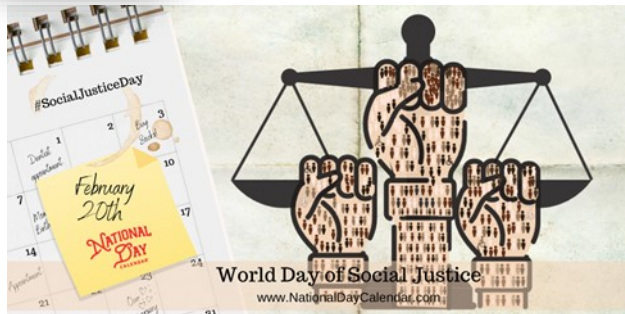

WORLD DAY OF SOCIAL JUSTICE

Every year on February 20th, the World Day of Social Justice promotes the importance of fair and just relations between the individual and society. The day also tackles issues such as poverty, exclusion, gender equality, human rights, and social protections.

Social justice has become a popular idea in recent years. However, the idea of it goes back to the time of Saint Augustine of Hippo, a fourth-century philosopher. A Jesuit priest named Luigi Taparelli coined the phrase "social justice." Taparelli was a Catholic scholar who lived from 1793 to 1882. The term social justice spread during the revolutions of 1848. This was a time of political upheavals in Europe.

In the United States, social justice became an issue during the Industrial Revolution. As the country prospered, the stark differences between the rich and the poor became increasingly obvious. Unfortunately, these stark differences still exist throughout the world.

Throughout the years, proponents have broken social justice down into five principles:

- Dignity of the human being – ensuring all humans have basic necessities and rights.
- Primacy of the common good – making choices that benefit everyone.
- Reciprocal rights and responsibilities – the right to have a conscience and the responsibility to be kind to others.
- Dignity of work and rights for workers – all people have the right to work safely.
- Fundamental option for the poor and the vulnerable – ensuring that the marginalized in society are

looked after.

The pursuit of social justice for all is at the heart of the United Nations' global mission to promote the development and human dignity. The UN's Declaration of Social Justice for a Fair Globalization focuses on fair outcomes through employment, social protection, and rights at work. On November 26, 2007 the United Nations General Assembly declared that February 20th was to be celebrated annually as the World Day of Social Justice.

HOW TO OBSERVE #SocialJusticeDay:

- Learn why social justice is important.
- Commit to always treating others fairly and justly.
- Watch a movie with a social justice theme, such as *The Hate U Give*, *Fruitvale Station*, and *Selma*.

Ash Wednesday is the first day of Lent and occurs 46 days before Easter. Ash Wednesday derives its name from the practice of placing ashes on the foreheads of adherents as a sign of mourning and repentance to God. 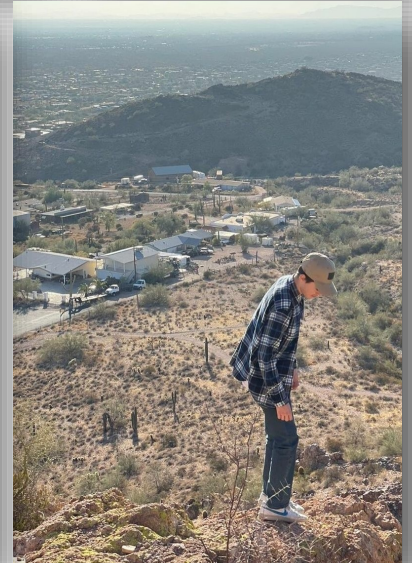

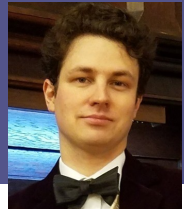

As we continue into the New Year, I only have a few pieces of news to pass on to you. The Music Department is still working under COVID restrictions, so it may be some time before you'll be hearing the bells, choir, and orchestra again in full. We're looking forward to returning to normal as vaccine distribution ramps up. I've heard from some folks that they're already getting theirs and others are reserving times, so hopefully within a few months many more will have them. This month and next we will be concluding the 2020-2021 season of the Gold Canyon UMC Performing Arts series.

On February 20 at 3:00pm, we'll be hosting the **SoSco Duo**, a unique pairing of flute and guitar coming out of Phoenix, in virtual concert. Alex and Laura perform a great variety of music with everything from Irish genres to Jazz and Classical. Alex Mack performs on guitar primarily for SoSco, but also specializes in voice and other instruments. During college he performed over 1,000 shows for Cedar Point Amusement park in Sandusky, Ohio and upon graduation, he was hired by Princess Cruises as principal orchestra guitarist where he traveled throughout Europe, the Pacific and Caribbean. In addition to being a founding member of the SoSco Duo, he is the Creative Director with Lonely Street Productions, a nostalgia-based nationally touring production company. Laura Strickland is a freelance flutist with music degrees from Northwestern University and Cincinnati College-Conservatory of Music and with doctoral studies at the University of Maryland and University of Illinois. In addition to playing with SoSco Duo, Laura is principal flute with Arizona Pro Arte Ensemble and teaches private flute lessons in Phoenix. Before relocating to Phoenix, Laura performed on flute and piccolo in a wide range of ensembles throughout Chicago, Cincinnati, Seattle and Washington D.C. It should be a treat to hear them together, performing both music new to us, as well as some familiar tunes. You can either stream the concert at 3pm or watch whenever is convenient for you from our website or Facebook. As always, GCUMC-hosted concerts are free admission, but we will be receiving a free-will offering if you're inclined to help out.

Next month, on March 8th, we'll be hosting the world-renowned Rice **Brothers** once again for their originally

NO LOAVES AND FISHES



At **Fellowman International** in Honduras a primary concern has been hunger, food insecurity. This problem has increased with schools have been closed for nearly a full year, as many children received their most substantial meal of the day at school. The focus has now shifted from school lunches to feeding some of the most vulnerable.

When the medical team travels village to village to provide medical care, the physician has been able to identify those who are malnourished or at greater risk, especially children and the elderly. As a result, deliveries of fresh chicken, raised by the mission, and food bundles have been made all over the mountain to those struggling with hunger. This is one of FMI's tangible ways to share Christ's love.

Covid-19 has threatened FMI healthcare professionals as they have been faced with the dilemma of risking their own lives to care for the sick, adding an extra layer of challenge to their work. Those living in remote areas are in particular need of early diagnosis and timely treatment. Home visits to deliver medications have helped to reduce the infection risk for fragile patients.

Through its budget, GCUMC provides modest annual contributions to Fellowman International and missionary Lisa Armstrong.

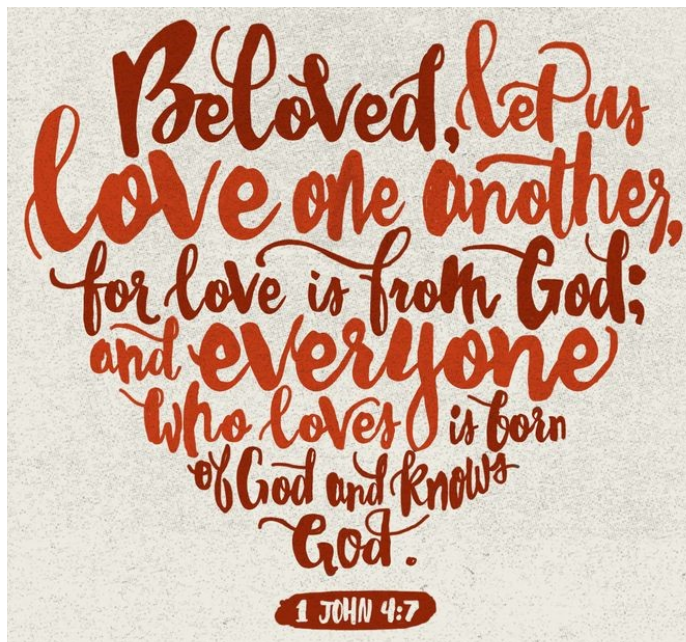

PASTORAL NOTE

Oswald Chambers wrote, "Faith never knows where it is being led, but it loves and knows the One who is leading." This reminds me of Paul's declaration, "...I know the one in whom I have put my trust, and I am sure that he is able to guard until that day what I have entrusted to him."

As I write this we are in the midst of a new surge of a variant of COVID-19 and experts predict that the virus is likely to still be prevalent even with the distribution of vaccines. Social distancing and masks will not go away. We are also encountering a whole new set of difficulties, uncertainty and confusion surrounding vaccine distribution and availability. Economic pressure continues and will probably also become more severe as people face an array of losses. We have already seen this impact on our church's benevolent ministries and we suspect it will only become more widespread.

Perhaps you're saying, "Well thanks for the good news!" Please remember these are predictions not prophecies. We simply do not know what tomorrow holds, which actually is not new; it's always been that way. Faith to face the furor is therefore even more essential. My friends, faith is an anchor for the soul. We live by faith – not a blind faith but a deep trust in the One who is trustworthy and faithful. One of my mother's favorite songs has these lyrics: "Many things about tomorrow I don't seem to understand. But I know who holds tomorrow and I know who holds my hand." God is sufficient for 2021 and beyond. You can count on it! — Dr. David Worley

CARING CORNER

LOVE



Is it too cliché to write about love in February? I am going to go with “no”. Valentine’s Day can sometimes be the default holiday that comes to mind for this month, but that’s not necessarily the kind of love I’m referring to. Instead, let’s talk about putting God’s love in action.

Last month we talked about hope and trust. And although we must place some hope and trust in humans at times, ultimately, we discussed both as they lie in God. But does having that hope and trust, also known as faith, mean that we sit back passively and wait for things (life) to happen to us? Does it mean we decide we have no control and just wait on God, or others, to fix what we currently see as wrong in our lives? Having faith in God doesn’t necessarily mean we walk aimlessly through life with an attitude of “oh well, there’s nothing I can do, nothing’s in my hands.”

As police officers, my husband and I once taught a program in the schools titled D.A.R.E. (Drug Abuse Resistance Education). Comprised of 17 lessons, and primarily focused on helping adolescents resist the temptations they faced regarding drug use, it was really a series of life lessons. In Lesson #7 we discussed rights and responsibilities – focusing on the fact that each of us has personal rights, and each of us has a responsibility to others to respect their rights.

Do we have responsibilities to God in how we carry out our faith here on earth? Of course we do, and the Bible is full of just what that means. One such place is 1 Corinthians 13:1-13:

***13** If I speak in the tongues of mortals and of angels, but do not have love, I am a noisy gong or a clanging cymbal. **2** And if I have prophetic powers, and understand all mysteries and all knowledge, and if I have all faith, so as to remove mountains, but do not have love, I am nothing. **3** If I give away all my possessions, and if I hand over my body so that I may boast, ^[a] but do not have love, I gain nothing.*

***4** Love is patient; love is kind; love is not envious or boastful or arrogant **5** or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; **6** it does not rejoice in*

*wrongdoing, but rejoices in the truth. **7** It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things.*

***8** Love never ends. But as for prophecies, they will come to an end; as for tongues, they will cease; as for knowledge, it will come to an end. **9** For we know only in part, and we prophesy only in part; **10** but when the complete comes, the partial will come to an end. **11** When I was a child, I spoke like a child, I thought like a child, I reasoned like a child; when I became an adult, I put an end to childish ways. **12** For now we see in a mirror, dimly, ^[b] but then we will see face to face. Now I know only in part; then I will know fully, even as I have been fully known. **13** And now faith, hope, and love abide, these three; and the greatest of these is love.*

[NRSV]

Pastor Fred did a sermon on conflict back in November. He reminded us that although portions of this scripture are quite often used in weddings to honor the vows and the love a couple has for one another, the Apostle Paul wrote this scripture regarding conflict. The Christians in Corinth at the time were struggling. There was sin, immorality, anger, and lack of unity. They weren’t reflecting God’s love to one another. This scripture reminds us that **love is the greatest tool in dealing with conflict**. Pastor Fred highlighted ways to do this, and our obligations as Christians to - engage in healthy conflict, always have a measure of humility, control our own behavior by refusing to act or react in anger, diffuse strong emotions by listening, and agree where we can. Worship on that day ended with the song *They Will Know We Are Christians By Our Love*, the song couldn’t have been more perfect.

I recently read this somewhere - “Jesus didn’t have to agree with everyone to be kind to them.” Wow, different language, but the same important message! Will they know we are Christians by our love? If you are in a position where loving as we’ve discussed here is not coming easy, and you are unable to fully express your faith in how you love others, then you aren’t alone. Times are trying.

Alisha L. Gordon, M.Div., the executive for spiritual growth for the United Methodist Women national office, wrote in 2017 of Jesus' words at the Last Supper:

"Commandments are an essential part of the Christian

faith; the Ten Commandments shaped the legacy of God's relationship to the Children of Israel for centuries. The Old Testament contains over 600 laws for the Children of Israel to follow, and by the time we encounter Jesus in the New Testament, we still see evidence of the Commandments in the everyday lives of the people He encounters. Often, Jesus challenged the Commandments of old with more simplistic commandments, rooted not in mundane rule following, but in a change of heart.

When Jesus gives the Disciples the commandment to love one another in John 13:34, Jesus took a laundry list of commandments and simplified it down to one: Love one another. We'd think that having to follow only one commandment is easier than following the 600 laws in the Old Testament plus the Ten Commandments God gave Moses, but if we're honest with ourselves, this single commandment is the hardest of all."

The United Methodist Women is a mission organization ruled by this one commandment: to love one another. We are not called to judge or to even understand one another, but to love unconditionally. The UMW fulfills this commandment through our missions around the world, through the empowering of women and youth in their communities, through helping those who are disenfranchised, through educating our members and others. Love is such a powerful force! With God's help, it can move mountains and bring about miracles! Let us focus on this.
