Almost... Not Yet!

But who can endure the day of his coming, and who can stand when he appears? –Malachi 3:2

This year, Advent begins on Sunday, December 1st, 2024. Advent is a time of waiting and anticipation. It is a season of almost, but not yet! In Advent, we wait for the Lord in two ways:

- 1. Since Christ's birth occurred over 2,000 years ago, we wait in an anticipation of commemorating this divine birth of Jesus Christ on Christmas Day.
- 2. Since Christ has promised a 2nd Coming, we also wait on this arrival when Christ will come and cleanse the earth. Either way, Advent is a time of waiting for the Lord's presence.

My mother once told me, David, be careful what you wish for. It may come true! We have all heard this cliched statement before, haven't we? The scripture from Micah 3:1-4 is found during the second week of Advent, December 8th, 2024. Within this Scripture, Malachi, translated Mal' Iki (Hebrew), my messenger, is prophesying about a forthcoming presence of the Messiah. This scripture was created during the post-exilic period and the rebuilding of the Temple (516 BCE). Many prophets believed that a Messiah, an anointed one, would come into this world. The words of Isaiah (7:14, 9:6) and Micah (3:1, 5:2) prophesy that the Messiah would come into this world at some point in human history.

So, what would that look like? Would the appearance of the Messiah bring forth deliverance or judgment? Or, would this Messianic juxtaposition bring some of both? Were the people of Jerusalem ready for that presence? Are we ready to be in the presence of our Lord and Savior? The Scripture seems to expose both excitement and fear when the Messiah appears. As the prophet proclaims, "But who can endure the day of his coming, and who can stand when he appears?" That



is, this will be a day of deliverance and judgment? Are we ready? When the presence of the Lord appears, it will be a time of cleansing and refinement. One of my favorite quotes is that Christians are called to "afflict the comforted and comfort the afflicted." God's power in your life and in mine, is both comforting and disturbing. Anticipating the Lord's presence will be uplifting, and it will be alarming.

So, while we wait on the Lord's presence, we can spend some time this Advent season reflecting on our own spiritual journey. Are you and I in a place where we want to be as we await the Lord's presence in our lives? Have






CONGREGATIONAL CARE

Is it me, or has this year passed quickly so that we are now in Advent? A **season of Hope**, Love, Joy, and Peace. A time when we await the arrival of God's presence in our world. As a part of my advent journey, I've chosen a book by Kelley Nikondeha: "First Advent in *Palestine: Reversals, Resistance, and the Ongoing Complexity of Hope.*" It begins with a look at the Intertestamental Books of the Bible (the Apocrypha), which are not as familiar as the Old and New Testaments to most of us. During these 500+ years between the Old and the New, we find a lot of history that puts a much deeper meaning into Advent. It was during a time of great anguish for the Jewish people—a time of being conquered and greatly mistreated. Women and children were taken into slavery, and rebels were crucified. The second Temple was desecrated, the Eternal Flame was extinguished, bringing darkness and fear to the people of Israel, and there were great lamentations. One of the critical books is 1 and 2 Maccabees and Lamentations. It was a very dark time



for the people of Israel, and it's at this time we find the Israelites looking for God's presence with them.



This same theme has been seen repeatedly throughout history, with the rise and fall of empires, wars, and the injustices we see even today. In this context, I enter this Advent Season, which isn't just this brief time of the year. It is instead a time that is more than just the 4 weeks we spend in remembering God's presence with us and is indeed the whole year of seeking God's presence with us. We are called to be instruments: the hands, feet, and voice of God with us. We are to root out the social justices that have divided us into the haves and have-nots. It's feeding the hungry, visiting the sick, clothing the naked, and caring for the oppressed throughout this community, state, nation, and world.

Our presence, our gifts, and our service support such programs. Programs like the Angel Tree Ministry, Genesis Project (as they rebuild in the new location), House of Refuge, Frontera de Christo, the General Board of Global Ministries, UMCOR, and so many more. It's God's challenge to us, His call for us to do justice, walk humbly, love graciously, and, as Jesus said, "to Love the Lord our God with all our heart, mind, body, soul and strength, as well as our neighbors as ourselves."

I hope you will join me in seeing this world through the eyes of people longing for the Hope, Joy, Peace, and Love of this Advent Season. It is a time when we prepare to receive God's presence with us in new ways. Advent is not simply a season; it's a call to action, an action that becomes our life's calling. It speaks to us through the presence of Mary, Joseph, and an infant child who becomes the Light of the World, dispersing the darkness that we see in the time of the Maccabees and this world today.

MUSIC NOTES

The cool weather is here finally and Christmas is just a few short weeks away! I hope everyone has had a great year and will work together to make the next one even better. As we get into 'the season' when most of our musical activity occurs, there's a lot on our calendar:

First of all, the Gold Canyon Arts Council will be presenting **The Swingles** on Sunday, December 1st at 7:00pm. A talented vocal ensemble originally formed in Paris, 1962, the Swingles became one of the 20th century's most admired and beloved vocal groups. This second generation Swingles group will present a fabulous concert with a variety of songs, blending a classy style with natural ability and flair. The Swingles have earned five Grammy awards and multiple international accolades so they are sure to present an exciting performance. Tickets are available from goldcanyonarts.org/tickets, the Apache Junction Chamber of Commerce, or Robin Rotella Team Realtors.

Next, on Saturday, December 14th at 3:00 p.m., GCUMC will open the Gold Canyon UMC Performing Arts Series with our **Annual Christmas Concert**. The concert will be available both in person and online, but I encourage you to come in person for a better acoustical and community experience. Seats are limited so be sure to arrive early (doors open 30 minutes before). Concert music this year will feature most of GCUMC'S performing groups from choir to bells to band as well as the Sonoran Brass Quintet, guest instrumentalists, and stunning soloists. The concert is free admission but a free-will offering will be received to support our music ministries and the Gold Canyon UMC Performing Arts Series as a whole. If you are able, please bring a non-perishable food item for the GCUMC Food Bank as there are always those in need at Christmas. We hope to see you there!

The **"Sunday Sounds Series"** will be going on indefinite hiatus starting this month as the music ministry prepares for the Christmas Concert as well as the multiple Christmas Eve and Advent services. To hear some Christmas organ music, be sure to attend the annual Christmas concert as well as Christmas Eve services at 4:00 and 6:00pm on December 24th. There will be a short, 10-15 minute hymn-sing featuring some of your favorite Christmas carols prior to each service, so arrive early to get a good seat and sing some of your favorites with family and friends.

The music ministry also has an exciting announcement we'd like to share with you. At the end of October, the Gold Canyon UMC Administrative Council approved a plan for our church to begin a **Choral Scholar Program** as part of our music ministry outreach. Since both music and mission are such important aspects of worship and service at Gold Canyon UMC, the music ministry aims to grow both music and mission through the introduction of a Choral Scholar Program. As part of this program, we will engage four students (one for each choir section) to join our traditional music ministry as choral scholars. We will pursue a mission to educate these young musicians, as well as provide them a chance to develop their skills in a supportive setting. In addition, we'll pass on the traditions of sacred choral music to the next generation, in order to maintain a continuity that has lasted since the early church.

The four contracted college or university students will function as section leaders in our choir, helping to increase our overall musical ability and quality while also learning about the rich musical traditions of Methodism and the Christian church. We hope to provide a welcoming place to pass on the aforementioned traditions of sacred choral music, as well as to establish a Christian presence in young lives.

So, those of you reading may be thinking, "Okay, sounds great, I can't wait to hear what that all sounds like." Alas, it's not that easy. We'll need help from our generous congregation to make this program a

reality. GCUMC will offer each of the four successful scholar candidates (there will be an audition) a stipend for a full program year plus mileage if they meet specific requirements. If we can gather the necessary funding, we'll be trying out a pilot program in January that will be half the academic year (the spring semester) and with four scholars will cost approximately \$11,000 in total. If the pilot program is successful, we hope to later fund the program for the entire academic year. If you're interested in supporting this program, please make any donations to the church with the memo or notation 'Choral Scholars.' Thank you so much for your continued generosity.

We're hoping to move forward in the New Year with a number of projects and there will be more concerts to come, so stay tuned to the website, announcements, and newsletter. If you have any questions, reach out to Dr. Classe by phone, email, or in person. Have a merry Christmas and a happy New Year.

Food Bank






