



OPERATOR'S MANUAL



Andy Griffith show when a character played by Buddy Ebsen told Andy he should just let Opie "decide for himself" how he wanted to live ... Andy had these words of wisdom: "No, I'm afraid it don't work that way. You can't let a young'n decide for himself. He'll grab at

the first flashy thing with shiny ribbons on it. Then, when he finds out there's a hook in it, it's too late. Wrong ideas come packaged with so much glitter that it's hard to convince 'em that other things might be better in the long run. All a parent can do is say 'wait' and 'trust me' and try to keep temptation away."

During a June service in a tiny church in Red River, NM, the Pastor talked about finding the Operator's Manual for his old 2006 Ski Doo and sitting down to read it on a boring, rainy day. He was amazed at how much good information was in there, and wished he'd read it cover to cover years before, as it would have saved him much heartache when he was running around the mountains in the winter! And, you guessed it, he then compared the manual to the Bible.

We have that beautiful operator's guide to life at our fingertips, yet we often let it sit and collect dust! Or, we simply choose to ignore it and act like that young'n Andy Griffith was talking about in 1961 - we are attracted to those flashy things with shiny ribbons on them, or the wrong ideas packaged with copious amounts of glitter. We want to do what we want to do right now; we want to decide for ourselves and take a series of shortcuts through life. We get sucked into the shiny things of this world and miss the entire point, sometimes until it's too late.

This cute little drawing on My Plan vs. God's Plan is a pretty powerful image isn't it? It lays out clearly what I think many of us visualize when we "decide for ourselves" - we see that straight line to a perfect life. We see so vividly what those shiny things can do for us and we think "I've got this!" What we fail to see though, is by ignoring God's operator's manual

(reminder – The Bible!), by giving in to temptation to shortcut, not waiting, not trusting in Him - we help I was recently reminded of an create more of those pitfalls or valleys in the depiction of God's Plan.

> Now, no matter what, we aren't going to go through life in that straight line with no valleys or lows. We'll never be perfect and even when we studiously read and attempt to follow God's plan lain out in the Bible, we won't get it completely right. We're human after all. We are destined for some of those lows in our lives, as those are the times God is teaching us patience and needs us to learn something from our circumstances. But, how we respond to those lessons and how we use what we've learned can help mitigate future lows.

If we are well into our 50's, 60's, 70's, 80's, etc. yet still handling things like children, or a "young'n" as Andy said, how can we expect any different outcomes? The Bible says in Job 32:7, "The longer you live, the wiser you become." (MSG). Pastor Rick Warren recently said in a devotional, "That verse is a possibility, not a promise. I know a lot of people who are old and dumb. Wisdom does not automatically come with age. Maturity happens when you extract meaning from the everyday experiences of life and as you begin to apply biblical wisdom to the way you live each day."

MISSIONS MOMENT



There is an anointing on the people called Gold Canyon United Methodist Church that my husband David and I have attended since the first Sunday we met in Gold Canyon Elementary School. There aren't many of us left

from those days of setting up chairs every Sunday in the school cafeteria! We've spent the last few decades growing and changing as individuals, and as a church body, but the anointing on the people of this congregation has not changed. God has called us and for more than 30 years this church has answered the call Jesus gave to Peter, summarized here but recorded in John 21:15-17.

Do you love me? Feed my lambs.

Do you love me? Take care of my sheep.

Do you love me? Feed my sheep.

It was more than 30 years ago that my new, little family came from other faith traditions to this fledgling United Methodist congregation to find a church home. And who knew that at a United Methodist Women's training event I would hear the voice of God call to me – "Colette! Feed my lambs. Colette! Take care of my sheep. Colette! Feed my sheep."

You do not have much of a choice when you hear the voice of God call your name. What an honor. What a responsibility. And so, after a long conversation with then



Pastor David McPherson, I became the Chairperson of Local Missions Ministries for the United Methodist Church in Gold Canyon.

As I step away from my volunteer position of more than 30 years, I'd like to share some of the journey. Most names are omitted because I am terrible at remembering names... And if I name some and remember others... jeesh!

You've heard that our first special collection for missions was milk money for the children of the elementary school. I think we had 13 people attending regularly that spring. The winter folks had returned home. But we set a goal and reached it.

Our first Christmas Angel event served 2 families from the school with a total of 4 children. We wrapped the presents on my dining room table. Compare that to the crazy controlled chaos of the wrapping parties that would come to pass in later years... even in a pandemic! Now 32 years later we'll need a new team to lead this ministry. Someone will get the call. Many "someones" will feel a tug or a pull to step up. Answer that call!

We first heard of the Genesis Project when a GCUMC member came to Pastor Fred to ask if we could be part of a group feeding the hungry at an independent Bible Church in Apache Junction. It started with contributing money from Local Missions donations and asking members to volunteer, to cook and serve meals. The meals program moved to several places and nearly failed to continue a couple of times. And then people answered the call, the tug, the pull. Some to be workers, some to be leaders, some to be civic advocates. Now the Genesis project is more than a meal program. People with ideas and skills have worked together to create a resource center for Jesus' flock. But it was Buster who came to Pastor Fred with

the original idea. Act on God's pushes, pulls, tugs. Answer the call.

Someone answered a call to start these and many other ministries for the people of our church:

- Backpacks for School Children
- Citrus Gleaning Program
- Food boxes for school breaks
- Habitat for Humanity
- Honey Do Ministry
- Native American Ministries
- Quilters
- Ronald McDonald House
- Sidewalk Sunday School
- Sofie's Start
- St. Andrew's Clinic
- Tax Preparation Help

Our first Food Bank was one of the closets in the Koinonia Room. People had come to the new church building asking for help with diaper, wipes, soup, crackers etc. ... So the Church Council decided to take the plunge and ask the congregation to support this, our first ongoing commitment to the community, to have an emergency pantry (not food bank status). One of our members built cubbies for storage of donations that we brought up to the front on Communion Sundays. Then we had a small foodbank in the sanctuary building and then moved to the Missions Center across form the church. Each team that has run the food bank brought more growth and affiliations; more help for those in need. Every team stepped forward because they felt they were called.

In times of need, it is easy to focus on our own struggles and challenges. However, it is during these times that our true strength and compassion can shine through. The people of GCUMC donated more than \$90,000 to help families stay together during the pandemic. I was so privileged to administer those funds for you to help 30 families. You, this church, answered the call. Feed my Lambs. Care for my sheep. Feed my sheep. Build a playground for special needs children - check. Provide funds for children to go to church camp – check. Send the youth on a summer project - check. Go cook with a team for Ronald McDonald House families – check. Bring a donation for the food bank, bring a gift for the Angel Tree, donate money to help provided utility help in the sweltering summer - check, check, check.

The Bible has over 2,000 verses that mention helping the poor, including orphans, widows, immigrants, and the helpless. Whether it is through volunteering our time, donating resources, or simply offering a kind word, each of us has the power to make a positive impact on the lives of others. Together, we can continue to be a community built on love, kindness, and generosity.

These past thirty plus years have been an incredible journey. I have witnessed firsthand the strength and resilience of the human spirit, and the unwavering love that binds families, churches together.

God calls those with fresh perspectives, new ideas, and different approaches to be brought into service. Answering the call can present unexpected opportunities for growth, transformation, and renewal. Embrace the possibilities that change, with trust and openness to God's plan, can bring to your life. God's plan for you to care for the flock may be an old idea revisited, an old ministry rekindled, or something new that has been on your mind for a while.

Did you know there is a woman in our congregation who goes unheralded into hospice facilities to sing hymns to patients? Just an idea she had for years and finally acted on it. Now she feels part of that community.

God's power, wisdom, and grace can be revealed in unexpected ways. Create space for God to work wonders, bring about new blessings, growth, and opportunities to deepen your relationship with God and your fellow sheep.

I'll still be around. Looking for new opportunities to serve. God has not yet said I could stop.

FOOD BANK



Sometimes we are asked 'how do you know people aren't just taking advantage of free food', 'how do you know their need is real?'. Well, we talk with our clients. Clients fill out forms and often (not always) share how they got to this point. If we are bamboozled


occasionally, then so be it. Very often clients painfully explain their need for our help. Sometimes words aren't necessary – we can clearly see their need.

Believe it or not, most people prefer to purchase their own food rather than take what we have available to give them on any given day. We noticed a dramatic drop in need during the pandemic when people were receiving subsidies. Now, virtually every day we are adding new households to our database... in May we served just shy of 1000 individuals and June is looking to be much the same. At the same time, thankfully, some others have stopped needing our assistance... the client base remains fluid as people experience and then conquer life's struggles.

Recently we discovered the bigger question we should all be asking is 'do you know if your neighbor is hungry?'. Literally within a short walk of the Mission Center and GCUMC we discovered profound need. Quietly hungry ... too humbled, maybe stunned by the change in their circumstances to ask for help. Our guess is that this is not an isolated situation and definitely one we would like to bring awareness to ... particularly with the elderly... particularly when there has been a loss and once adequate income is diminished, when health needs and expenses increase or have depleted their resources, when summertime utilities consume a now even smaller fixed income.

Neighbors are those that God puts in our path as well as those next-door. Folks don't need to be approaching starvation to get assistance. Some, especially the elderly, are doing without, cutting back and being pushed uncomfortably toward the 'edge'. Please let people you suspect are in need know that the GCUMC Food Bank is a resource during those difficult times.

Above all, we thank you for your continued support that makes our congregation's mission to feed those in need possible. Without your help we know of many people who would have recently experienced hunger.






