FROM THE PASTOR: "DEBUNKING FOUR CHRISTIAN MYTHS"



As we journey together in faith, understanding and confronting the misconceptions about Christianity is crucial for our spiritual growth and witness. With this in mind, I am excited to announce our upcoming sermon series titled "Debunking 4 Christian Myths." This series, starting on January 7th, will explore and challenge common misconceptions that can hinder our relationship with God and our understanding of the Christian life.

- Myth 1: Bad Things Don't Happen to Truly Godly Christians. Many believe that being a truly godly Christian shields one from life's hardships. In our first sermon, we will explore how faith in God is not a safeguard against life's trials but a source of strength and resilience amidst them. We will delve into the biblical understanding of suffering and God's presence in our struggles.
- Myth 2: Only Hypocrites Go to Church. It's a common saying that churches are full of hypocrites. Our second week will confront this misconception head-on. We will discuss the nature of the church as a community of imperfect people seeking God, emphasizing the role of grace and transformation in our spiritual journey.
- Myth 3: Becoming a Christian Means Giving Up All Fun & Following A Life of Rules. The third week challenges the myth that becoming a Christian means giving up on fun and living a life constrained by rules. We will celebrate the joy and freedom found in Christ, exploring how Christian living is not about restrictive rules but about a relationship that brings true and lasting joy.
- Myth 4: Miracles Don't Happen Anymore. In our final week, we address the skepticism surrounding miracles in the modern age. This sermon will highlight testimonies and scriptural insights, affirming that God's miraculous work did not cease with the apostles but continues dynamically today.

Each sermon in this series aims to deepen our understanding, strengthen our faith, and equip us to engage with these common misconceptions in meaningful and informed ways. We invite everyone to join us in this enlightening journey, as we seek to grow closer to God and each other through a clearer understanding of our faith.



YOUTH GROUP MINISTRY

On Sun., Dec. 3rd, we had a tremendous day! We had 9 youth at Sunday school, and then left for the "Feed My Starving Children" event in Mesa. We all donned hair nets and went to work! Together we packed 160 boxes (our table did 22), and 34,560 meals that will feed 94 kids for a year! Our senior high group worked loading the heavy boxes, constantly moving, keeping the stations filled. They were also in charge of cleaning the floors and areas. The rest of us took to our stations and scooped, filled, weighed, sealed and stuffed the bags of food for the children. We all got to go to the warehouse and pray for the food and children we were feeding. Great job Gold Canyon Youth!

ON THE GOSPEL SIDE

Some people think the Old Testament is so old, it's outdated. But that is a mistake, I fear. Here's an example: As the New Year begins I thought of this passage of Scripture from Joshua 3:1-4. "Early in the morning Joshua rose and set out from Shittim with all the Israelites, and they came to the Jordan. They camped there before crossing over. At the end of three days, the officers went through the camp and commanded the people, 'When you see the ark of the covenant of the Lord your God being carried by the Levitical priests, then you shall set out from your place. Follow it, so that you may know the way you should go, for you have not passed this way before. Yet there shall be a space between you and it, a distance of about two thousand cubits; do not come any nearer to it." (NRSVUE)

The new generation of Israelites were ready to cross over into the Promised Land with Joshua leading them forward to their new homes. The tribal leaders gave instructions for the people to keep their eyes fixed on the tangible sign of God's presence (The Ark) and follow the way they were led because they were pilgrims going to a new place by way of new paths.

Like them, as we begin 2024 we too are headed to our Promised Land of Heaven under the leadership of our Joshua, the Lord Jesus. (Perhaps you remember that Joshua and Jesus are essentially the same name and mean "God is deliverance.") Like they followed the Ark, we are to follow the Holy Spirit as He leads us because we face new uncharted territory since we, too, are pilgrims passing through this world (see I Peter 2:11). And it seems to me that we have never faced more confusing times and therefore need clear guidance as never before.

One of the best ways to ensure we keep to the path and keep heading to our homeland is to gather with God's people for public worship and instruction. So, we invite you to join us every Sunday at 4 pm in the Koinonia Room to praise, pray and hear preaching from Scripture. As you likely know, the word "koinonia" means fellowship or the sharing of common ground and that is our goal each Lord's Day to be like "fellows in the same ship" (one way to remember the meaning of fellowship) benefiting from one another's encouragement. Our service on the last day of 2023 will stay with the Christmas theme, since Epiphany is just six days later, and serve to point us onward with our eyes fixed on Jesus!

THE GIFT



Depending upon the Bible version you search, there are 100 - 200 plus times that the word hope is mentioned. And let's not forget the well over 1000

or the thousands of other promises written to spark our hope. Below are just a handful of some of them I like.

"For surely I know the plans I have for you, says the Lord, plans for your welfare and not for harm, to give you a future with hope." [Jeremiah 29:11]

10 "For the mountains may depart and the hills be removed, but my steadfast love shall not depart from you, and my covenant of peace shall not be removed, says the Lord, who has compassion on you." - Isaiah 54:10 NRSV

²⁸ "Come to me, all you who are weary and are carrying heavy burdens, and I will give you rest. 29 Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. 30 For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light." - Matthew 11:28-30 NRSV

⁶ "Be strong and bold; have no fear or dread of them, because it is the Lord your God who goes with you; he will not fail you or forsake you." - Deuteronomy 31:6 NRSV

How do we take those words of encouragement, promise - and hope - and turn them into having real hope in our daily lives? Sometimes it seems a little hard to get out of our own way. In early December Pastor Fred preached a sermon on Hope. He told the story of a young girl at the airport, in tears and devastated because she had lost her plane ticket and had no money to get home. She finally stood up, after several hours, to go eat with kind strangers who offered to buy her a meal. And to her surprise she'd been sitting on her ticket the whole time!

Pastor Fred aptly reminded us that often during times of despair, we are sitting on our hope, it's right there, waiting to be discovered, but we aren't looking in the right places. He further told us that when our hope fails us, God is with us... and about that time his prop up there behind him that said "HOPE", fell over onto the table. Hilarious timing amidst his sermon, how fitting

that was. What a reminder to us to stay strong in our

Although not hilarious to us at all when it happens, there are times in our lives when our hope falls. Our faith, thus our hope, wavers. But as Pastor Fred said, "Hope is the fuel that powers faith forward... unless Hope is re-kindled, you are dead before you die".

times peace and rest are used synonymously with hope; One of my favorite Christmas movies is Fallen Angel. A mother tells her young blind daughter about the wonderful Christmas they are going to have, describing the trip as "Maine is going to be full of 'live over' days, days so wonderful you want to live them over." Have you ever had "live over" days? Would you like more? When the candle of hope was lit in church this past Sunday, my husband looked at me and whispered "And in order to keep Hope, it's our job to keep the candle lit."

> That was a reminder to me that in this new year it's up to me to remember to look for hope in unusual places, not to sit on it and totally miss it, to keep the candle lit...to discover more "live over" days! Remember, today is a gift, that's why it's called the present.

Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year! I hope everyone had a restful, family and fun-filled, inspiring Christmas. First of all, I'd like to thank everyone who attended the Christmas concert this past December, we very much enjoyed presenting it to you and thank you so much for your generous support! As we're now in the peak season here at Gold Canyon UMC, I hope we'll see you at more of our upcoming musical events! There are a number of things of interest coming up in the next few months.

First of all, the Gold Canyon Arts Council will be presenting the Hutchins Consort on **Friday**, **January 12th** at **7:00pm**. **The Hutchins Consort** is a group of consummate musicians who perform on eight-scaled violins designed and built by famed luthier Dr. Carleen Hutchins. The instruments are the first successful attempt to create an acoustically balanced set of instruments that sound truly like violins across the entire musical range and provide a unique musical and artistic experience! Tickets are available from goldcanyonarts.org/tickets, the Apache Junction Chamber of Commerce, or Robin Rotella Team Realtors.

The "Sunday Sounds Series" will resume this month on **Sunday, January 14th after the 9:30 service.** You'll hear a variety of organ music and there will be an opportunity to discuss the organ project, the pipe organ, and music in general. As always, you're encouraged to find a seat that sounds best to you!

The GCUMC Performing Arts Series will also continue this month on January 21st at 2:00pm where we will be featuring esteemed American concert violinist Andrew Sords with celebrated collaborative pianist Elizabeth DeMio. DeMio has performed as soloist with the Orquesta Sinfonica de Veracruz and the Orquesta de la UNAM in Mexico, and her appearance with Cleveland's Blue Water Chamber Orchestra resulted in the Plain Dealer's Donald Rosenberg declaring - "a superb interpreter of Mozart". She has appeared in over 100 concerts annually and performs frequently with renowned soloists such as David Requiro, Massimo La Rosa, and Andrew Sords. Sords himself maintains a heavy schedule of touring with his piano trio and as soloist with orchestras. His performances have been cited for combining visceral virtuosity and ravishing tone, while international critics have endorsed Sords as "a fully formed artist" (Kalisz-Poland News), "utterly radiant" (Canada's Arts Forum), and "exceptionally heartfelt and soulful" (St. Maarten's Daily Herald). Sords has performed overseas with the National Symphony of Guatemala, as well as in Toronto, Montreal, Vancouver, Los Angeles, Palm Springs, and numerous other venues with concerti by Beethoven, Mozart, Mendelssohn, Bologne, Wieniawski, and others. It will certainly be a star-studded event here in Gold Canyon, so be sure to arrive early to get your seats. Doors will open 30 minutes prior to the concert.

If you are still hankering for arts and music by the end of January, the Gold Canyon Arts Council will be hosting the annual **Gold Canyon Arts Festival** on **Saturday, January 27th** from **9:00am to 4:00pm** on the Gold Canyon UMC Campus. It is a one-day event featuring a juried art show, musical groups performing throughout the day and a variety of food vendors. Last year, over five thousand people attended to peruse the art work of 85 artists and to listen to five musical groups. Many participating artists say this is the best one-day art show held in the state. Admission and parking are free so come enjoy a great day.

FOOD BANK



The volunteers at the GCUMC Food Bank ministry extend their best wishes to all in the New Year!

Now that we've said our farewell to 2023 we can share a more accurate view of the families and individuals we served

throughout year and their demographics. the Approximately 10,000 individuals were served during all documented visits in 2023, representing a 25% increase over 2022. We anticipate a further increase in 2024 based on the pace of applications received at year-end. During 2023, there was a noticeable increase in food assistance family unit. For example, a family with 2 adults and 2 requests from single-person households — primarily children is typically provided the following basics: elderly and from very large extended family units.

For those who are unfamiliar with the GCUMC Food Bank ministry, the infrastructure of the Food Bank comprises about one-third of the Mission Building and includes restaurant-quality walk-in refrigeration, and preparation and storage areas. The Food Bank is operated by 45 volunteers (including managers), and each week approximately 100 hours of volunteer time is required to maintain a seamless operation. The Food Bank is primarily supported by food and cash donations from the local community.












GCUMC Food Bank clients are allowed to visit the Food Bank twice per month. Once a client registers, their data is entered into the computer system, and they are provided with provisions based on the characteristics of their

- One TEFAP bag (federal government provided food assistance) - it varies but might contain rice, beans, pasta, tuna, nuts, etc.
- One bag of our community donated staples typically some combination of canned goods (beans, fruit, meat, tomato products, vegetables, soup), pasta, side dishes, macaroni and cheese, ramen and miscellaneous donated goods
- One bag of frozen meat, milk and bread purchased with community cash donations

- Peanut butter and cereal, as available
- Produce (when received in reasonable condition)
- Bottled water (summer only)

The Food Bank is indebted to the generosity of our local benevolent organizations, HOAs and businesses that conduct food drives, our local grocery stores, local residents and of course, our congregation. We wish there was no need for what we do... but until that day comes, we thank all of our donors for their generous support of this ministry!



HABITAT FOR HUMANITY



We have completed another successful season of participating in the building and funding of a Habitat home here in the East Valley. The dedication of the Pelosi home at 3710 S. Roosevelt St. has been delayed due

to infrastructure issues with the city of Tempe. We will keep you posted.

Our church has now joined forces with the Southeast Valley Lutheran Coalition, which has started building their 28th home. It will be the 18th build Gold Canyon UMC has helped build since 2007.

The project is a new build in the Don Carlos area of Tempe, the same area where we built this last winter/spring season. The SEVL Coalition is very well funded and has already raised about half of the funds needed for the build. We have pledged to contribute \$10,000 again this year, and hope to exceed that goal.



The support provided by you through GCUMC helps to bring a brighter future, a happy new year, to those who are served by our missions and missionaries. Lisa Armstrong (Honduras), Fred Curry (Costa Rica, Brazil, US), those working undercover (undisclosed location), and Mobility Worldwide share the love of Christ in locations of special need. Fellowman International provides health and dental services, as well as agricultural sustainability projects like protein production (chicken, eggs and pork) and community gardens to assist those living in the remote mountain areas of Honduras. Food parcels including eggs and fresh produce are delivered by Rice and Beans in Costa Rica and Brazil. RabMin also supports students with school supplies and uniforms. Mobility Worldwide provides hand-powered carts around the world to those who would otherwise be marginalized by their physical limitations and inability to self-transport.



Working undercover, medical workers share God's love through their services and in private conversations whenever possible. In many ways and in many places God's name will be glorified in the New Year through these continuing outreach efforts.

FRONTERA DE CRISTO MISSION TRIP



Seven of us took an extraordinary and exploratory trip to Frontera Cristo de in Agua Prieta. Under the caring direction

of Mark Adams and his wife, Miriam Escobar, we were immersed into their multifold ministry as we learned about borders in general, prayed at the wall, talked with migrants in a shelter, joined in the weekly community prayer vigil on the street, where we named those who had died in the desert, shared Bible study with the Frontera de Cristo staff and another Bible study with a group from CATPSIC – a drug rehab center of "addicts helping addicts" under "The Tree of Life" in the desert, trudged a mile through the desert, and much more. We were humbled by the ministries of a variety of faiths as they serve with hearts of compassion those escaping violence and corrupt authorities.—submitted by Pastor Katharine Keller


