






ON THE GOSPEL SIDE

WHAT ENDS CAN'T YOU MAKE MEET?



I recently saw this sign on @instapray, on Instagram. I like the sign's message. Although this verbiage may read this way in Psalm 23:1 in one of the many versions of the Bible out there, I haven't seen it.

Here are how just a few of how the more common versions read:

"The Lord is my shepherd; I have all that I need." - Psalm 23:1, NLT

or

"The Lord is my shepherd; I shall not want." - Psalm 23:1, NRSV

or

"God, my shepherd! I don't need a thing." - Psalm 23:1, MSG

But I don't think that makes this sign, or its reference to the first verse of the 23rd Psalm irrelevant. In essence, Psalm 23:1 assures us that when we are struggling in life, God will take care of us.

Let's also look at this sign from a different angle – what is meant by "when you are struggling to make ends meet"? When we think of "making ends meet" we tend to think of financial resources, and the fact that our incoming funds often don't seem to meet the outgoing financial needs in our lives. But what other struggles in life can be described in the same way, difficulty making If your current struggles hold you back from finding this ends meet? How about...

- Our minds meeting our hearts? We know, in our logical minds, what is true and what we should do, but moving that to our hearts and then outwardly in the form of action is much more difficult.
- **Enough time in a day?** Our to-do lists out do our time by far, not leaving time for rest, peace, prayer, or even looking outside of ourselves.
- Enough love? If we've struggled with unloving relationships, it is more difficult for us to reach out and show love to others.
- "Wanters" on over-drive? Do we want so much

more than we need, that we are never truly content or thankful?

I often have difficulty making ends meet here on earth, and odds are, you do to.

Well, great news!! There's a simple solution, and it happens to be what this whole Lenten season is about. Easter is a time of hope, renewal, and new beginnings. When Jesus Christ died on the cross it wasn't in vain. All our sins were forgiven, and we were given eternal hope and life. When we are caught up in our struggles here on earth however, we often forget Jesus' sacrifice. We allow a gap between us and Christ and end up feeling alone.

The only place for peace and rest is in God, but we often allow shame, guilt and pride to paralyze us and don't take the next step back toward God. Do we have the humility to take the gift Christ provided - forgiveness, mercy, and grace, and let him carry our struggles?

As we move through Holy Week and toward Easter, let's take time to reflect. Take some time and take a step back toward Christ, a step closer to rest, peace, and release of your struggles to the One who promises to carry them for you. Matthew 6:6 (MSG) puts it well:

⁶ "Here's what I want you to do: Find a quiet, secluded place so you won't be tempted to role-play before God. Just be there as simply and honestly as you can manage. The focus will shift from you to God,

and you will begin to sense his grace."

Dr. Ian Classe, Director of Music Ministries





EASTER OFFERING 2023

Are You Able To Walk? If the answer is "Yes", aren't you blessed? Do you know of anyone who uses a wheelchair or ever had to use one short term?

Imagine what it would be like without one. Crawling is the answer for thousands of folks, around the world, who don't have access to decent adaptive equipment that rolls in dirt, gravel or sand.



Thankfully, in 1994, Mel West a retired Methodist minister and his missionary friend, Larry Hills brainstormed about what could be done about the

'crawlers". They needed a simple cart design, three wheeled, hand cranked with wheelbarrow tires that can Your continued participation in the roll in rough or soft surfaces. for food or prescriptions and use Since that time over 70,000 carts have been made in 21 their rechargeable card that was obtained here at the faith-based, non-profit, volunteer workshops in the Welcome Center or the Church Office, GCUMC receives United States. Carts are delivered at no cost to people in developing countries who are unable to walk due to illness, disease, birth defects, or injuries like those cause by landmines.



The carts are distributed through non-governmental agencies in 102 countries. Mission teams travel to countries to distribute the carts, making individual adjustments based on the recipient's size and needs.

Carts can be fitted with ice chests and totes in order to allow the recipient the ability to have a job selling items such as snacks,

within their community. The carts give dignity to former" crawlers" who are able to get out of the dirt and participate in entrepreneur endeavors to provide for their families.

Self-propelled units come in large and small sizes while the Pull Cart, is made for those without adequate upper body strength. The Mobility Carts enable an improved quality of life at work, school or home. Former street beggars are able to manage a business selling food or products from their carts, allowing independence from charity. Grandmothers who normally carry their disabled grandchildren on their backs can use a pull cart to go places.

The ultimate goal is to provide mobility for all of God's children in need. Currently, the focus is on those with the least resources in poor or underdeveloped countries. Typically wheelchairs donated are of poor quality and not suitable for the environment that the users live in.

Mobility Worldwide carts have wheelbarrow tires and thus are able to go where conventional wheelchairs can't. They are ideal for rural areas where roads are non -existent or on disrepair.

Benefits of having a cart allows children to attend school and adults to travel to local health centers for medical care. Recipients can finally go to church, the marketplace and social gatherings like other nonhandicapped persons.

in some of the worlds most remote regions, the cart is built of sturdy wood and a steel frame. Every cart is handcrafted by volunteers. A unique characteristic is the compartment used to haul food, produce, tools or other necessities.

It is joyful that this year, the Easter offering will go towards supporting the Mobility Worldwide mission. This is a beautiful expression of being the "Hands of Christ," perfect for celebrating His Resurrection.

As life does, new doors opened, and she has spent the past decade working in faith-based organizing. Melanie has valued the opportunity to work alongside other people of faith on issues such as education, immigration, affordable housing and homelessness. "I attended the presentation in January. Ms. Mihalcescu is very knowledgeable and is an excellent speaker. • Creation Care: Celebrate Earth Day, April 22. Remember: Every person, animal and plant is connected by our need for clean air and water. Water is essential to life. How do we use water and where does our water come from? Up to 70% of water usage for municipal users in Arizona is used outside for plants, grass and swimming pools according to the Arizona Department of Water Resources. Arizona gets 36% of its water supply from the Colorado River. Other water sources come from groundwater, 41%; in -state rivers, 18%; and reclaimed water, 5%, according to Center for Water Policy, ASU.

FOOD BANK



Our Food Bank volunteers continue serving increasingly larger numbers of individuals. Sadly, we also see an increase in the elderly requiring assistance. In the first two months of 2022 we served 999 individuals. The

first two months of 2023 need has grown to 1732 individuals. GCUMC Food Bank supplier, United Food Bank, is also experiencing similar challenges. Our church and the community's support has been and will continue to be critical to our ability to meet this increasing need. Thank you for your support and prayers.
