FEAR, FOOLISHNESS & FAITH

We have a new abbreviation in our vocabulary – Covid19. The words may have been abbreviated, but the pandemic is not likely to end soon. How shall we respond as Christians during this time? I suggest that there are three possible responses among others: fear, foolishness or faith.

Fear is a gift from God that helps us to protect ourselves either through flight or fight; it is not, then, in and of itself evil. We are told in Scripture to fear God, which does not mean that we are to cringe in terror before Him but to show Him the ultimate respect He deserves; this is why we pray "Hallowed be thy name." In these words, we are showing due reverence for our God who is Holy – unique and unlike any other.

However, fear can also be debilitating when we allow it to rule us. Paul wrote to his protégé Timothy, a young pastor facing the kinds of issues practically all pastors face. After encouraging him to remain strong, Paul said, "For God has not given us a spirit of fear and timidity, but of power, love, and self-discipline" (2 Timothy 1:7, NLT). In other words, in difficult situations we are not to cling to fear and become immobilized and terrorized. Many are, unfortunately, imprisoned by fear in the face of the current situation which we have rarely faced in contemporary times.

Others reportedly are responding foolishly, believing they are somehow invincible and will not contract the virus because they are young, healthy or over confident claiming a faith that will shield them from all harm. Do you remember when Satan tempted Jesus? At one point during this encounter Satan taunted Jesus by encouraging Him to throw

Himself from the pinnacle of the Temple to prove that He was the Son of God. Satan even quoted Scripture about God's protection noting that the angels would protect him miraculously from any harm (Psalm 91:11). Jesus responded by also quoting the Old Testament namely, Deut. 6:16 which warns us not to put God to the test. In other words, our faith can be strong and resilient, but we should also remember that we are not to act unwisely.

In the current situation, we are not to act foolishly against the counsel of health officials. Failure to practice safety guidelines such as social distancing (which some have now termed social respect), staying at home as much as possible and sanitizing our hands frequently is not robust faith, it is acting unwisely. Remember Paul told Timothy that God has given us a sound mind. We need, therefore, to be intelligent in our responses to this and other threats we may face.

In the end, as Christians we are called to respond in faith. That is, we have unshakable confidence in the Lord of the universe. We believe that He will provide guidance, wisdom and help during these troubled times. We believe that His goodness, grace and generosity will see us through whatever we may face as a globe, a nation and individuals. This gives us courage and as Paul noted in his words to Timothy, the power to remain inwardly peaceful and also to do good in the midst of stressful times. Not only can we then practice safety but keep social connections through electronic means, worship online, earnestly pray, and where we can, be of service to others near us. Especially if we are healthy, we can use that blessing to bless others by running errands, working in a food bank or checking on others who are ill or isolated. Technology offers us many opportunities to reach out and interact with others while reducing any risks. Again as Paul noted to Timothy, we are called to love.

Covid19 is not a reason to fear or to act foolishly but a call to faith, prayer and service. It is an opportunity to learn the deeper meaning of Paul's words to Timothy regarding fear, power, love and service.

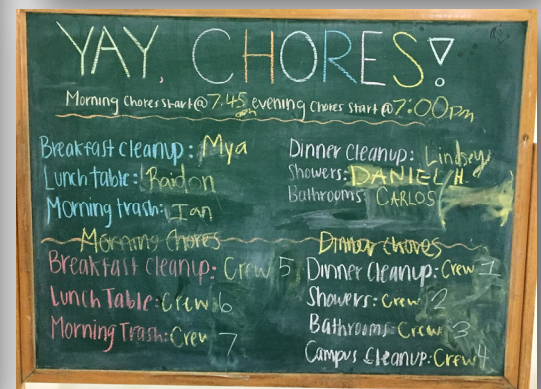
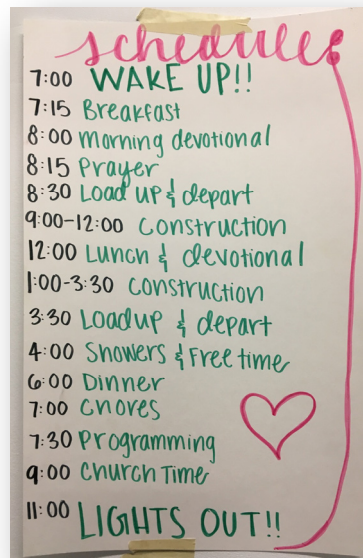

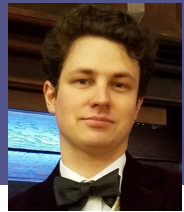

THE LAME SHALL LEAP LIKE A DEER



Isaiah prophesied that one day "the lame shall leap like a deer," (35:6) Jesus healed the lame (Matthew 15:30-31) as did Peter and John (Acts 3:1-10), and the result was praise to God, the ultimate Healer of body and soul.

If you have ever been immobile for any length of time, you know how challenging everyday activities can be. You may need to be waited on or call in hired help. If you are in a wheelchair you may be able to manage a little better, but a wheelchair poses other challenges like door too narrow to allow passage or cabinetry that keeps a person from getting close enough for effective work. If cabinetry closes the area below a sink, simply pulling up close enough to have access to the faucets is nearly impossible. And this is just a sample of the challenges that the mobility-impaired face.

In less developed countries the challenges of self-transport multiply. The indignity of crawling or dragging oneself about may be the only choice for a person who has suffered debilitating disease like polio, a stroke, an unfortunate injury, or a birth defect.

Mobility Worldwide has developed a personal energy transportation (PET) cart made of sturdy, simple parts. The PET, powered by hand cranking, turns an invalid into an active member of the community. No longer are crutches or crawling necessary. Even more, a person can convert a PET into an ice cream truck by the addition of use the "luggage compartment" of a PET for an ice chest, from which milk or snacks can be sold. Alternatively, some PET recipients have carried general store dry goods and used their cart to become a traveling merchandiser, not only self-transporting, but self-supporting as well.

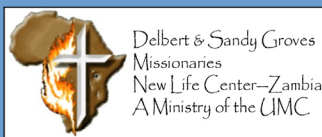
With our 2020 Easter offering, we are challenging the congregation to supply 100 PETs to needy individuals. The carts are shipped in containers to fill requests from disabled children, youth, and adults. Missionaries Delbert and Sandy Groves, whom GCUMC helps to support,

distribute mobility carts in Zaire as part of their work. This is just one of hundreds of locations where PETs have transformed lives.

You can be the answer to someone's prayers by contributing to this project. (\$300 buys a whole cart.) ?

DO WE HAVE TO BE THAT DISTANT?

I'd imagine some of you are tired of the term "social distancing", and more tired of actually doing it. I've been doing a lot of reading and a lot of listening with the extra time on my hands, and that makes me think a little. Here's one of the first ones that struck me...

Gretchen Schmelzer recently blogged a story titled *This Can Be Our Finest Hour*. The title caught my eye because I love the story of Apollo 13. Gretchen synopsised a key moment in the story – "When the Apollo 13 oxygen tank failed and the lunar module was in danger of not returning to earth, Gene Kranz, the lead flight director overheard people saying that this could be the worst disaster NASA had ever experienced—to which he is rumored to have responded, "With all due respect, I believe this is going to be our finest hour." And, it was.

She went on to write - For the vast majority of people nationwide and worldwide, this virus is not about you. This is one of those times in life, in history, when your actions are about something bigger. They are about someone else. They are about something greater, a greater good that you may not ever witness. A person you will save who you will never meet...every small act of 'not doing' what you were going to do, and 'doing' an act of kindness or support will add up exponentially.

Over the past several decades we Americans have been rather spoiled. I will speak for myself here so as not to offend all of you, but I know I have become increasingly selfish. In the day to day I have forgotten the sacrifice of those gone before us during times such as the Civil War, WWI, WWII and the many others in which countless Americans have sacrificed. Each of those called for Americans to make significant personal sacrifices for the greater good. Yesterday I pulled out my grandmother's WWII Ration Book, with a few remaining stamps for sugar, coffee, vegetables. It brought a little sobering perspective.

We are being asked to pretty simply, stay home. Maybe God is telling us to slow down. As a friend of mine recently walked through her neighborhood, a huge difference from what she was used to seeing, struck her. Instead of doors closed and very few others out and about, she heard laughter, saw whole families walking and riding bikes together, kids playing basketball, people doing yard work or sitting on their patios and waving. Most of the "things" we typically fill our lives with are temporarily suspended – work, school, bars, restaurants, movies, large sports events, bowling, concerts, casinos, shopping for the fun of it. So what now?

"Religion in the time of quarantine will challenge conceptions of what it means to minister and to fellowship". This is among the more profound I've heard. Remember that physically, God has always been distant...we can't see Him...we can't touch Him...we can't hug Him...but does that change our relationship with Him? No! Can we still love others from afar? Of course! How do we do it?

Let's look beyond the disappointment of cancelled events, trips, etc. During WWII, Winston Churchill's cabinet was amazed and heartened to witness the ascendance of human goodness—altruism, compassion and generosity of spirit and action. And we haven't changed for the worse. If there are more than one of you in your home, quarantine may be easier; you may enjoy games, deeper conversation, laughter, back to the basics together. For some who are home alone though, it can seem VERY distancing – this is where "our finest hour" comes in. In this age of technology—computers, smart tv's, cell phones, e-readers - we are blessed with the ability to still be social from afar. Write a note to a friend or someone alone, call, play on-line games, order delivery to a friend from a restaurant struggling to pay employees, sign up for on-line bible study, etc.

Remember the church is the people, we are still in community, we just aren't sitting and walking side by side. We just have to get a bit more creative. In Pastor Fred's first on-line only sermon during this national crisis, he spoke of the recent death of his sister. He shared how she planned her own memorial service, focusing primarily on the "gifts" in her life, some of which might be seen as a negative if looked at from a different perspective than she chose. He urged us to give thanks for the gifts in our life, in the midst of this Coronavirus outbreak.

If you are in an especially difficult place during this crisis, please know God has placed 4 pastors in your path to help you along the way. They minister to members and friends of Gold Canyon UMC. Prayer has always been an important part of UMW. There are seven admonitions in each Response magazine: Think, Learn, Live, Give, Listen, Act, and the final one is always Pray.

Last year, friends prayed special prayers for me, prayers of thanksgiving, prayers over concerns of me and my family, and prayers for travel mercies. It is a comfort when friends say, "You are in my prayers daily." Prayer is important to me.

In the Old Testament, God and humans engaged in dialogue. Understanding prayer as a personal confrontation with a responsive referent continues into New Testament Christian prayer. The first mention of prayer in connection with the life of Jesus is when He was baptized and the heavens opened and God spoke. Later, Jesus taught us how to pray when he spoke the Lord's Prayer. Christians know that God is susceptible to human influence by means of prayer.

I requested something in writing about prayer from my Michigan friend, Mary Martin, age 92, and she wrote: Prayer is verification you believe there is a God; verification you believe you can communicate with Him; verification you believe in a relationship with Him; verification you assume He has anthropomorphic attributes such as the ability to see, hear, answer, etc.

Communicating with our God is calming and when we pray for assistance in our life journey, we know that He listens and will help us understand God's purpose in our lives. Prayers brings us into a better fellowship with the Lord.

Keep praying! For yourself and for others. Anytime, anywhere, talk with God!

RONALD McDONALD HOUSE MINISTRY



Ronald McDonald House Ministry supports the Ronald McDonald House Dobson by cooking dinner once a month for the residents. Ronald McDonald House provides a place to stay for families with children hospitalized in the Carden Children's Medical Center in Mesa. The average stay for these families is six months, as their children have serious medical issues. After a

long day at the bedside of their child, they love to walk into the House and smell a home-cooked meal waiting for them. A touch of home provided by smiling chefs. We set the tables with tablecloths, china, cutlery, fabric napkins, and flowers. The meal is served buffet style at 6:00 p.m. sharp with all dishes prepared in the kitchen.



Volunteers are needed to help prepare the meal, set the tables, clean up the kitchen and dining room afterward, but most importantly, the volunteers dine with the families and listen to their stories. It is a wonderful gift to give the families for such a small effort.

Volunteers need to be able to be on their feet, unaided, from 2:30 p.m. to 8:00 p.m., assist in food prep such as peeling/chopping vegetables and salad makings, making desserts, cooking meat, potatoes, pasta, mashing potatoes, steaming vegetables or preparing hearty soups, salads and desserts, setting the tables. After the families have finished eating, we clean up the dining room and kitchen, load the dishwashers, throw the trash, and straggle out to our cars. It is a tiring job with a lot of good fellowship and blessings.

GENESIS PROJECT



As Genesis Project enters the 14th year of operation we continue to see the tremendous need for the hungry and homeless to have access to hot meals. Genesis Project serves an average of 140 people per day who come in for a hot meal, sack lunch to go, and bottled water for the

road. Just 6 weeks into 2020 we project that we will exceed the record of 86,912 meals served in 2019!

The great increase in 2019 led to the need for an expansion to allow for more seating in our dining room. In September we leased another unit across the parking lot to increase the impact of Genesis Project. This space meets a great need in our community by providing a lounge to warm up or cool down, clean weather appropriate clothing and shoes, hygiene items including all toiletries and toilet paper. Additionally, a dedicated donation sorting room allows for more donations to be received and processed quickly to dispense in higher volumes to those in need! Three private office spaces for the Community Resource Center also provides a high level of dignity for guest coming in seeking services as they are no longer having to pursue help in a crowded dining room.

Genesis Project continues to be a beacon of hope in Apache Junction and the surrounding communities. The mission of Genesis Project to feed, clothe and hydrate the hungry and homeless would not be possible without the daily sacrifice of our volunteers and the generous support of GCMC.
