

From The Pastor: "Acts of God"



events. The label implies that God caused them. I think they are just a natural occurrence of the earth. The weather causes damaging winds and the shifting plates below the surface cause earthquakes. So I think a better description of those events is "natural disasters." So what is an "Act of God?"

Craig Groeschel in his book, The Christian Atheist, wrote of the difference the little things can make. He said that when he was a new believer, he always wore a tiny cross pin on his shirt. Because they were an inexpensive way to witness, he would purchase a dozen or so at a time. Every time someone commented on the pin, he would give it to them as a gift. Once in a 7-11 convenience store, the female clerk complimented his cross pin; instinctively, he offered it to her. For several moments she tried to refuse the gift, reluctantly she accepted the pin.

Years went by, and Craig had almost forgotten about the 7-11 clerk. After church one week, a woman stopped him in the lobby and said she had to thank him. Trembling as she spoke, she explained, "You probably don't remember me, but years ago you gave me this." She reached into her purse and pulled out the small cross pin. "When you offered me this cross, my life couldn't have been any worse. I didn't feel worthy of such a generous gift. But God showed me that he still loved me. My life is different today because of what you did for me." Craig said his small gift was almost nothing. But to someone else it meant almost everything.

I would call Craig's gift an "Act of God." An "Act of God" happens when someone is nudged by God to help someone who has been a victim of a natural disaster or who is in need. An "Act of God" is born when someone becomes the hands and feet of God. Imagine the healing that would take place in this world if we became more intentional about creating "Acts of God".

Our next sermon series will explore how our world could become a better place if we saw "Acts of God" as those times when we help others.






Substitute Sunday School Teachers Sought ~

This Walk is a spiritual life retreat of the highest quality for adults. At Emmaus you will spend three busy but very enjoyable days in a retreat setting from Thursday evening to Sunday evening. You will live and study together singing, praying, discussing, and worshiping. Discussions center around fifteen presentations given by laity and clergy addressing the theme of God's grace: how that grace is real in your life; how you can live in the life of grace, and bring grace to others.

The above phrase has oft been said, and it causes one to think. The September 1st, 2012 edition of "*The Upper Room*" speaks to this:

The Narrow Path - "I live in a village at one side of the beautiful River Clyde. Since I was a child, I have been amazed by the narrowing of the river at low tide. When the sandbanks and mudflats become a magnet for birds, it seems perfectly feasible that we should be able to walk or swim across to the other side. However, this appearance is deceptive because the river has a deadly deep, narrow channel that allows ships to pass between Glasgow and the Lower Clyde. Only the captains of those vessels know exactly where to steer in order to stay afloat, because of strategically placed buoys.

We can be taken in by appearances and activities

that seem like a good idea but actually take us into danger. Life is often as deceptive as the river. We are easily deceived when we rely on our own judgment. Only God can see the bigger picture and steer us in the safest direction. The channel is marked out for us by the wisdom of the Bible. The way becomes clear to us as we pray and walk daily with God. How reassuring that God knows the way." The question is: Are we willing to listen and to follow God's guidance? (Rosemary Gemmell-Renfrewshire, Scotland)

GCUMC Permanent Endowment Fund

The Gold Canyon United Methodist Church has a Permanent Endowment Fund which was established several years ago. Did you know that it is possible to make a difference in the ministry of GCUMC even after you are gone? Gifts to the GCUMC Permanent Endowment Fund are invested and in turn only the gains are used to further the missions and ministries of the Church. The principal of the gift is held in perpetuity. This is a wonderful way for any donor to make a difference for many years into the future. The Permanent Endowment Committee has designated the income to be used for Buildings and Property; Scholarships, especially for those entering the ministry; Missions; and Undesignated. Undesignated can mean that a donor may select where he or she wishes the income to be used or leave it up to the Committee to decide. There is a generous donor who has given gifts over the past few years to the Endowment Fund, which were specifically given for the income to be used for scholarships which the church has in turn given to various members.

The Permanent Endowment can become a strong supporter of the Church and its missions, but only if members and others of the congregation remember the Fund with gifts at any time or with estate bequests of any size. SCRIP/BUS FUND ~

Did you know?????..... Over the past ten years, at no cost to participants, the church bus fund has earned over \$104,000 from the Scrip program (\$86,000 from Bashas', \$18,000 from Fry's). This is fantastic!! This money was used to purchase our bus and pay for gas, insurance and maintenance. No w that we need to purchase a fifteen passenger van to accompany our bus we are asking all of you who shop at these two stores to consider using a Bashas' Community Support card and/or Fry's Gift card purchased at the church Information Center on Sunday mornings or at the church office during the week. Each card starts with \$20, \$50 or \$100, and you recharge it as often as necessary just before you check out at the store (or at Customer Service), using your personal charge card, a check or cash; then use the card to pay for your purchases, and you can even use it for gas at Fry's! Bashas' gives the church 6% of every dollar you load onto the card, Fry's 3%. Bashas' cards are honored at Bashas' grocery stores, A.J.'s Fine Foods and Food City. Fry's cards are accepted at Fry's grocery stores, Fry's Marketplace, and all other Kroger-owned stores throughout the US. Many of you in the past only used the "number program" at Bashas' which was a separate program - this program was discontinued about two years ago due to economic conditions. International Missions Update – September 2012

Last month we shared a letter from Lisa Armstrong, mission director of Fellow Man International in Honduras describing the current situation in Honduras. Lisa continues to serve the mission from her home base in Chanute, Kansas, as the dangers remain the same in Honduras. She is still able to have coffee beans shipped to the United States and provide Green Parrot coffee to churches as she has done in the past. Decaffeinated Green Parrot coffee will also be available this year! We will begin sales of Green Parrot and other Fair Trade products in October.

Gold Canyon UMC is pleased to once again send a mission team to Universidad Biblioteca Latinoamerica (UBL) in Costa Rica, in January 2013. This team will continue work done earlier this year and further strengthen relationships with this mission. Additionally, GCUMC is providing support to Becky Harrell, United Methodist missionary at UBL.

In an effort to raise needed funds for this mission trip, as well as support Becky in her work, the Global Missions team will be selling hand crafted wooden crosses starting in October. The creators of these crosses, Wally Quanstrom and Harry Warren, are members of the Global Missions Team and mission team to Costa Rica. The workmanship in these 18" high by 12" wide crosses is exquisite. Original design crosses will be sold for \$30.00. Custom made (special requests for particular scriptures or other wording) crosses are also available for \$40.00. RIGHT CHOICES

Having watched many of the Olympic events, I thought you might enjoy knowing some facts about the numerous <u>right choices</u> of one of the famous U.S. athletes in history: <u>Wilma Rudolph.</u> Wilma set incredible records at a young age, but how she got there makes all her accomplishments amazing.

She was a premature 4 1/2 lbs at birth, and spent her childhood in bed with double pneumonia, scarlet fever, polio, whooping cough, measles, and chicken pox.

Metal leg braces came next, and Wilma was always trying to get them off. Her extended family of 22 children had to serve as "lookouts", reporting if Wilma took off her braces. That extended family also massaged those legs every day.

In high school, Wilma played basketball for coach C.C. Gray and scored the state record of 49 points in a game. Then Tennessee State coach, Ed Temple, began a girls track team. Wilma loved the daily college practices during high school as much as the dedication of the unpaid coach, Temple. He drove the team members in his car, and had the track cared for at his own expense.

Coach's discipline required running an extra lap for every minute they were late to practice. On one occasion, Wilma's sleeping in 30 minutes caused her to run 30 extra laps. Next time, she was 30 minutes early!

Fame followed Wilma Rudolph and she inspired many up and coming female athletes. They felt they could call her at home, even as she was simultaneously raising four kids of her own, working as a track coach for Indiana's DePauw University, and serving as U.S. goodwill ambassador to French West Africa.

Wilma said her greatest accomplishment was creating the not-for-profit, community-based amateur sports program. She reminded others "to be yourself and have confidence in yourself and triumph cannot be had without the struggle."

Thinking Theologically —

I recently started reading a new devotional book called *Jesus Calling: Enjoying Peace In His Presence* by Sarah Young. If you've never read it before, I highly suggest it, especially for busy people who don't have a lot of time to read long, daily devotional readings. Now, I have to admit, I don't read from this devotional every day – I do have several others that I like to read as well – but the thing I like about this one is that it feels like Jesus is talking directly to me...and that's very comforting, especially on days like today.

Over the last several months I've been experiencing a lot of physical pain in my right foot. About two years ago I had surgery on one of my toes which hasn't really healed to my satisfaction, and which I believe has caused yet another ailment in that foot: a nasty case of plantar fasciitis. My foot is in pain almost all the time...and like many who don't like to go to

the doctor, I've endured the pain rather than being assertive about seeking help to get rid of it. I finally broke down and went to a new podiatrist, who referred me for physical therapy, and it seems to be getting better... slowly. But it certainly makes me wonder: if I had been more assertive about getting help for my foot, would I have had to endure so much pain for so long?

Well, interestingly, that's what the devotional for today was about in my *Jesus Calling* book. Here's what it said:

I am a God who heals. I heal broken bodies, broken minds, broken hearts, broken lives, and broken relationships. My very Presence has immense healing powers. You cannot live close to Me without experiencing some degree of healing. However, it is also true *that you have not because you ask not*. You receive the healing that flows naturally from My Presence, whether you seek it or not. But there is more – much more – available to those who ask." (*Jesus Calling*, Thomas Nelson Publishers, 2004; pg. 243)

Sometimes I think we think things are going to be OK if we just take a "wait and see" attitude. When we don't feel physically well, we wait and see if our bodies will heal themselves so we can get back to our normal routines. When our relationships aren't going well, we wait and see, and hope things will get better between us. We spend so much time waiting and seeing, that we waste a lot of time being in pain and wallowing in our brokenness. It's part of who we are as humans. What we need to do instead is seek healing. We need to ask for help from medical professionals who are trained to help us feel physically better or professional counselors who can help us with our broken relationships. But we also need to seek help from Jesus, whether our aches and pains are because of physical ailments, relationship problems, or spiritual brokenness. "You do not have because you do not ask God." (James 4:2b)

Perhaps we all need to do a better job of asking for help from the One who heals...God bless.

STEPHEN MINISTRY

When my children were younger, going places with them was often a harrowing experience. You see, as a single parent, my time with my children was limited, and often all three would vie for my attention in a big way. My eldest was the child who teachers declared "does not have an indoor voice". She read at 4th grade level in kindergarten and wanted to endlessly talk to me about the books she read. My son, the "baby" of the family, has Asperger's Syndrome, an autism spectrum disorder which is characterized by differences in perception of the world, an inability to recognize social cues, obsession with specific subiects, and "one-sided verbosity". My poor middle child is guiet and creative in more concrete ways (she taught herself to crochet by watching videos, and now sells her products when she can). Imagine this: I am walking through a store parking lot, surrounded by my children. On one side, my eldest is talking to me about school or a book. On the other side, my son is telling me about the intricacies of the various Pokémon evolutions, of which there are hundreds, and he knows every single one of them. Running from behind me is my middle child, quietly but insistently calling me because she also has something to tell me but cannot get her words into the already word-filled bubble. That is what was like - when my children were young, I travelled in a bubble of noise.

I may have looked like I had it together on the outside, but internally I felt like a terrible mom because I

couldn't spend more time with each child.. I was exhausted by the demand for my time and my attention. I needed help. This was a time when I needed a Stephen Minister. I needed someone to sit with and pray with me. I needed someone to provide a good, strong, faithful shoulder. Someone I could trust to keep my tears private. I needed someone who loved God and loved me simply because I was also a child of God.

This is what Stephen Ministers do. If you are overwhelmed by the demands of real life in the real world, a Stephen Minister can provide a safe oasis. You can tell them anything. You can ask them to pray, or you can ask them to just sit with you quietly for an hour. You can ask them to have a cup of coffee and listen to you share the things you need to get off your chest. It doesn't have to be a crisis. If it is, a Stephen Minister can provide a safe place to decompress. However, even if you just feel you need time with a friend who has no preconceived ideas about you and your situation, a Stephen Minister can help.

If you feel you need a Stephen Minister to help you through the tough times, please contact the church office at 480-982-3776 and let us know. We will connect you with the Stephen Ministry coordinator.
