I recently reviewed the letters that Jesus Christ sent via the Apostle John to the seven churches in Asia Minor (see Rev. chapters 2 and 3). I was struck yet again with the message that Jesus sent to Ephesus. This church is commendable in so many ways. They were doctrinally orthodox, busy in Christian service, highly ethical and perseverant under pressure. But, they had one problem – they had, as Jesus phrased it "forsaken their first love." Essentially, the congregation had grown apathetic about their spiritual life as individuals and as an assembly. Even though Jesus taught us that our first love is to love God with all of our heart, soul, mind and strength, it is all too

easy to forsake our first love and forget this priority in our lives. To forestall this, we must stoke the fires of spiritual passion by availing ourselves of our own daily devotional time as well regular corporate worship. Just like the coals of a fire in close proximity to one another allow a flame to erupt more readily, so being with one another to worship, pray and hear Scripture explained and applied keeps us spiritually aglow.

It is somewhat ironic that in the month of February 2024 that Valentine's Day coincides with Ash Wednesday. What greater way to celebrate God's Love than on Valentine's day. I don't know how often this occurs but it's worth noting that there is no greater love than this. In researching when it has happened or when it will happen again, I found from the Researchers at the Center for Applied Research in the Apostolate that it last occurred in 1945 and that it will happen once again in 2029 and then in 2096 it was also noted that Ash Wednesday will fall on February 29 and it will be the first time that has occurred in the church's history.

Valentine's Day is a special day for many as it celebrates, as with Dian and me the love we have shared for nearly 40 years. But on this Valentine's Day we will also and more importantly celebrate the start of Lent and the 40 day



#### POWER OF PRAYER

There is a social media site that comes up in my feed life is serving up for them. Could this be because we've every now and then called @TrustGodBro. Recently it forgotten how to make room for Jesus every day? held this -

"Once a man was asked, 'what did you gain by regularly praying to God?' The man replied 'nothing but let me tell you what I lost: anger, ego, greed, depression, insecurity, and fear.' Sometimes, the answer to our prayers is not gaining but losing, which ultimately is the gain."

For me, the above was powerful. And although all the emotions, or senses, apply to me at times, the last three really hit home – depression, insecurity, and fear. This friend has certainly had her share of worry, trouble, and daily challenges, yet she remains incredibly positive, hopeful, and faithful. Faith. As Christians, it is a term we use quite a bit, but sometimes it is hard to know when frantic human actions should end, and you just simply move forward quietly in faith. Last autumn, after a demanding summer season at the Food Bank, some looked around at

the diminished inventory and estimated how long we could serve our clients at the existing level of support. Others with more experience said, have faith... we will be supported in our mission as we always have been. Literally, moments after that interaction a gentleman knocked at the door of the food bank with a substantial donation. By the end of the day, a benevolent association brought us all the turkeys we could hope to deliver to families on Thanksgiving and later returned with a very large monetary donation. The extraordinary generosity of the community has continued, and we are so grateful. For a couple of us, it is a lesson to strengthen our faith in this mission.

The month of January has been interesting. Some days we have three times the number of clients we had the day before. It is a bit curious and makes it hard to plan resourcing but so far, all the volunteers seem willing to




(cheerfully) 'go with the flow'. We still anticipate and are planning that we will serve at least 10,000 individuals documented visits as we did last year.

Join us at 10:30am (fellowship at 10am) on Sat., February 17th as we hear from the seven women who travelled to






