up then the church got us a room at a motel. I was so grateful to be able to give my son a bath and to take a shower. (You never realize the small things

like that really make your day.) Then I met with Colette and she told me the church wanted to help me get into a home and pay for daycare so I could save money. I cried from tears of relief. I never ask for help so when help came to me I felt like a boulder was off my shoulders for once.

The church helped me with many things like a deposit on the mobile home I rent, getting out of a \$400 a month lease car payment because I have a bad credit rating and it was the only way I could have a car to get to work. They also helped me buy clothes for a new job, taught me how to make a budget and how to look forward.

The people I have met from the church went with me to solve the problems or met with me to talk me through it. They have not just become my friends, they have become family. Without the first day meeting I don't know if I would have come this far. I don't know where my son and I would be.

I have a home for my son, and the guidance and the happiness that I have needed for a very long time. So for that I am extremely grateful for all that you have done. Thank you."


