My second cousin put up her Christmas tree not too long after Halloween. She anticipated criticism for starting the season so early, but explained that because her Mom with whom she was very close died this past year, putting up the tree was a source of comfort and sweet memory to help alleviate her grief. I encouraged her decision. Several other people have noted on how valuable their holiday traditions seem especially important this year. I think part of this urge is because the world is so troubled we look for a place of hope, comfort and joy. For those of us, including my second cousin, who are believers, Christmas is all of that and more. We celebrate not

just as an annual occurrence, but as a confirmation of the wondrous news of Advent. What joyous news that Jesus, God's Son and our Savior, has come to this earth to reveal the Father, show us how to live and die for sins after which He rose again to pronounce victory in His name! We have every reason to celebrate. As we gather each Sunday of Advent for our 4 pm worship service, we will rejoice in song and word. ON A PASTORAL NOTE

As we enter the season of Advent with Christmas just around the corner, I would like to look at this season with a slightly different twist. As Pastor Fred has been preaching a series on the Ten Commandments, I must admit that the one commandment I seem to miss each time I try to list them is commandment #4: keeping the Sabbath Holy and finding rest. Perhaps it's because I have always, as a pastor, worked on the Sabbath.

Advent is a season of preparation for the celebration of our Savior's birth. A time when we sing such familiar hymns as #196 in our Hymnal: "Come Thou Long-Expected Jesus." Yet, it's also a time of year in which we find ourselves perhaps busier than at any other time of year. Shopping, parties, work, decorating our homes, trimming the Christmas tree, taking care of the day-to-day things and last of all trying to fit in a time of holy rest. Somehow, we don't take the time to reflect one of the most important commandments – "keeping the Sabbath Holy." It means being mindful of our need to spend time with God, in prayer, scripture and meditation. In the first verse of the hymn, we sing: "Come thou long – expected Jesus, born to set thy people free, from our fears and sins release us, let us find our rest in thee. Israel's strength and consolation, hope of all the earth thou art; dear desire of every nation, joy of every longing heart."

I would like to ask you in this Advent season to take the time rest, to rest in God's word and promise. To spend time in prayer and ask the Lord to set us free from what is sometimes seen as "the rat race of getting everything done."

Perhaps if we spent more time with the Lord each day, we would find that everything that needs to be done gets done with less stress and worry.

I pray this Advent will offer you a time of blessing and reflection on the "Real Reason for the Season." "Come thou long – expected Jesus!" Blessings and Merry Christmas!

"26... God sent the angel Gabriel to Nazareth, a village in Galilee, ²⁷ to a virgin named Mary. She was engaged to be married to a man named Joseph, a descendant of King David. 28 Gabriel appeared to her and

said, "Greetings, favored woman! The Lord is with you!" ²⁹ Confused and disturbed, Mary tried to think what the angel could mean. 30 "Don't be afraid, Mary," the angel told her, "for you have found favor with God! 31 You will conceive and give birth to a son, and you will name him Jesus. 32 He will be very great and will be called the Son of the Most High. The Lord God will give him the throne of his ancestor David. 33 And he will reign over Israel forever; his Kingdom will never end!" 34 Mary asked the angel, "But how can this happen? I am a virgin." 35 The angel replied, "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you. So the baby to be born will be holy, and he will be called the Son of God...³⁷ For the word of God will never fail." Mary responded, "I am the Lord's servant. May everything you have said about me come true." And then the angel left her. ~ Luke 1:26-37 [NLT]

The angel Gabriel told Mary she would name her child Jesus. Jesus was a Greek form of the Hebrew name Joshua and was a common name meaning "the Lord saves." Just as Joshua had led Israel into the Promised Land, so Jesus would lead His people into eternal life.

God created us in His image, but at the time He sent morning, (or emailed to you prior to Sunday worship), Christ to earth, we had sorely disappointed Him. What would you have done if you were Mary? Whew, I've asked myself that a few times, and I must say I fail in the answer every time. The beautiful thing is, that's okay...my failure is okay! Not only is it accepted, God expects it. He sent Jesus Christ because man was

By the time you're reading this, Advent has likely begun or will start soon, meaning Christmas and the end of the year is just a few short weeks away! I hope everyone has had a great year and will make the next one even better. As we get into 'the season' where most of our winter residents have returned, there's a lot of musical activity upcoming.

First of all, the Gold Canyon Arts Council will be presenting **The Four Freshmen** on **Sunday, December 3**rd at **7:00pm.** A talented vocal quartet blending more modern open harmonic jazz arrangements with the sounds from the big band era, the Freshmen will be singing holiday classics as well as some of their favorite hits. Tickets are available from goldcanyonarts.org/tickets, the Apache Junction Chamber of Commerce, or Robin Rotella Team Realtors.

Next in early December, GCUMC will open the Gold Canyon UMC Performing Arts Series with our annual Christmas Concert on Saturday, December 9th at 3:00pm. The concert will be available both in person and online, but I encourage you to come in person for a better acoustical and community experience. Seats are limited so be sure to arrive early! Concert music this year will feature most of GCUMC'S performing groups from choir to bells to band as well as the Sonoran Brass Quintet, guest instrumentalists, and stunning soloists. The concert is free-admission but a free-will offering will be received to support our music ministries and the Gold Canyon UMC Performing Arts Series as a whole. If you are able, please bring a non-perishable food item for the GCUMC Food Bank as there are always those in need at Christmas. We hope to see you there!

The **"Sunday Sounds Series"** will be on hiatus this month as the music ministry prepares for the Christmas Concert as well as the multiple Christmas Eve and Advent services; it will however return in the New Year in January on Sunday, January 14, 2024. To hear some Christmas organ music, be sure to attend the annual Christmas concert as well as Christmas Eve services!

Speaking of Christmas Eve, as usual, the music ministry will participate in the **Christmas Eve services** at **4:00** and **6:00pm**. There will be a short, 10-15 minute hymn-sing featuring some of your favorite Christmas carols prior to each service, so arrive early to get a good seat and sing some of your favorites with family and friends.

Upcoming in January, the Gold Canyon Arts Council will be featuring the **Hutchins Consort** on **January 12th at 7:00 p.m.** and the Gold Canyon UMC Performing Arts series will be hosting American concert violinist Andrew Sords with celebrated collaborative pianist Elizabeth DeMio on **Sunday, January 21st at 2:00 p.m.** Stay tuned to our website for more information regarding upcoming concerts and events.

Before you move on to the next article, there is also quick update on the organ project. The organ committee elected a new vice-chair last month and inducted a new member as well to further flesh out our committee. Furthermore, the committee will be hosting an organ ambassador orientation on **December 11**th at **2:00pm** in the choir room and on zoom, open to any who would be interested in joining the team. Just to reiterate what an ambassador does: These are people who have been educated about our project and will reach out to our congregation and greater community to inform and encourage them in regards to the pipe organ project with the intention of generating further interest and buzz. We hope to move forward in the New Year with more significant fundraising as well as analysis and selection of incoming proposals from organ builders, culminating in signing a contract with a desired builder.

United Women in Faith(UWF)



Reverend Julius Keller was born in Richmond, Indiana which is located on the Ohio-Indiana border. His father was

a highly successful lawyer and his mother was a talented school teacher. However, his mother didn't work while they lived in Richmond. She was a stay-at-home Mom

tending to Julius and his sister who are only 15 months apart. Sadly, when Julius was three and his sister was barely two their father died suddenly and unexpectedly three days before his thirty-fifth birthday. Their mother moved them to the nearest big city which was Cincinnati, Ohio. She resumed her career as a language arts school teacher where she became an icon in the community. A few years later his mother remarried and they began attending Mt. Zion United Methodist Church. Reverend Keller has been a member of the United Methodist Church for over 60 years!

Julius graduated from high school at the age of 17 and began attending college at Ohio University four days later. His goal was to follow in the footsteps of his father and grandfather who were very prominent lawyers. After graduating from college he attended law school at The Ohio State College of Law in Columbus, Ohio. Upon graduation Reverend Keller relocated to Chicago, Illinois where he developed an expertise in the field of housing discrimination law for 23 years. However in 2002, he responded to a calling from God and entered seminary at the Methodist Theological School in Ohio. Prior to entering seminary, the District Superintendent in the West Ohio Conference asked if he would consider pastoring Lockbourne United Methodist Church. agreed to accept that appointment and began as their pastor in June, before he started his seminary career in August of 2002.

Reverend Julius Keller met and married Katharine while in seminary. In their blended family, they have four adult aged daughters and their spouses, two adult aged sons and their spouses, eight grandsons and three granddaughters. When he graduated from seminary, they were recruited by the Desert Southwest Conference of The United Methodist Church to come to Gilbert, Arizona and plant a church. Reverend Julius Keller founded Living Water United Methodist Fellowship and served as their pastor until 2015. He was appointed to Cross in the Desert United Methodist Church where he served as senior pastor until he retired on June 30, 2020. Julius also served on the Board of Ordained Ministry for eleven years and was the Chair of the Board from 2016 to 2020. In retirement, Reverend Keller has enjoyed mentoring teenagers as well as some adults during their life journeys!


FOOD BANK


