I'M CAMPAIGNING FOR KINDNESS!

We have distributed about 120 signs so far during our "Campaign for Kindness." I know of two families who showed up at the office wanting to know more about our church because of signs seen in their neighbors' yards. A couple of nonchurch people bought some

signs because they thought the time was right for kindness. One church member was kindly challenging his HOA when he was told to remove his sign. He posted the story to nextdoor.com, and there were a lot of positive comments supporting his "Kindness" sign.

A phrase commonly known as the Golden Rule simply states, "Do unto others as you would have them do unto you." A version of this teaching can be found in almost every major religion. This universal rule has the power to bring people together.

Do Unto Others is a grassroots movement launched by Resurrection, a United Methodist Church in the Kansas City area, to encourage people to be intentional about treating one another with kindness, even those with whom we disagree. A vote for kindness is a step toward overcoming the polarization in our country through civility and respect.

If kindness and love are to return to our community, Christians must lead the way by saying no to division, hatred, and slander. Even though we have different political views, we can love each other. I will see you on Sunday.

THE WORLD AT OUR TABLE

The apostles said "Increase our faith!" The Lord replied, "If you had faith the size of a mustard seed, you could say to this mulberry tree, 'be uprooted and planted in the sea,' and it would obey you. –Luke 17:5-6

When I was a child, my family ate together every evening. My mother would often pick up the dinner dishes following our meal. I always loved it when my mother would say, keep your fork, because I knew that she had prepared dessert for us. Desert was always special at our home because my mother did not prepare it after every meal. I always felt rewarded and special whenever mom made us dessert.

In the Lukan pericope, notice the change in the disciple's description. They are no longer disciples; they are now apostles or those sent out on a mission. In Luke chapter 9, Jesus sends the disciples out on a mission to proclaim the Kingdom of God and to heal. These 12 disciples have been faithful to Jesus Christ through all their missions and their journeys together. Jesus begins this chapter by discussing a complete forgiveness and condemnation for anyone becoming an obstacle to someone else's faith (Luke 17:1-4). Immediately following this condemnation, the disciples exclaim, Increase our faith!

Do you know what it is like to be devoted and to not receive recognition or reward for your dedication? The common inclination is to think, If I have done what I am supposed to do, I should be rewarded or recognized. The interjection, Increase our faith! Is immediately met with a sharp resistant contrasting statement from Jesus, If you had faith the size of a mustard seed, you could say to this mulberry tree, 'be uprooted and planted in the sea,' and it would obey you.

As Christ's followers, we often think that if we live a good, honest, moral, and ethical existence, we should be rewarded for our Christ-centered behaviors and lifestyle. That is, I should not be plagued by cancer, or Alzheimer's, or Parkinsons, because I have been a good human being. While the parable of the worthless servant (Luke 17:7-10) is an unappealing parable to the masses, it does cause us to contemplate our relationship with God. Do we expect God to reward us for being good Christians? Do we expect to die of old age in our sleep without the possibility of disease or illness because of our godliness? Do we expect special treatment? God does not owe us a thing and we cannot assume that we are worthy of more than what we have received, based on our own achievements and individual merit.

On the other hand, God's grace is available to all. Grace cannot be earned, stored up, or sequestered, and none of us are deserving of special treatment! Spiritual health requires us to realize that none of us are entitled to extra portions of grace and that God loves the cancer victim as much as he loves the spiritual leader.

In the end, we are all sinners in need of divine grace. On the first Sunday of October, we celebrate World Communition Sunday. This is a celebration where the Christian Church Universal observes and participates in the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper. We come to the table as sinners and not as superiors. We come to the table as Christians devoted to our Lord and Savior. And we all come to the table in need of divine grace. And, as we arise from the table, we receive grace, through this divine sacrament. ~ David J. Harriss

YOUR TRUE PURPOSE



Do you ever wonder what your purpose is in life? Whether we are 20, 40, 60, 80 years of age or beyond, I think we have all cycled through phases in our lives where we wonder that very thing. We go through stages of complete contentment; periods of doubt, stumbling self-esteem or periods of misery; and days or months of being on top of the world.

During all these times there are glimpses, or years at a time, where everything clicks. We know exactly who we are, why we are here, why we are doing what we are doing, and that we are contributing in a meaningful way to everything and everyone around us. Then there are those periods where we don't have a clue. We can't figure out what we are supposed to be doing with our lives, what our next step is supposed to be, and there seems to be disarray all about. I recently read something similar to the below:

I asked out loud, "What is my purpose in life?" "What if I told you that you fulfilled it when you took an extra hour to talk to that kid about his life?" said a voice. "Or when you paid for that young couple in the restaurant? Or when you saved that dog in traffic? Or when you tied your father's shoes for him?" "Your problem is that you equate your purpose with goal-based achievement. God isn't interested in your achievements... just your heart. When you choose to act out of kindness, compassion and love, you are already aligned with your purpose. No need to look any further!"

Often, the culture of our world colors our views of where we should be and what we should be doing. Listening to the news, viewing social media messages, hearing others chatting in a restaurant, absorbing the opinions of family and friends — all of these things create an environment or culture surrounding us and sometimes it is not one in which we thrive. It can be disconcerting and leave us feeling as if we aren't fulfilling our purpose or that we somehow don't measure up. That's why the underlined portion above resonated with me. It drove the point home to me that the 'little things' are not only good enough, they are always the pinnacle toward which God wishes us to strive.

Keep in mind that the events of today and the discontentment and divisiveness we may witness around us, are not the first to be seen. Those walking before us have discovered the same feelings of unrest. Abraham Lincoln once said – "I have been driven many times to my knees, by the overwhelming conviction that I had nowhere else to go. My own wisdom, and that of all about me seemed insufficient for that day." Sometimes we forget the simplest, yet most powerful, thing we can do is pray. Pray, and remember the words in Matthew 7:12 – "In everything do to others as you would have them do to you..." During this busy fall season, with dissention and strong differences of opinion we may witness, let us strive to remember what our purpose in life really is.

FOOD BANK



Did you know there is a food bank hierarchy? The GCUMC Food Bank is part of the Feeding America organization. Our local distributor is United Food Bank (UFB). GCUMC Food Bank is considered an Agency Partner. There is some wonderful local history here – St.

Mary's Food Bank in Phoenix created the foundation for the current USA national food bank distribution structure (back in the 1970's) which has resulted in organizations like Feeding America that we are apart of.


Recently some volunteers and the manager of GCUMC Food Bank held an onsite meeting with our account representative from UFB. We learned that UFB is seeing a 160% increase in the number of individuals visiting food pantries like ours. The populations most affected: the elderly and students. If you find 'students' surprising, check out the food pantries they have on the ASU and UA campuses. Both demographics typically have lower fixed incomes and may also be burdened with debt.

The GCUMC Food Bank is only seeing a 25% increase when we compare January to July 2024 statistics. In the two most recent months, we served just under 1000

individuals each month. Keep in mind we are open 9 hours a week and not at the most convenient time of day or location, especially for working families. However, we are still serving a significant population of both young and old in our broader community.

The forced relocation of the Genesis Project in Apache Junction creates a potential for increasing our client volume. Even if this soup kitchen that serves 250+ daily can raise the money to transition to a church a mile away, there is the potential there will be a gap in service due to needed infrastructure work or complications receiving local or county approvals. We already serve a sizable client population from Apache Junction at our food bank. We need to begin to prepare for the potential of further impact to our services.

Thank you as always for your support. We will do our best to keep you updated as to how your generous donations are being used. Rest assured, all your monetary donations go into a designated fund that is strictly maintained and used for only Food Bank purposes. Lately, product donations are usually out the door right away. The overall community is truly blessed to have your support!





"BETTER TOGETHER" DESERT DINERS



Want to meet new friends and enjoy fellowship with one another outside of our church building? Here's your opportunity!

We are excited to kick off a new season of Desert Diners where you can get to know your church family by sharing a meal together either in your home or in a restaurant. If you have not participated before, here's how it works:

A group of 6-8 names (couples will be placed together as well as singles) are randomly chosen to share a meal together once a month.

The Congregational Life Team will initially coordinate the groups, and provide guidance and assistance as needed.

Your group will decide whether you want to meet for lunch or dinner either in your home or in a restaurant.

Host will provide the main course and guests will divide up who brings an appetizer, salad, dessert etc. If you choose to meet in a restaurant, the host will buy an appetizer or dessert.

The experience of sharing a meal together provides lifelong friends we might not have met otherwise and builds a strong church community. We hope you will enjoy the fun and fellowship together.


