
ON THE GOSPEL SIDE

Most likely most of you have heard that I announced I will be retiring on July 1, 2024. You have also likely heard that Pastor Fred will be retiring in 2025 after implementing a succession plan for one year. Change is inevitable! Some of us find change difficult to face, but, in the end, none of us escapes change. One look in your mirror will confirm this! But, how we deal with change is central to our Christian faith. The onset of following Jesus Christ as Lord means change. Paul describes us as becoming new creations in Christ; we are changed dramatically by the converting power of the Holy Spirit who leads us to repentance and faith. As we mature in the Christian life we continue to change degree by degree. Our perspective, our desires and our behavior changes to be increasingly like Jesus. Ultimately, we will enjoy a final change when we receive new bodies and we are fully like our Lord (see I John 3:2). So, we embrace change as Christians. But changing circumstances sometimes prove more challenging. I find great comfort in the words of an old hymn:

Swift to its close ebbs out life's little day; earth's joys grow dim, its glories pass away. Change and decay in all around I see. O thou who changest not, abide with me.

All of the inevitable change we face in this life is overshadowed by the constant presence of the One who said, "I will never leave you or forsake you." In the interim, we have almost a complete year to worship and learn together. I encourage you to continue to enjoy this season of opportunity and blessing. Join us at 4 pm every Sunday this summer and let's celebrate the change that marks our walk with Christ as we worship and listen to His Word to us.



ON A PASTORAL NOTE

Well as the old saying goes: "The best laid plans of mice and men often go astray" is certainly true! As you know we were to be in Maine for the summer, however medical issues caused us to adjust our plans and thus we are still here in beautiful Arizona. This "being here" is an opportunity for me to share some thoughts about the recent sermon series by Rev. Steinberg. It all has to do with some of the difficult questions we may be asking in our own lives. I'm always struck by the issue of "forgiveness."

It isn't a question of "forgive and forget," rather it's forgiving to find healing and wholeness. In chapter 19 of the book, "In the Presence of Jesus: A 40-day Guide to the Intimacy with God You've Always Wanted" by Paul Bane and Matt Litton, they write: "I don't want you to define your life by your wounds. I want you to find your identity in Me and accept My love for you. When you are ready, I want you to surrender your wounded heart to Me."

Too often we define ourselves by our wounds, by that which has hurt us or those whom we have hurt. In giving our wounded selves over to Jesus' love we find healing of our wounds, forgiveness, and unconditional love. In so doing Jesus also wants, at the same time to release, to forgive all those who have hurt you. For its only in Jesus that we can find true healing for our wounded heart.

CONFIDENTLY SHINE



Do you remember the song This Little Light of Mine from your Sunday School days as a youngster? The prominent lyrics included:

This little light of mine, I'm gonna let it shine. Everywhere I go, I'm gonna let it shine. Let it shine, let it shine, let it shine.

We will sing in peace, We will sing in harmony. This little light of mine, I'm gonna let it shine.

The lyrics are seemingly simple but what do they mean? I've always taken them to mean the "light" inside of me; who I am; the light of Christ; spreading the positive attributes which the good Lord has given me. But I go through phases in my life where I have a hard time again, what does that really look like?

As we go through life and its events and experiences, it can be easy to lose confidence in ourselves, question our intended direction, lose focus of what we should be doing or how we should be acting, sometimes allowing others to make us feel insecure or question ourselves. In other words, we aren't being ourselves. We aren't letting our lights shine.

I've always believed Jesus gave us the best example of how to do that. In many respects He was a "one man show" during His time here on earth. Clearly, He wasn't welcomed in many arenas. Jesus represented the opposite of the above, He was the minority! If He had been intimidated by the religious leaders of the time, it wouldn't have served Him well in delivering His message for the world, would it? If He had allowed them to make Him feel insecure, hiding His

light, His message wouldn't have been broadcast and received.

So, this begs the question - What parts of our own lights are we not letting shine due to insecurities, lack of confidence, or maybe even lack of faith? Sure, we can say it was easy for Jesus, He was perfect, He was Christ, He didn't suffer from the malady of sin which we do. It is often so much more difficult for us to be authentic.

Given that, how do we embolden ourselves to let our lights shine, to be who God intended us to be? In a recent devotional Pastor Rick Warren said - "If you want to see wonderful things from God's Word, then ask God to open your eyes to what He wants to do through your life."

seeing what God wants me to do with the gifts and talents which He has given me, with the light that shines within me. I love the advice above - "Ask God!" The power of prayer never ceases to amaze me. I strongly believe in that power, as I hope many of you do. That doesn't mean it's always easy for me to simply ask God and witness the answer. King of Instruments

Part 9: A Call to Action

As you may recall, in May the Administrative Council unanimously adopted a resolution to authorize and direct the Organ Committee to seek proposals from organ builders, which is the critical first step in moving this project forward.

If you have been following the past RoadRunner articles, you are aware that we must soon commission the construction of a pipe organ, if we are to have a new instrument before our 19-year-old digital organ reaches the predicted end of its useful lifespan, particularly since it may take five to seven years before a new pipe organ is designed, built, and installed. Said another way, there is a waiting list for fine organ builders, and we need to secure a place in line, which is the reason why this first step by the Administrative Council is so important and exciting.

Before the Administrative Council can commission an instrument, being mindful that building a Fellowship Hall is farther along and an established priority for our church, we will need a baseline of funding for this project. To this end, the Council has counseled that the Organ Fund, which has a current balance of approximately \$170,095, will need to grow to \$500,000 before the Council can reasonably commission an instrument, which the Organ Committee agrees is fair and prudent. Again, we don't need funding for the entire project at the start, since we will have time to raise the remaining funds after commissioning the instrument and before it is installed, but we need to reach this significant milestone in order to set this project in motion.

How will we raise these funds? We hope for donations from all, large or small; but we are admittingly hoping for Angel donors who can contribute \$5,000, since a

small number of Angels will accelerate this project and quicken the date when we can commission an instrument and get our place in line, but we will need the help of everyone. And all contributions, regardless of amount, are precious and deeply appreciated.

How to Give to the Organ Project

This is simple. You may give by any existing method for contributing to the church, just please make certain that you specify the Organ Fund. You may give at the offering plate, for example, just write "Organ Fund" somewhere on the contribution envelope or on the memo line of a check. The online donation systems also work, just specify the Organ Fund, just as an estate gift may specify the Organ Fund.

Additionally, there's a great (but perhaps underused) option of directing the trustee or administrator of your Individual Retirement Account (IRA) to make a direct transfer to the church for the Organ Fund. The IRS allows a tax-free distribution – without needing to itemize deductions – as a Qualified Charitable Distribution of up to \$100,000 per year for donors who are at least age 70 ½, and these distributions also count toward any Required Minimum Distribution (RMD). Please check with your tax adviser, and please remember that such donations must come directly from the trustee, not through you to the Organ Fund.

In a future article, we'll update you on our Organ Ambassador program, since we have welcomed our first group of people to a meeting with the Organ Committee; and in the meantime, thank you for your continuing interest in the Organ Project.

UNITED WOMEN IN FAITH(UWF)



It is not an exaggeration to say that reading has many benefits. We tend to focus on the benefits to children,

but the truth is that adults get the same perks. It's a great way to unwind and relax. It's a form of self-care that we shouldn't overlook. Reading makes us better communicators and writers.

But no matter why you read, you're training your brain to remember ideas and facts. You're thinking in new ways, and growing creatively and emotionally. My reading program friend Donna Graves and I share two books that we recently finished.

The House On Lowell Street by Linda Keane, is part of the Nurturing for Community category of the United Women in Faith reading program. Based on a true event, the strike of the Kalamazoo corset workers in 1912, this novel tells us how Rose Morrison's life drastically changes after her banker husband dies suddenly leaving her with a mountain of debt.

In order to save her home she decides to take in boarders which a proper lady did not do in 1911. Even though her intentions were to only take in women of high standards she eventually took in two sisters who worked at the local corset factory to help clean. From there she becomes more involved with the sisters and their problems with the local factory.

Anyone who has struggled to do the right thing even when the cost is high, will be heartened by this story of perseverance against all odds. History buffs will enjoy an insider's look at a little known strike. It also shows us how women face many of the same challenges today from the workplace, motherhood, and society.

Author Linda Keane is an award-winning journalist whose first novel, The House on Lowell Street won the Grand Prize from Deep River Books. Linda graduated from Northwestern University with a B.A. and M.S.J. from Medill School of Journalism. When she retired, she left the world of business communications to write this novel of intrigue in a corset factory.

She sees that people talk a lot but mostly about nothing, not like the men in the fields she's known all her life who hold the rich topsoil in their hands, talk fertilizer and weather and prices on the Grain Exchange. In between classes and hauling beets, drinking beer and shooting pool, a man who claims he's her brother shows up, and she begins to dream of the Cities and blonde Scandinavian girls calling for help.

2020 McKnight Distinguished Artist award, Marcie Rendon, Nominee, Mystery Writers of America— THE G.P. PUTNAM'S SONS SUE GRAFTON MEMORIAL **AWARD**

Author Marcie Rendon is a citizen of the White Earth Nation. In 2020, she became the first Native American woman to receive the McKnight Distinguished Artist award. June 2019, Diego Vazquez and Rendon received the Loft's 2017 Spoken Word Immersion Fellowship for their work with women incarcerated in county jails.
