### From The Pastor: "North Parking Lot Open"

The newly paved north parking lot is now open! By the time you read this article some of you will have parked in it. As of the creation of

this newsletter, the landscaping and striping still had to be completed as you can see in the photograph.



I want to say a big thank you to those who donated and supported the project. We received about \$160,000 in special gifts to offset the project. The balance of the cost of the parking lot was rolled into our Building Fund Loan. This was possible because in January of 2013 we were able to refinance our Sanctuary Building loan so that our monthly payments dropped significantly. As a result of the savings, we determined we could add a little more to the loan to finance the repair of the south lot and pave the north lot. Any future donations to our Building Fund will repay the loan on the Sanctuary and the parking lot.

The design of the new lot will change some traffic patterns on Sunday. Pinal County required us to

close one of our entrances and create a new one on the far north end. So, before you turn please make sure the entrance you always used still exists or you may find yourself in the landscape instead of in the parking lot.

#### **MIDWEEK PROGRAM FOR CHILDREN**

Our exciting and fun-filled mid-week program for boys and girls kindergarten through sixth grade resumes on <u>Wednesdays</u>, <u>beginning September 17<sup>th</sup></u>. It runs every Wednesday – except for breaks – from 4:30 pm to 6 pm.



Pioneer Clubs is a Christ-centered relationship-oriented program with participative learning. At each meeting there is Bible exploration, Bible memory, skill-building activities, games and service projects. The students earn badges for their "work". Dinner is also served. **CONGREGATIONAL CARE MINISTRY (CCM) TRAINING** ~ This three-hour survey of the basics of congregational care (formal and information opportunities for laity, do's and don'ts, praying with those one visits, conversation tips, using Scripture and music, legal considerations) is offered twice each year. Those who take this training have opportunities to sit with those waiting during surgery, the bereaved, first-time visitors and others. **Will meet Wednesday, September 17 from 1 – 4 pm in Room 101/102.** 

**DISCIPLE 4** ~ **Under The Tree of Life -The Writings, John, and Revelation.** This 32-week curriculum covers Hebrew Bible narratives, as well as Poetry and Wisdom, the Gospel of John and the Book of Revelation. **Pre-requisite: DISCIPLE I. Will meet Mondays from 1 − 3 pm in Room 101/102.** Facilitator − Fay. **Begins Monday, September 29** − May. Cost: \$35 for workbook.



**EMOTIONAL WELLNESS: Overcoming depression and anxiety through proven non-pharmaceutical means** ~ This class combines video and live presentations with the intro-

duction of a new depression-fighting practice each week. Participants use personal accountability and evaluation systems to track weekly improvement. Pertinent Scriptures are also part of the curriculum. Although this is not a support group, there is opportunity for sharing and encouragement of one another. **Will meet Mondays 3:30 – 5 pm in Room 101/102**. Facilitator – Fay. **Runs 7 weeks beginning September 29**. Cost: \$10

**THE FEASTS OF ISRAEL** ~ This class studies the major Feasts celebrated by the Jewish people for millennia. Learning origins and meaning will help you appreciate the Jewish faith. Understanding how the symbolism of the Feasts if fulfilled in Christ will enrich your faith and deepen your appreciation for the Jewish heritage of Christianity. **Will meet Thursdays, two different times — 9-11 am and 3-5 pm in Room 101/102 for six weeks beginning October 2.** Facilitator — Fay. Cost: \$10

**JESUS IN THE GOSPELS** ~ This study looks closely at the Gospel texts. The focus requires attention to detail. Differences in the first three Gospels will be used to detect some aspect of what each Gospel writer wants to highlight about Jesus. The Gospel of John will be examined at the end of the study. **Prerequisite: DISCIPLE I. Will meet Wednesdays from 5 – 7:30 pm in Room 101/102.** Facilitators: Duane and Sue Vorseth. **Starting Oct. 8 – May.** Cost: \$35 for workbook.

**SPIRITUAL GROWTH THROUGH JOURNALING** ~ This class encourages spiritual growth by providing a variety of approaches for encountering God through writing. We will discuss and practice getting started with journaling, using journaling as a spiritual discipline and moving toward personalized insights. Your writing will not be evaluated; sharing will be voluntary. Bring a notebook, Bible and pen or pencil. **Runs 6 weeks with two options to meet: Tuesdays 1 – 2:30 pm in 101/102 beginning September 2 or Wednesdays, beginning September 3, 9-10:30 am at the Starbucks on the Trail in AJ. Facilitator – Fay. Cost: \$10.**

Fay Quanstrom will be teaching diverse adult classes and small groups over the course of this year - Congregational Care, DISCIPLE 4, The Feasts of Israel, and Emotional Wellness, to name a few. 














#### "Stitches Unlimited" or Quilts for St Andrews Clinic

I know these are the "hot dog" days of summer. Kids are getting back to school and there is not much to do but to stay in where it is cool and quilt. Anyway, that is what I do. **Our thanks to all of you who have been quilting at home and bringing in completed quit tops.** We have a good supply and the October trip to St. Andrews is right around the

corner. However, we can always use more and there is always a need for your quilts.

We have been working all summer. We meet on the last Tuesday of the month from 9 until about 2. We have been bringing our lunches and work as long as we can. There is fabric to sort and cut into quilt kits, binding to be cut and sewn together, quilt kits to be put together, quilt tops to sew, toiletry bags to sew and ironing of fabric. Even if you don't sew and would like to help out, we would love to have you join us.

Our quilts are usually no bigger than 40X60 so they can be easily quilted on a domestic sewing machine. We do simple quilting designs such as stich in the ditch, simple meander or "X" the squares. These are good quilts on which to practice your skills.

We also gladly take donations of fabric: cotton, flannel, denim, light weight corduroy, seersucker and fleece in solids and kid friendly prints. Any size pieces are great. Donations of any quilts and crocheted afghans are also welcome. Remember Matthew 25:40: 'The King will reply, "I tell you the truth, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers of mine, you did for me".



#### **Electronic Funds Transfer (EFT)**

Save time, simplify your life, and support our church! In this new millennium the church is keeping up with the times by offering our givers an easier way to support our ministries. Our electronic contribution program is an automatic funds transfer program that will allow you to make contributions without having to lift a pen to write a check or reach into your wallet for cash! *Here's how it works*: you authorize a specific amount of money to be electronically transferred directly from your checking or savings account to the church's account. You can also specify the frequency of the transfer to allow you to keep your check register up to date.

It is fast, safe, and easy! In fact, it is less risky than checks, as it cannot be lost, stolen, or destroyed in the mail, and the rate of accuracy is high. The electronic transfer will cost you NOTH-ING and you save the cost of the check. The church will issue you a donation statement for your records, and bank statements will provide you with a record of transfer as additional proof of your contributions. Donations via electronic transfer can be allocated to our General Fund, Building Fund, Missions, Youth or the Pastor's Discretionary Fund. Of course you can cancel vour authorization of transfer at any time by notifying us in writing. #### **Struggling with Depression?**



Depression can be a room engulfed in flames and you can't breathe for the sooty smoke smothering you — and suicide is deciding there is no way but to jump straight out of the burning building. You think a desperate lunge from the flames and the land of the living seems the lesser of

two unbearables. That's what you're thinking — that if you'd do yourself in you'd be doing everyone a favor. You don't try to kill yourself because death's appealing - but because life's agonizing.

It's crazy how the stigma around mental health can drive you right insane.

Our Bible says Jesus said, "It is not those who are healthy who need a doctor, but those who are sick." Jesus came for the sick, not for the smug. Jesus came as Doctor and He makes miracles happen through medicine. When the church isn't for the suffering, then the Church isn't for Christ. The Jesus I know never preached some Health Prosperity Gospel, some pseudo-good news that if you just pray well, sing well, worship well, live well and deposit all that into some Divine ATM you get to take home a mind and body that are well.

The real Jesus turns to our questions of why, why this sickness, who is to blame, and he says it like a caress to the aching, "You're asking the wrong question. You're looking for someone to blame. There is no such cause-effect here." (John 9:3 The Message)..."This happened so the power of God could be seen in him." (John 9:5 NLT).

Depression. I want us to turn to the hurting, to each other, and promise it till we're hoarse: "We won't give you some cliché - but something to cling to - and that will mean our hands. We won't give you some platitudes - but some place for your pain - and that will mean our time. We won't give you some excuses - but we'll be some example - and that will mean bending down and washing your wounds. Wounds that we don't understand, wounds that keep festering, but wounds that can never make us turn away.

Because we are the Body of the Wounded Healer and we are the people who believe the impossible - that wounds can be openings to God. There's no shame in saying that your heart and head are broken because there's a Doctor in the house. It's the wisest and the bravest who cry for help when lost.

If only we know what fire every person is facing - there isn't one person we wouldn't help fight their fire with the heat of a greater love. Light can pry through the dark. A shaft can come through a window like a lifeline. Our God bares His scars and reaches through the fire to grab us, "Come - escape into Me." Excerpted from the writings of Ann Voskamp

#### Genesis Project, Homeless & Other Needs





Fellowman International, an international mission project that GCUMC supports, is gardening for God. By producing vegetables and making them available to the local population, nutrition is improved, hunger is alleviated, and intensive productivity is demonstrated for outlying communities to replicate. Produce raised at the mission in Honduras provides food for local needy situations, while some is sold locally and some is transported to the city to be sold commercially. The indigenous staff is working with two former staff members who had fallen into destructive habits, reaching out to them with a high-accountability program that included employment opportunity. These men painted the FMI building, restoring its role as a lighthouse to the community, while restoring the men themselves to a place of dignity and productivity.

#### The Happiest Place on Earth

Have you ever been to Disneyland? And, even if you haven't, have you heard the slogan used to describe it — *The Happiest Place on Earth*? My husband and I were recently blessed with the opportunity to take our 19 year old son and a buddy of his to Disneyland the week before they went back to college. Since the "kids" with us are adults now, (well, basically) we had a blast. We were on the same page with what we wanted to do and ran from ride to ride, enjoying every minute...and that included the "*food rides*"! We slept in each morning, closed down the park each night, enjoyed the fireworks and, in general, loved every minute.

However, if you've been to the park, you might recognize this scenario:

The park opens early in the morning and is packed with parents in Mickey Mouse ears, pushing strollers and pulling toddlers by the hands to see Pooh Bear and all their friends. The children are giggling, happy, eating candy or chocolate covered pineapple for breakfast and posing for pictures. Mom and dad are picturing what the photo album will look like and can't wait to forward pictures to family and talk about the trip for years to come. Then, about 3, 4 or 5 in the afternoon that picture changes a tad. Those same little ones are redfaced from the sun, in tears from fatigue and no naps being dragged from 60-90 minute line to line, and sugar overload. Some families are arguing and at times it's hard to decide who might be unhappiest, the children or the adults. My youngest son was 3 1/2 years old on his first trip (also my first visit, so I was in awe as well!) so I remember a similar day as described above, until we learned how to pace ourselves.

How is it that one can be unhappy, grumpy, snippy, or miserable while in "the happiest place on earth?" It's a hard thing to figure. But, when you look at it from the broad view of our lives and our humanness, you can see how it happens. Relatively speaking, we are uncomfortable at a given time, so become 'unhappy'.

Now let's look at another scenario...the day in the

life of a visitor to the GCUMC Food Bank. (Although somewhat hypothetical, this scenario is a very real depiction):

A 63 year old woman awoke one day to the realization that she was without a job for the first time in her adult life and her only means of income was a \$100/month Social Security check. She learned of the food bank and called the church for directions, 3 times, because she continually became lost. When she finally arrived, she was in tears, out of embarrassment at having to ask for assistance such as this as well as sheer relief that she had not been in an accident while at one point going the wrong way on the freeway to get here! Her trials in getting here had her arriving almost an hour past food bank closing time. Thankfully the food bank volunteer had stayed waiting for her arrival and was able to fulfill her needs. For that woman, that day, was one she would ultimately call a success...a good day...one for which she was grateful.

These two stories tell us that life is all about **perspective**. However, sometimes it's difficult for us to maintain a balanced perspective on our own lives. Sometimes having an unbiased, outside viewpoint to help us sort through what we are dealing with can help. A fellow Christian who can listen, and be a sounding board as you work to keep your perspective in balance, just might be the answer. If you think a non-judgmental and confidential ear might be helpful as you wrestle with a challenge, or if you think you might like to be a part of the Stephen Ministry team at GCUMC, just check the box beside "desire a Stephen Minister" on the Sunday morning attendance pad, or contact our Stephen Leaders through the church at 480-982-3776, churchofoffice or fice@goldcanyonumc.org.
