

days his family had gathered around him to give support to him and each other. They knew death was around the corner. They also knew that the words their husband or father spoke were precious and to be heard. When a person knows they are dying it is a time to ask for forgiveness or to give forgiveness. It is a time to talk about what happens to us after this life. It is a time to laugh and to cry. It is also a time to say goodbye. The words spoken during the last days are important and say a lot about the person.

During this Lenten season we will look at the seven last phrases Jesus spoke when he was dying on the cross. It was hard to speak during crucifixion. That's why Jesus spoke very little during this time. But the words he did speak are very important in understanding Jesus and certainly important to our Christian faith. We know that during Jesus' final hours he thought to forgive. He made arrangements for the care of his mother. He wrestled with the pain. And he finally committed his spirit. These thoughts were important to Jesus.

I hope you will join us on Sunday mornings as we seek to unpack these words and apply them to our lives. And when we come to the last Sunday of March we will have a joyous Easter celebration that reminds us that the cross was not the end. March 31st will be a day of celebration!

has already begun making exciting plans.


So save the dates: **June 17 – 21.**

Join us in Cornville, AZ for a weekend where we will enjoy time with other women and with God. When you participate in a weekend like this,


there is some Bible study, some quiet time, and lots of fun!



ed Methodist Church in Mesa. They make sleeping bags for the homeless. They are made from blankets, bed spreads, sheets, curtains, and any other material that might be thrown away, but can be sewn together to make a warm sleeping bag. They have been doing this for almost 20 years and to date have made 14,360 sleeping bags for men, women, and children. Gold Canyon UMC has given out 97 of these home-made sleeping bags over the last four years.

During cold weather there is an on-going demand for these bags. You can help us by donating blankets, bed spreads, sheets or other large pieces of fabric to the church that will be pieced together to keep someone warm on a cold night here in the valley. Men's ties are also needed. Four ties are sewn to each sleeping bag and used to tie the bag after it is rolled up. This is another way to give our ties and offerings!

Thank you so much for all your wonderful donations to help us continue making sleeping bags. This will allow us to provide warm comfort for our homeless brethren.

Organ duties will be split between myself and Dr. Mark Ramsey from Mesa First Presbyterian Church. This is one of the most profound expressions of Christ's passion and death ever created with music. From the opening Introduction, ". . . was there ever sorrow like unto my sorrow?" to the deep, deep love Christ had for us expressed in his last phrases, to the horrific pain and abuse he suffered at the hands of those seeking to rid the world of him, to the great storm and earthquake at His death, and finally the beautiful "Adoration of the Christ" at the end, this profoundly moving work will set your heart and spirit up for the incredible joy of Easter! Keep in mind, If Christ doesn't die, there is no resurrection! Come and experience the good and evil of Good Friday and then the ecstasy of Easter - and all that both mean to us as Christians!

Finally, our annual trek to Organ Stop Pizza will be on Wednesday, March 20 at 11:00 am. Healthy Living

News from the Health and Wellness Ministry of Susan Malloy, Parish Nurse Wishing You a Healthy 2013!

March has arrived ...do you feel like time is racing by....I sure do! Wonderful to see that the GCUMC Citrus pickers are back in action and know the Food Bank clients get to enjoy fresh citrus, as it is such a treat. I am keeping my promise (from the February Article) to provide you further information on how to reduce Inflammation in the body. Inflammation can start as a spark then become an internal, raging fire causing many diseases and untimely deaths.

Such diseases include all forms of arthritis (Osteo, rheumatoid and psoriatic) gout, bladder infections, liver disease, fibromyalgia, lupus, heart disease and even cancer. So, it is important to take note of what YOU can do to put out the spark, to help prevent you from becoming the next one diagnosed with a disease from which you will suffer greatly and require painfully hard work to get under control.

One way you can diminish inflammation is to eat good, healthy food including vegetables and fruit. I am going to focus on fruit and more specifically, CITRUS Fruit (Oranges, Lemons, Limes, Mandarin, Tangerines, Clementine's, Tangelos, Kumquat, Pummelo, and Grapefruit). These edible fruits belong to the family of RUTACEASE. The pulp of citrus fruit is juicy and these fruits can be eaten either by simply peeling off the skin or squeezed to make juice. To get the MOST benefit from your CITRUS fruit eat it whole (SLICED OR CUT UP IS FINE) not juiced. The natural sugars in fruit are intensified when juicing, raising your blood sugar more than when eating the fibrous parts of the citrus fruit.

Citrus fruits are rich in Vitamin C (ascorbic acid). It is important for the health and preservation of your teeth and gums. Vitamin C is also a great detoxifier of the blood removing chemicals and toxins that we ingest, breathe in and apply to our skin daily. Not only are the citrus fruits delicious and refreshing but they have anti-cancer properties, called flavonoids, which inhibit the growth of cancer cells and help prevent the spread of tumors. Ingestion of a sufficient amount on a consistent basis helps lower blood pressure, reduces cancer and heart disease risk. Citrus fruit is also essential in boosting our immune system. So go enjoy your fresh Citrus Fruit...2-3 daily servings of all types of fruit is a very healthy thing to do.

***If you are taking medication(s), Please do not eat grapefruit until you have cleared it with your pharmacist, physician or contact me at 480-390-1496 if you have questions.

Recently, it has become apparent that Grapefruit may turn more drugs deadly. Yes, you read it right DEADLY! So if you plan to jumpstart your day with a glass of grapefruit juice or eat a half of grapefruit, BE VERY CAREFUL. CHECK THE DRUGS YOU ARE TAKING TO ASSURE THEIR INTERACTION WITH GRAPEFRUIT WILL NOT CREATE A LIFE THREATENING SITUATION.

The information I obtained came from NBC News 2012

and WebMD 2005 and their research found that there are "now 26 new drugs, in the past four years, bringing the total to 43, that can cause serious harm when mixed with grapefruit." A lead author, Dr David Bailey, a clinical pharmacologist, on the study from Lawson Health Institute Research Center in London, Ontario (CANADA) stated, "More than 85 drugs interact with whole grapefruit, grapefruit concentrate or fresh grapefruit juice had been identified, though not all have serious consequences. Those that do, however, cause problems that include ACUTE KIDNEY FAILURE, RESPIRATORY FAILURE, and GASTRIC BLEEDING AND WORSE. He further stated that "When I say DEATH, I am not being sensational." (He stated there are 13 drugs that can prove fatal when mixed with grapefruit). This serious potential for harm includes a variety of different types of drugs in the following categories: Anti-Cancer Agents, Anti-Diabetic Agents, Anti-Infective Agents, Anti-Inflammatory Agents, Anti-Lipemic Agents, Cardiovascular Agents, CNS Agents, Estrogens, Gastrointestinal Agents, Immunosuppressant Agents and Urinary Tract Agents.

So PLEASE check your medical regimen and get the facts before you eat or drink GRAPEFRUIT. Timing is irrelevant - whether you consume it hours before or after ingesting the medication. It was also noted that even Seville oranges, used in orange marmalade, can trigger deleterious effects. The range of ages affected are those from age 45 to seniors older than 70. It was also noted that since the first announcement of this until now the "consumption of grapefruit has decreased from 0.44 gallons of juice per person in 2000 to 0.15 gallons per person in 2011 according to figures from the Florida Department of Citrus".

A few examples Researchers found of common drugs affected by grapefruit: LIPITOR and grapefruit can cause rhabdomyolysis (a breakdown of muscle tissue leaving you weak and incapable of standing upright, even destroying your muscle tissue to the point of death). Drinking just a cup of grapefruit (especially juice for three (3) days in a row), causes a 330% increase in concentration of the medication. Grapefruit and a heart drug, dronedarone, or MULTAQ can cause a rare form of ventricular tachycardia or rapid heart rhythm. Mixing a prescription painkiller, oxycodone with grapefruit can cause serious breathing problems which could prove fatal in someone who has lung disease.

I hope this information will be helpful as you become your own Health Advocate and learn your medication names and dosages and if they apply to the Grapefruit OFF LIMITS group. My GOAL is to EDUCATE YOU, NOT SCARE YOU OR SENSATIONALIZE THIS INFORMATION.

Electronic Funds Transfer (EFT)

Save time, simplify your life, and support our church! In this new millennium the church is keeping up with the times by offering our givers a

new way to support our ministries. Our new electronic contribution program is an automatic funds transfer program that will allow you to make contributions without having to lift a pen to write a check or reach into your wallet for cash!

Here is how it works: you authorize a specified amount of money to be electronically transferred directly from your checking or savings account to the church's account. You can also specify the frequency of the transfer to allow you to keep your check register up to date.

It is fast, safe, and easy! In fact, it is less risky than checks, as it cannot be lost, stolen, or destroyed in the mail, and the rate of accuracy is high. The electronic transfer will cost you NOTH-ING and you save the cost of the check. The church will issue you a donation statement for your records, and bank statements will provide you with a record of transfer as additional proof of your contributions. Donations via electronic transfer can be made to our general fund and/or our building fund. Designations to Missions or the Pastors Discretionary Fund can also be made. Of course you can cancel your authorization of transfer at any time by

notifying us in writing. We believe that once you have enjoyed the convenience and savings of this new program, you won't want to go back. Contact the church office now.

OUR CARING CONGREGATION

Life can sometimes be messy and painful. Whether we're dealing with relationship issues, health concerns, facing our own mortality, or grieving the loss of a loved one, we all experience feelings of anger, guilt, fear, frustration, sadness, and grief at one time or another. When our lives are filled with pain and messiness, we often think we can deal with these feelings ourselves — or at least we think we should. Sadly, we're usually wrong when we think we can handle our feelings alone.

We need God's presence in our lives. When we give our problems to God through prayer, many times we will feel relieved of the burdens that have caused us to feel so bad. God is always present with us, especially when we pray. But sometimes we need to experience God's presence in a different way: through the care and concern offered by professional Pastoral Caregivers on staff, one of our Stephen Ministers, or through our Congregational Care Ministry team.

As a Caring Congregation, we want to help each other when times get tough and life gets messy. When you contact us, we will do our best to connect you with the person who can help you the most, whether you're dealing with a crisis, or simply need someone to listen and share your burdens.

We invite you to call upon us in your time of need, either by contacting Jody Topping, our Director of Pastoral Care, or by filling out one of the Pastoral Care Communication Cards located in the Sanctuary and in the church office. We're here to walk alongside you as you deal with the pain and the messiness of life.

PASTORAL CARE FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS


(Over the next several months, we will answer some of the questions you may have about Pastoral & Congregational Care. If you have a question you would like us to answer, please send it by email to Jody Topping (jody@goldcanyonumc.org) or drop it off in the church office or in the offering plate on Sunday.)

Q: When can or should I request Pastoral Care? A: Sometimes we are unsure whether or not it's OK to ask for a pastoral caregiver or Stephen Minister. Sometimes we think the problem we're dealing with isn't big enough or important enough to involve one of the pastors, or we think the pastoral care staff won't be interested in what's going on in our lives. Both of these assumptions are false. Any problem, situation, illness, injury, can be shared with a member of the pastoral staff, a Stephen Minister, or a Congregational Care Minister. Depending on the scope of your situation, we will provide you with an appropriate caregiver from one of these groups who will walk alongside you as long as necessary. So when should you ask for Pastoral Care? When you're sick and in need of prayer, when you're in the hospital and would like to receive a visit, when you're waiting while your loved one is in surgery, when you're sad, when you're grieving...in other words: whenever you need spiritual support, regardless of the situation.

Q: Do I have to be a member of the congregation at GCUMC to receive pastoral care?

A: No, you do not have to be a member, or even a regular attender to receive pastoral care from one of our caregivers. You can even refer a friend or family member who has never been to worship at GCUMC to us for pastoral care. As members of the body of Christ, we care for all, regardless of their membership status.

Q: Are the things I tell my caregiver kept confidential?

A: Absolutely. Both professional and volunteer caregivers are required to maintain confidentiality. Anything you tell us will be between you and your caregiver—unless of course the caregiver thinks you may harm yourself or someone else. Then we are bound by law to report that information to authorities.

Q: Our congregation is so big; surely you won't have time to meet with me and offer me pastoral care, will you?

A: Our desire is to make sure everyone who wants to meet with a pastoral caregiver has the opportunity to do so. That's why we've developed a team approach to providing pastoral care. We're not too busy to meet with you, but sometimes it may take us a little while to contact you. If this happens and you need care sooner rather than later, please contact our Director of Pastoral Care, Jody Topping on her cell phone at 480-766-9272.

ARE YOU IN NEED OF PASTORAL CARE?

If so, please call our Director of Pastoral Care, Jody Topping at the church office (480-982-3776) or on her cell phone (480-766-9272). Our Pastoral Care team is available to visit and pray with you no matter what the reason. If you would like to receive prayer prior to surgery, please call and let us know when and where the surgery is taking place. We will also wait with your loved ones during your surgery if desired. If you or your loved one is hospitalized, let us know so we can visit and offer prayer support. And if you're dealing with the death of a loved one or a crisis in your life, please call us so we can walk that journey together. No matter what the reason, we're here to help.

(The following is an excerpt from The Caring Congregation: How to Become One and Why It Matters, by Rev. Karen Lampe, Executive Pastor of Congregational Care at The United Methodist Church of the Resurrection, Leawood, Kansas.)

In the United Methodist tradition, anointing with oil offers an opportunity for spiritual healing affirmed by Scripture in James 5:13-15. This prayer of faith says "Is any one of you in trouble? He should pray. Is anyone happy? Let him sing songs of praise. Is any one of you sick? He should call the elders of the church to pray over him and anoint him with oil in the name of the Lord. And the prayer offered in faith will make the sick person well; the Lord will raise him up" (NIV).

The United Methodist Book of Worship notes that "anointing the forehead with oil is a sign act invoking the healing love of God. The oil points beyond itself and those doing the anointing to the action of the Holy Spirit and the presence of the healing Christ, who is God's Anointed One."

Anointing gives the opportunity for spiritual healing, which is a wholeness of body, mind, and spirit....Anointing offers healing and not curing, being made whole in the love of Christ.



At Gold Canyon United Methodist Church, any of our professional pastoral care staff, Stephen Ministers, and Congregational Care ministers are available to anoint you or your loved ones. Please contact us if/when you would like to be anointed.



Missing the Mark

Not one of us who walk this earth in our humble, human forms hasn't experienced some pain or loss related to another. We may read an article or book, view a movie or video, or be audience to a speaker telling us that "it's not the experience or what has happened to you that is important, it is how you deal with that experience...and who you are coming out on the other side of that experience... attitude is everything..." - or, some other variation of the same ilk. If you were confronted with those words of wisdom at a time when things weren't going particularly well, it's possible that although you knew some of the advice might be true, your response (at least in your head!) was something like "yea buddy, right, easy for you to say, you don't know what I'm dealing with...or...that's all fine and good mam, but how exactly do you do that, huh, tell me that?!" And even if your verbal or internal response was not something that dramatically negative, at the very least you might still have walked away from the message at a loss for where to go next.

Many times the "another" at whose hands we experience pain or loss, is none other than ourselves. It's one thing to talk about forgiveness, and to practice it with others, but often times the one whom we can't seem to "let off the hook" for some past action or inaction is ourselves. It is easy to dwell on poor decisions or a wrong turn taken, especially if we have impacted the lives of others and have regrets. We may have immense anger at others for their sins against us, but also carry immense guilt regarding our own sins.

Is it possible we are not entirely in tune with what the term "sin" means in the Bible? Do we have so many variations of our own for the word, that in essence we are "putting words in God's mouth" as we interpret verses using the word? And if we do that, do we really know what God is telling us? Let's take a

look at it - there are several Greek words from which the word "sin" is derived, as used in the Bible, each one having a different shade of meaning. Boiled down to its simplest, the word "sin" in our scriptures comes from a classical Greek word meaning "to miss the mark". For the most part in our lives, we are aiming for God's best, and we simply miss it!


In Ephesians 1:7 Paul says "He is so rich in kindness and grace that he purchased our freedom with the blood of his Son and forgave our sins." Christ's death on the cross points to two very powerful truths - redemption and forgiveness. Through that act, God showered his kindness on us - that kindness called "grace". If God has forgiven us for all our sins, why then, can we find it so difficult to "let ourselves off the hook"? Often, the one sin that acts as the greatest obstacle to our freedom is a very simple one that we don't even recognize as such – we think that our past is too overwhelming for God to do anything about! God believes in us and forgives us, and shows us his grace no matter where or how we "miss the mark". We just need to ask. Our inability to see this can happen because we feel alone, we don't believe we have others whom we can trust with our embarrassing or blemished thoughts or history, we feel as if we are the only ones experiencing our particular circumstance, or for many other personal reasons.

If you find yourself in this place, consider taking a walk with a *confidential* companion who will listen, and provide you with Christian support down the path to losing some of what weighs you down. If you would like a Stephen Minister referral, check the box in the Sunday morning attendance book in your row, or call the church office at 480-982-3776 and ask for Kim.

"Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a huge crowd of witnesses to the life of faith, let us strip off every weight that slows us down, especially the sin that so easily trips us up. And let us run with endurance the race God has set before us." ~ Hebrews 12:1 (NLT)

We would like to extend our appreciation

to those of you who attended our annual Global Missions Brunch/Program in February. We are grateful for your gifts designated for our Global Missions projects, as well as donations for our local Food Bank. Those in attendance were treated to a wonderful multimedia presentation from the Costa Rica mission team, and reflections from team members. Inspired by the passion and commitment of those presenting, twenty-one attendees have indicated an early interest in being members of the 2014 mission



trip to Costa Rica. If you have the desire to stretch your faith further by getting involved in the mission trip, please contact Fay or Wally Quanstrom. The mission trip is scheduled for January 10-17, 2014.

Last month we briefly introduced the Imagine No Malaria campaign, an endeavor of the people of The United Methodist Church, along with several global partners. The goal of this campaign is to bring an end to malaria in Africa by 2015.

Desert Southwest Conference Bishop Hoshibata has committed \$2 million toward the \$75 million goal The United Methodist Church has set for the fight against malaria. We at Gold Canyon UMC have made a commitment to contribute \$26,000 to be raised by June 2014.

How will this global campaign be accomplished? Nothing But Nets was the first step, but the Imagine No Malaria campaign takes this much further. First and foremost, the UMC will work in full partnership with communities in Africa, **empowering people** to be part of the solution.

The United Methodist Church has been in Africa

for **160** years. Combining this experience and know-how in Africa will be the first part of the plan to work against malaria. The comprehensive model is divided into four main parts: prevention, treatment, education and communication.

Additionally, the UMC is putting in place a system of accountability. By establishing health boards in Africa, these groups will be held responsible for stewardship of our donations and results, putting funds to work with a plan that creates malaria programs that truly serve the needs of their local communities. Once established and trained, these boards will be eligible to receive a lot more funding from our partners, like The Global Fund, to Fight Malaria.

We will kick-off our campaign on Easter Sunday with detailed information about the project, and you will have an opportunity to make an initial gift. We look forward to being part of this global effort over the next 15 months.

Fair Trade coffee, tea and chocolate are available for purchase between worship services on Sundays. Every purchase you make contributes to people and missions around the world.

2014 Global Missions Work Team

The 2014 Global Missions work team is forming now. We

plan to return to Universidad Biblica Latinamerica, San Jose, Costa Rica, to continue building on the four-year housing project at the school. By the middle of summer 2013 the four homes that we helped to build on our first two trips will be rented. The rent will go toward scholarships at UBL. Phase two of the project is the construction of four modest four-plexes for student family housing.

The dates for the 2014 trip are January 10-17. Each participant is responsible for his/her own airfare to Costa Rica and room and board while in country. Donations through the Christmas Eve offering have provided the cost of materials for the week's work, \$350 per person, so each individual's cost is \$1500 or less. Thinking Theologically with Jody Topping—



"I have told you these things so you may have peace in Me. In the world you will have much trouble. But take hope! I have power over the world!" (John 16:33, NLV)

Today was one of those days!! I woke up early - before 5am - and although I really wasn't ready to get out of bed, I knew if I didn't, I would be sorry. I had a list of things to do a mile long, and I also wanted to visit with some church members who were in the hospital, so I rolled out of bed and stumbled into the shower, hoping my husband would follow my lead and go out to the kitchen to make coffee. He did... and by the time I got out of the shower, my cup of java was waiting for me next to the sink! As I dried my hair and got dressed for the day, I couldn't help myself: my brain was working overtime, mentally going over my list of things to do. By the time I hit the road, heading toward my first hospital visit of the day, I realized my soul was not at peace. I was already stressed out...and it was only 8:30 in the morning! I knew if I didn't do something about my stress level, my head would probably explode. So I took a few deep breaths as I got on the freeway, turned my CD player to some soothing music, and asked God to bring peace to my troubled soul.

It's too bad I was driving; otherwise I could have turned to my Bible for comfort and peace of mind. Take, for example, the passage quoted above. Just before Jesus said these words, he told the Disciples he was going to die. He told them they could expect to be ridiculed and persecuted by those who did not believe in Jesus as the Son of God, and he tried to reassure

them that everything would be OK. I imagine, though, the Disciples were pretty stressed out about this whole turn of events. The person they believed - no, they knew to be the savior of the world was about to leave them. They didn't quite understand the how's, the why's or even the when's of this event, but they knew it was going to happen because Jesus said so. And the last thing this news brought them was peace of mind. So Jesus says he has told them these things not to stress them out, but to give them peace through him. Jesus knew the Disciples would have a hard time once he was gone...but he also knew that as long as they held on to him and his love for them, they would be fine. Don't worry!! I'm in control, Jesus says in essence. Everything is going to work out just fine...trust me.

Jesus also knows that the events of this world - the things we have to deal with every day - stress us out. He knows about our worries and our fears, our busy schedules and the traffic jams that threaten to knock our schedules out of kilter. Jesus knows about the inconveniences of life that make us anxious and stress us out. And Jesus responds by reminding us through Scripture that everything is going to be OK...that Jesus is in control, as long as we trust in him, in his power and his love. Jesus is in control, even when we feel like our lives are not. When we turn our troubles over to Jesus, we can be assured that we will find peace and comfort through him. I'm so glad that Jesus is in control of my life. Now, if I can just remember that the next time I feel like my life is spiraling out of control...God bless.

Life after Loss Reaches a Milestone


Bob Deits' book, *Life after Loss*, will reach the 25th anniversary of the first publishing in April.

Permanent Endowment Fund

Benjamin Franklin said something like this, "The only things for certain are death and taxes." One can make many observations and arguments about this but the basic point is sound, that all humanity has certain things in common and not living forever is one of them. Therefore, it follows that everything we have will sometime in the future belong to someone or something else. Therefore the real question is "will we determine what will happen to our possessions, or will it just happen?"

During my brief tenure as chairman of your permanent endowment committee, I have learned a bit of how GCUMC functions and how we relate to our Desert Southwest United Methodist Conference. One of the resources we have available is the Desert Southwest United Methodist Foundation, DSWUMF. The DSWUMF has financial planning capabilities that it would be very difficult for a local church to match, and I wanted to share with you some of these. These capabilities can facilitate some creative decisions for you and your family, and possibly save some taxes as well.

Let's look at just a few in the immediate gifts category. You could donate your home or real property to our church and receive an immediate tax deduction, and avoid capital gains taxes. You could designate the church as the beneficiary or owner of an insurance policy as a future gift to the church. You could make a retained real estate gift, where you designate the ownership of your home to the church while continuing to occupy it for your lifetime.

There are several other ways in this category including gifting appreciated securities which avoids capital gains taxes and earns an income tax deduction.

Deferred gifts include having a bequest in your will, a living trust, and a charitable gift annuity. With a charitable gift annuity you can enter into a contract with the DSWUMF, and the DSWUMF pays your designated annuitant a regular fixed payment for life, and then distributes the remainder to your church. There are certain tax benefits to this as well.


Life income gifts include Charitable Remainder Trusts, providing fixed income for your lifetime, Charitable Remainder Unitrust, a hedge against inflation, and a Charitable Lead Trust that can reduce gift and estate taxes.

Many of the aforementioned are complex and of course must be accomplished in compliance with all tax regulations. This is what the DSWUMF can help you do. If any of this sounds like it would work for you, please contact the Pastor in the Church Office or Wally Quanstrom, Chairman of the Permanent Endowment Committee, at 630-309-3298. One last thing - you can designate your gift for any purpose within the mission of our church that you would like. There is no charge for consultation.
