

PRAISING THOSE WHO LABOR

Come to me, all you who are weary and carrying heavy burdens and I will give you rest. --Matthew 11:28

Traditionally, Labor Day has been perceived as the last day of summer. Growing up in the south, it was always the last day of freedom before school began, the following day. Labor Day is the first Monday of September. Once every 6 years, Labor Day falls on my birthday, September 6th. Whenever Labor Day would fall on my birthday, as a child my late father (God rest his soul) would tell me, David, everyone is out of work today to celebrate your birthday. Baseball games are being played during the day today, because of your birthday. Parades and keynote speakers are giving speeches today, because of your birthday. I will remember his kind words, forever.

In my opinion, Labor Day is much more than my birthday; it is a day to celebrate blue collar workers and all who labor for our well-being. Quite often, those who labor do not get enough recognition and appreciation for all that they do. It is important to celebrate those U.S. workers who labor to make life easier for many of us. By celebrating Labor Day, we celebrate those who labor on our behalf, and we give thanks for those who work and sweat in very challenging and difficult vocations. This year, Labor Day will fall on Monday, September 2nd, and the church office will be closed to honor those who labor.

Jesus also recognized the need for rest which stemmed from the heavy demands of Christian discipleship. During the Greco-Roman Empire the governing systems that affected lives and lifestyles of the masses, often followed the Roman Empire and not the empire of heaven, which Christ was attempting to reveal. Since Caesar declared himself Lord of church and state, the religious officials were often afraid that not following Caesar's policies and demands could place them in prison or even get them killed. By declaring himself Lord, Jesus immediately became a threat to Caesar and the Roman Empire. For Christ's followers, to be caught in between the fear from not following Caesar's demands and the fear of not following Christ's mission, must have been mentally and emotionally exhausting. For anyone who has ever been triangulated between two competing forces, you realize how exhausting this can be.

Jesus recognizes that following his mission and his vision is exhausting work. This is why he said to his followers, "Come to me, all you who are weary and carrying heavy burdens and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me, for I am gentle in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light." (Matthew 11:28-30). Christianity has always been a counter-cultural movement. So, following the mission and visions of Christ is still very difficult work. It is much easier to

follow the crowd than to go out on a limb for Jesus Christ. Our Lord and Savior promises us that being his disciple may not be easy; however, he still has the ability to calm our restless hearts and souls. Happy Labor Day, everyone!



It's difficult to believe that it is already September! Here in Maine, the children are returning to school after Labor Day; the summer tourists are leaving, and replacing them will be what we refer to, in Maine, as "the leaf peepers" who will come to enjoy the beautiful fall colors. It is a wonderful time of year here. The temperatures are cool and crisp, with a few days of Indian Summer mixed in, and folks are beginning to harvest crops of potatoes in northern Maine, Sileage corn to feed the cows, and all the garden produce to be canned. Here on the coast of Maine, boats are being taken out of the water and put in storage. Lobstermen and women are preparing their boats and traps to start fishing "outside," which simply means further out in the ocean, and last but not least, the water will be turned off to all the summer cottages come the first part of October. Here in Maine, life will slow down, while in Florida and Arizona, life will be speeding up with the return of snowbirds.



It is, in many ways, like life itself. Life ebbs and flows with the changing seasons. In Ecclesiastes 3:1-15 we often focus on the first 8 verses, that for everything there is a season. But if we read further, we find so much more about life. That which we know and that which we do not know. It's the God-given task. Read what it says: "9 What gain have the workers from their toil? 10 I have seen the business that God has given to everyone to be busy with. 11 He has made everything suitable for its time; moreover, he has put a sense of past and future into their minds, yet they cannot find out what God has done from the beginning to the end. 12 I know that there is nothing better for them than to be happy and enjoy themselves as long as they live; 13 moreover, it is God's gift that all should eat and drink and take pleasure in all their toil. 14 I know that whatever God does endures forever; nothing can be added to it nor anything taken from it; God has done this so that all should stand in awe before him. 15 That which is already has been, that which is to be already is, and God seeks out what has gone by."

Think about this and ponder what it has been like in your own life. The seasons of life are just that seasons. We reflect on what, where and when in life and then look to what might be in the future. We obviously don't know what the future holds for us but we are assured that God is always with us. In our past, He has forgiven our sins and encouraged us, through His Son and our Savior, Jesus Christ, to live our lives according to His Word. God will take care of the rest, for God wants us to enjoy the life we have and to be thankful for all that has been. It doesn't mean that life is always joyful, for we all have burdens that we bear. We all have trials and tribulations, as

Ecclesiastes says, for everything there is a season. Too often, though, we worry about life. Remember the words of Jesus in Matthew 6:25-34; titled "Do not Worry" and here is just a portion of that passage:

"31 Therefore do not worry, saying, 'What will we eat?' or 'What will we drink?' or 'What will we wear?' 32 For it is the gentiles who seek all these things, and indeed your heavenly Father knows that you need all these things. 33 But seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well. 34 "So do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will bring worries of its own. Today's trouble is enough for today."

How true is this? In this season of life, whether we are young or old, we are to live life with faith in God's promise that He will always be with us.
