### KITCHEN VOLUNTEERS THANK YOU LUNCH


In April we honored our valued and appreciated Coffee Fellowship volunteers who serve weekly to bring our churchgoers refreshments after worship.

# ON A PASTORAL NOTE

On Maundy Thursday I used a quote from a writing by Richard P. McBrien:

### The Heart of Christian Virtue

"If love is the soul of Christian existence, it must be at the heart of every other Christian virtue. Thus, for example, justice without love is legalism; faith without love is ideology; hope without love is self-centeredness; forgiveness without love is self-abasement; fortitude without love is recklessness; generosity without love is extravagance; care without love is mere duty; fidelity without love is servitude. Every virtue is an expression of love. No virtue is really a virtue unless it is permeated, or informed, by love."

Jesus was asked the question by a lawyer (Matthew 22:36-39) "Teacher, which commandment in the law is the greatest? And Jesus answered: 'You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind.' This is the greatest and first commandment. And a second is like it: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.'

This is also the position which John Wesley wrote of in his writings on "An Altogether Christian." From the book "Cultivating Christlikeness: Loving as Jesus Loved" by Paul W. Chilcote: "The first thing implied in being altogether Christian is the love of God. The Bible says: 'Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength.' This kind of love captures the whole heart, takes up all the affections, fills the entire capacity of the soul, and uses every gift to its fullest extent. The heart of this disciple continually cries out, 'My Lord and my God. What else do I have in heaven but you? Since I have you, what else could I want on earth?' Secondly, altogether Christians love their neighbor. If anyone asks, 'Who is my neighbor?' we reply, 'Every person who is in the world; every child of God.' Neither can we exclude our

Paul's description of it in 1 Corinthians 13."

As I wrote in last month's Road Runner Article, I spoke of intolerance. Clearly, if we look at what John Wesley writes about "the altogether Christian" we need to strongly consider the following question: "If love is the goal, what are the areas of your life that require more of your work and more of God's grace for you to be as fully loving as possible?"

### REST



ľve had some family stressors these past couple 8. of years. ("Ha you say, who doesn't?!") Recently, one had gotten significant enough that it seemed to be consuming a great deal of my time, thoughts, and worries.

do you do? I pray and try to use the gifts God gave me to tackle the problem. But once I reach the end of my skill set in a matter, prayer and giving up the problem completely to God is the true and final answer. Even then – I hate to admit this, I fear it means my faith is not strong enough - I may struggle to settle into the peace I should have.

I think sometimes that's because I have trouble identifying the emotions or feelings I'm actually having surrounding a matter. Pastor Rick Warren recently did a devotional series on hopelessness. And my first thoughts were "hhhmmm, I'll read this one, but I don't think I've often really felt hopeless, so this one doesn't apply to me." You see, I had assigned the definition of hopeless as meaning the worst of the worst, if you were hopeless, it meant things were so bad you might even consider ending your life. But that's not what I learned.

Pastor Warren made the assertion that you can't fix a problem or even properly pray about it until you name it, until you understand exactly what emotion you are feeling and why. He broke down these thoughts into 8 reasons we feel hopelessness:

- exceeds your skills and abilities.
- Feeling you've hit bottom; you can't go any lower.
- 3. Feeling out of control, everything is turning around
- 4. Feeling overwhelmed and helpless, powerless to change the situation.
- Feeling rejected or lonely, God is millions of miles away.

- 6. Feeling remorse or regret.
- Feeling crushing fear, being scared to death.
- Feeling trapped, locked behind bars, forever.

Aaaahhhhh, I said to myself! I then ran a current situation through that little 8 feeling test, and realized I easily had 4 of the 8 going on. So, I indeed WAS feeling hopeless about that situation, but didn't recognize it. That realization flipped a switch of sorts for me. Now that I had a tangible name for some of my feelings, I was able to re-frame my prayers, more directly and When that happens, what specifically addressing the problem with God. I found a renewed sense of peace with that.

> But just because the switch flipped for me, maybe it doesn't for you. We are all built very differently. In an April service, our very own Dr. David Worley gave an analogy using the recent solar eclipse. He said it kind of like this - "Sometimes life is like the eclipse, full of darkness, blocking the light." But when we take it to the Lord in prayer, we are demonstrating the ultimate faith. We believe that God will fulfill His promises, even though we don't see them coming to fruition yet.

Corrie Ten Boom, a survivor of the Nazi death camps, once said, "If you look at the world, you'll be distressed. If you look within, you'll be depressed. If you look at God, you'll be at rest." She was able to find promise and hope in the darkest of places. But we aren't always able to do that; left to our own devices, we sometimes let our faith slip during a dark time.

If you are struggling with looking at the world, or within, rather than to God to find rest, then please reach out to one of GCUMC's 4 Pastors, who are adept at listening! They minister to members and friends of Gold Canyon UMC. Please simply call the church office Feeling you are in over your head; your situation at 480-982-3776 and one of them will respond to your request. After hours, you may call or email one of the pastors directly. 
Our 1st quarter 2024 client analysis was a bit surprising! We learned that despite having more single person and older couples come to our door, we are actually serving more total individuals in larger families (especially children) than seniors, which is why we are almost out of peanut butter!

Hence, we are making May 'Peanut Butter Month'! I think most of you can remember the comfort of a peanut butter and jelly sandwich – and may still! It is a staple that will not spoil easily, and most people (not all) are able to tolerate. Children will be out of school

soon and may not have access to the provided breakfast and lunch meals they receive there. We want to substitute a quick alternative for a child that is safe to prepare and full of nutrition. 


