### **OUR MONTH OF EXTENDED REST**

<sup>28</sup> "Come to me, all you who are weary and are carrying heavy burdens, and I will give you rest. - Matthew 11:28

Normally, when I write an article for the RoadRunner, my focal point is one of the major worship Sundays which corresponds with the current month on the Christian calendar. For example, in

November, I created an article with an emphasis on the Thanksgiving holiday. In December, I wrote an article about the Christmas celebration. In January, the focal point was the Magi coming to see the Christ-child. Epiphany Sunday occurs the first week in January of the new year. So, you see where I am going with this, right? Which now brings us to February. February is often remembered for Ash Wednesday, which occurs at the beginning of Lent. Normally, Ash Wednesday occurs early to mid-February, every year. So, can I write about Ash Wednesday in this February publication? Nope! Not this year! In 2025, Ash Wednesday occurs on Wednesday, March 5th. Well, my saving grace is that Transfiguration Sunday, the Sunday which occurs before Ash Wednesday will be in February, right? Nope! Not this year! In 2025, Transfiguration Sunday occurs on Sunday, March 2nd. So, what worship celebration can I write about for February 2025? There seem to be no significant worship celebrations in February 2025.

Perhaps one of the great things about February 2025, is that we have a month of extended rest. When Christmas is over, I believe both clergy and laity are exhausted. The great thing is that we have several weeks of down-time before the church is celebrating Ash Wednesday and the cycle of Lent and Easter begins revving up. At the onset of January, we normally receive between 5-6 weeks of rest before Ash Wednesday begins, and we are juxtaposed back into the Lent and Easter cycle. This year, we receive additional rest because Ash Wednesday does not begin until early March.

Jesus recognizes the need for rest. He often went away to pray by himself, away from the disciples and the busy world around him. He recognizes the need to rest in Matthew 11:28 where he offers an invitation to anyone who is weary and carrying burdens to come to him. Rest does not mean ease, rest is a break from the burdens which we have encountered that are not Christ-centered. The burdens of the world will often leave us emotionally exhausted. The only way to counter-act this exhaustion is by seeking Christ in our lives and lifestyles.

In the end, I have no words of wisdom for February. There are no Christian special celebrations which I can discuss, present or explain. There are no wonderful words of inspiration that I can offer. The Christian calendar is not exciting this month. All we can do is continue to rest from the Christmas holidays and wait for Ash Wednesday in early March. Additional rest, what burdens we must bear!







### FAT TUESDAY SPAGHETTI DINNER



## **CONGREGATIONAL CARE**

What does February mean to you and for you? I would be willing to guess that one of the first things mentioned is Valentine's Day, February 14th. This is a day we celebrate Love, whether it's the love of a spouse, mother, father, or child. It's a day we remember how we love or are loved and celebrate our relationships. Love is a word that has been sung about by too many to count artists. One that stands out to me is Nat King Cole's song: L-O-V-E. I grew up listening to Nat King Cole and watching his TV show on our small black-and-white screen TV. My mother and father watched it weekly, and I learned a lot.

Most of all, I knew the love my mother and father had was true love despite the occasional arguments and trials they experienced. When my sister was born in 1955 (I was seven years old at the time), I learned that she was born with birth defects of spina bifida and water on her brain. Despite her birth defects, she was truly beautiful. It was a very traumatic time, and yet the love and care my parents gave her was beautiful to see. My mother was an RN and knew nothing could truly be done then. For me, it was a time of cherishing those days with my sister, Barbara Ann. I would help my mother care for her, bathe her, dress her, and I would watch her as she slept. I was the big brother, and she was my little sister. It is perhaps from my experience with my parents and my sister before her death at 6 months old that I learned the most about love. Not only the love we shared but the Love of Christ and the Grace of God.




It's why today when I reflect on Jesus's commandment as recorded in Mark 12:28-31 "One of the scribes came near and heard them disputing with one another, and seeing that he answered them well he asked him, "Which commandment is the first of all?" Jesus answered, "The first is, 'Hear, O Israel: the Lord our God, the Lord is one; you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength.' The second is this, 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' There is no other commandment greater than these."



I'm so torn by so many people's anger, resentment, hatred, etc. I believe the real reason for so much of this is that we truly do not know how to love ourselves, and thus, how can we love our neighbor? Today, I see people trying to find that love through external means through "things" rather than a deep appreciation or love of themselves. The gifts and talents God has given each of us. It is why, in knowing oneself, I mean truly knowing oneself, we find the love of self. Are there things that cause us not to like or love about ourselves? Of course, there are, and yet, by knowing

ourselves, we can make changes in how we live, in how we relate to others, and in the ways we look at others as well as ourselves.

It took me a very long time to learn how to love myself, not selfishly but in a way that allowed me to grow into the person I am today. Take this month to reflect on love and what love means to you and for you. It may help others as they see how we love ourselves and love others.



## ARE YOU THE SUNRISE OR THE GARBAGE TRUCK?



I recently read this statement by Author David J. Pollay from his book The Law of the Garbage Truck: "Many people are like garbage trucks. They run around full garbage, of full

frustration, full of anger, and full of disappointment. As their garbage piles up, they look for a place to dump it. And if you let them, they'll dump it on you. So, when someone wants to dump on you, don't take it personally. Just smile, wave, wish them well, and move on. Believe me. You'll be happier."

That analogy seems to be spot on. Personally, I can say that at varying points in my life I've been in both the role of garbage truck, and the role of person dumped on. Not that I think I have intentionally been the dumper, the same as many of you, but sometimes life circumstances have a way of seeping out of us onto others. And I hate to admit it, but I know I have also responded poorly when I have been the one dumped upon. How then do we move toward more consistent, Christian responses to others, especially during their times of difficulty? It seems easier to display our own kind Christian character when someone is having a difficult time, yet they are still being nice, kind to others. If you're having a difficult time feeling like you're But what about when their difficulties ooze out in a making a positive difference, feeling like a sunrise, much more negative way?

I recently read this quote made by the late President Jimmy Carter, 1924-2024: "I have one life and one chance to make it count for something. My faith demands that I do whatever I can, wherever I am, whenever I can, for as long as I can with whatever I have to try to make a difference." Interestingly enough, this is a paraphrase of a John Wesley quote from the 1700s! That's a powerful declaration, one that's difficult for any of we mere humans to live by every minute of every day. But what a goal! So how do we get there?

A favorite Christmas movie of mine is called "The Christmas Train." In it a character says, "my wife used to say there's not a problem in this world a sunrise or Christmas can't fix." That statement always reminds me

of what Jesus tells us in Matthew 5:14-16 [NLT]:

<sup>14</sup> "You are the light of the world—like a city on a hilltop that cannot be hidden. 15 No one lights a lamp and then puts it under a basket. Instead, a lamp is placed on a stand, where it gives light to everyone in the house. 16 In the same way, let your good deeds shine out for all to see, so that everyone will praise your heavenly Father.

It feels to me as if Jesus is telling me in that scripture to strive toward being the sunrise in the lives of others, rather than the garbage truck.



In this month of

February, which inspires love toward others in many of us, let's make a difference! Remember when someone is negative or nasty and "dumps" on you, that they have their own personal journey, and we don't know how they got to this point. Instead of allowing ourselves to snap back with an in-kind remark or negative attitude, let's remember the power of being the light of Jesus Christ. Smile, wave, pray for them, wish them well. Be that sunrise for them that they may not have seen in a

# STITCHES UNLIMITED QUILTERS



In the last month or so, our group of quilters donated 40 quilts: 20 to Summit at Sunland Springs, 10 to Better Senior Care, and 10 to Winged Hope Foundation.



Reflecting on these quilts reminds me of an article by Jennifer Mahnke titled, "Quilting the Pieces of Our Lives," and thought you might like to read an excerpt. "Quilting reminds me so much of our lives with God. When I make a quilt, I start with little pieces of fabric of different colors and patterns, and sometimes different shapes. Like our lives, made up of many and varied

experiences, some deeply broken and dark and others bright and beautiful. All the pieces of a quilt come together to create a whole—a vision held in the mind of the quilter. Just like the quilter, God has a vision for our lives. The complete picture in his mind's eye. He is able to take the pieces of our lives and sew them together perfectly—all the dark pieces that highlight the lighter ones, all the colors put together in just the right way. So I learn from the Lord as I sew and participate in his creative process."

"I Am A Girl From Africa" by Elizabeth Nyamayaro

When Elizabeth Nyamayaro was eight years old, during a terrible drought in her village in Zimbabwe, her life was saved by a United Nations aid worker. This transformative moment-when "the girl in the blue uniform" found Elizabeth in her grandmother's field and gave her a bowl of porridge-inspired her life's purpose: to work her way to the United Nations and dedicate herself to giving back to her community, her continent, and the world. This is Elizabeth's story. Against tremendous odds, she became a humanitarian, advancing social justice and creating change from the Republic of the Congo to New York City. As a senior advisor to the United Nations, she launched HeForShe, one of the world's largest global solidarity movements for gender equality. Uplifted by her community, grounded in principals of respect, interdependence and care imparted by her beloved grandmother, Elizabeth and her journey show just how much we all need each other-and how a single act of kindness can profoundly change a life.


